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ORDINANCE 118033

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AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Parks and Recreation, authorizing a grant agreement with the State of Washington's Park and Recreation Commission for financial assistance to implement a boating safety awareness program on Green Lake and Lake Washington, increasing the expenditure allowance in the Department's 1996 budget, and making a reimbursable appropriation from the Park Fund, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

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Section 1. The Superintendent of the Parks and Recreation Department is hereby authorized to execute, for and on behalf of the City of Seattle, an agreement with the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission for financial assistance in the amount of Four Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$4,400.00) to implement a Parks Department boating program. When received, that money shall be deposited in the Park Fund.

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Section 2. Contingent on the execution of the grant agreement authorized in Section 1, and to pay for the implementation of the boating program as contemplated by that grant, the 1996 budget of the Department of Parks and Recreation is hereby increased in the Recreation Program Category (SFMS K17) by Four Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$4,400.00), by the appropriation of that amount from the Park Fund, to be reimbursed from the grant authorized in Section 1 hereof.

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Section 3. Any act consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. The forgoing appropriation is made is to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which insufficient appropriation has been made due to causes which could not

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reasonably have been foreseen at the time of adoption of the 1996 Budget, in accordance with RCW 35.32A.060.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

Dear Honorable Members:

We request adoption of the enclosed legislation authorizing us to enter into a grant agreement with the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission (WSPRC) for grant assistance to develop and implement a new 1996 boating safety program. The locations and components of our proposed program will be:

- **Green Lake:** The ever increasing combination of fishermen, sailboards, canoes, kayaks, racing shells, sailboats, paddleboats and open water swimming, etc., has resulted in several serious accidents and numerous potential ones. Signs will be posted at the most common launching points and include a visual map diagram of the lake showing traffic patterns. The information will include boating safety, water safety, environmental awareness, respect for others, and specific areas of concern (open water swimming, fishing, congestion).
- **Lake Washington:** The number of personal water craft (PWC) has more than doubled in one year. Hundreds of complaints from other lake users have been received, focusing on reckless operation, lack of respect for others, PWC being rented to untrained operators, and use of alcohol. Signs will be posted at three public boat ramps on Lake Washington and

will include graphics and wording to educate PWC operators on water safety awareness, legal responsibilities, boating sober, and responsible operation. We have experienced a dramatic increase in the number of PWC on Lake Washington, many of which are not trained, inexperienced, and are using alcohol.

During October, 1995, the Department contacted WSPRC about possible boating funds for our program. We are pleased to announce that WSPRC has formally offered us a grant in the amount of \$4,400 to support our program. The grant will pay for the purchase of materials and supplies to install 16 boating safety signs. Other local matching requirements are provided by our existing Department budget.

Your earliest approval of the enclosed ordinance will allow us to execute the agreement with WSPRC.

Additional information, pursuant to the City of Seattle's SOP 200-001, is also enclosed. The WSPRC notification of a grant offer is also enclosed. If you have any questions concerning this request, please call Charles Ng, Parks Grants Manager, at 684-8003.

Dear Mr. Ng:

On October 27, 1995 the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission approved funding for the 1996 Boating Safety Program and a notice of the Commission approval was sent to each applicant. The copy of the Agenda Item sent to you summarized the financial assistance awarded to each recipient. Your Boating Safety Program was approved. Please review the section which describes the Commission's approval of your program and compare that information with your application.

At this time, I am preparing a contract which initiates the funding period for 1996. I expect the contract to be ready in December of this year for distribution. The contract will contain a copy of the budget for your agency financial assistance and will specify program requirements. **Please be aware that State Parks cannot reimburse any costs which are incurred prior to the date of signature by the representative of State Parks.** As you proceed to spend your boating safety funds in 1996, all expenditures must be consistent with the budget found in the contract.

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Legislative Request Supporting Information

In conformance with the City of Seattle Standard Operating Procedure 200-001, the following information is submitted:

Title of Project or Program:

An ordinance relating to the Department of Parks and Recreation, authorizing a grant agreement with the State of Washington's Park and Recreation Commission for financial assistance to implement a boating safety awareness program on Green Lake and Lake Washington, increasing the expenditure allowance in the Department's 1996 budget, and making a reimbursable appropriation from the Park Fund, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

Statement of Objectives:

The Parks and Recreation Department requests authorization to accept a \$4,400 grant and to enter into an agreement with the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission to implement a boating safety awareness program at Green Lake and Lake Washington.

Fiscal Requirements:

The total cost to implement the boating safety program has been estimated at \$9,600, of which the WSPRC will contribute a maximum of \$4,400 in grant support. Our required local matching contribution of at least an equal amount will come from in-kind Department staff hours and other donation of services and volunteer contributions from advisory councils.

Personnel Requirements:

All staffing requirements will be provided through existing Parks Department budget.

Equipment Requirements:

The Parks and Recreation Department will use the grant funds to help purchase all necessary equipment and identify additional resources as required.

Length of Commitment:

The Boating Safety Program will begin on grant contract execution and will terminate on December 31, 1996.

Facilities Requirements:

No new facilities required.

The program will be evaluated by progress reports to State Parks and by Citywide Division program reviews.

There are no other funding sources available for this portion of the project.
