ORDINANCE 118029

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation, accepting a \$234,944 grant from the State of Washington Employment Security's Washington Service Corps (WSC), authorizing execution of a subsequent service agreement with WSC for financial assistance to support and develop a Youth Apprenticeship program at Seattle Housing Authority's Holly Park Garden Residence; increasing the expenditure allowances in the Department's 1996 Budget; and making a reimbursable appropriation from the Park Fund, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As requested by the Mayor and the Superintendent of the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation, the Superintendent is hereby authorized to execute, deliver and perform, for and on behalf of The City of Seattle, a service agreement with the Washington Service Corps (WSC) under which The City will carry out Youth Apprenticeship Programs at the Holly Park Garden Community and will receive funding from WSC. The Superintendent is authorized, for and on behalf of The City, to accept Two Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-Four Dollars (\$234,944) from WSC under such contract. The money, when received, shall be deposited in the Department's Park and Recreation Fund as reimbursement for the appropriation authorized in Section 2.

Section 2. Contingent upon the execution of the service agreement authorized in Section 1, and to provide for its implementation, the expenditure allowances for the Recreation programs, SFMS Codes K14, in the 1996 budget for the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation are increased for the following objects of expenditures and in the amounts stated:

South Division (K14):

Personal Services (72)	\$195,644
Supplies (73)	8,000
Other Charges (744)	<u>31,300</u>
Total:	\$234,944

For such purposes, the sum of Two Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Four Dollars (\$234,944), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Park Fund.

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Section 3. Any act pursuant to the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. The foregoing appropriations are made to meet actual and necessary expenditures of The City for which no appropriation has been made due to causes which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the adoption of the 1996 Budget; Now, Therefore, in accordance with RCW 35.32A.060, by reason of facts above stated, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code section 1.04.020.



**Subject:** An ordinance relating to the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation, accepting a \$234,944 grant from the State of Washington Employment Security's Washington Service Corps (WSC), authorizing execution of a subsequent service agreement with WSC for financial assistance to support and develop a Youth Apprenticeship program at Seattle Housing Authority's Holly Park Garden Residence; increasing the expenditure allowances in the Department's 1996 Budget; and making a reimbursable appropriation from the Park Fund, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

Dear Honorable Members:

We request adoption of the enclosed legislation authorizing the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation to accept and subsequently enter into a 1996 service agreement with the State of Washington's Washington Service Corps (WSC) for financial assistance to support and develop a youth apprenticeship program for resident youth of the Holly Park Garden Community. A brief discussion follows:

**Background:**

The Seattle Housing Authority (SHA), as part of its "HOPE VI" program, will be contracting with the WSC to provide introductory career path programs (construction and trade fields-related) for resident youth and young adults of Holly Park. Overall program objectives would include classroom education, case management, pre-apprenticeship work experience, and entry into union apprenticeship programs. Total SHA funding to WSC is \$319,388.

Due to our Department's past and current involvement in collaborative efforts with SHA in developing new initiatives at Holly Park, the WSC informed us in early November, 1995, that it would like to subcontract with us to provide a significant level of the program objectives. We have since received formal notification from

WSC that it will indeed subcontract with our Department and provide us with \$234,944 to develop meaningful youth pre-apprenticeship programs for Holly Park residents. We welcome this new collaborative venture and are confident that we can provide positive and meaningful programs for these youth and young adults.


**Current Status and Request:**

We have identified in our 1996 Department work-program six 9-month pre-apprenticeship work projects for youth participants. The projects include landscaping and minor construction at Rainier Beach Playfield, Van Asselt Play field, and Dead Horse Canyon and two projects at Holly Park. Further projects will be identified as needed. In addition to providing oversight and training to participant trainees, we will also provide transportation and meeting space at Jefferson Community Center. The kids will learn firsthand about industrial trade work, necessary construction-related skills, and the "tools of trade" from Department staff.

We are currently working with WSC in finalizing the service contract for this youth apprenticeship program and request your earliest approval of attached legislation. We plan to begin implementation of the first two projects in January, 1996. Additional information pursuant to the City's SOP 200-001 and a copy of the WSC's notification of intent to subcontract with us and its \$234,944 award are enclosed for your review.

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## Legislative Request Supporting Information

In conformance with the City of Seattle Standard Operating Procedure 200-001, the following information is submitted:

### Title of Project or Program:

An ordinance relating to the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation, accepting a \$234,944 grant from the State of Washington Employment Security's Washington Service Corps (WSC), authorizing execution of a subsequent service agreement with WSC for financial assistance to support and develop a Youth Apprenticeship program at Seattle Housing Authority's Holly Park Garden Residence; increasing the expenditure allowances in the Department's 1996 Budget; and making a reimbursable appropriation from the Park Fund, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

### Statement of Objective:

This is a request to authorize acceptance of the WSC grant and subsequent execution of a service agreement with the WSC for funding assistance to develop and implement the youth apprenticeship program at Holly Park Garden Community.

### Dollar Amount Requested:

A maximum of \$234,944 from the Park and Recreation Fund, to be fully reimbursed by the WSC via its service agreement with the Department.

### WSC Fund Source:

The Seattle Housing Authority (SHA) is the source of the WSC grant. There is no local match requirement.

### Personnel Requirements:

Six new intermittent installation maintenance workers will be hired and reimbursed by WSC funds. The total estimated cost is about \$189,714. Other Department charges such as time, leased vans, supplies, and facility space total \$45,230 to support the program are necessary and also reimbursed by WSC.

### Facilities and Equipment Requirements:

No new facilities required. Any new equipment or supplies will be reimbursed by the WSC.

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Evaluation Criteria:

Program evaluation will be completed by Department staff, with reports to the WSC and its staff.

Alternative Methods of Funding:

No other fund sources are currently available.
