AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department, accepting renewal and extension of a franchise from the City of Shoreline to construct, operate and maintain an electrical system on the streets within the corporate limits of the City of Shoreline under the same terms and conditions as set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 (P.M. #956) until a new franchise agreement is negotiated and adopted between the City of Shoreline and the City of Seattle, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first.

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline incorporated under the laws of the State of Washington on August 31, 1995; and,

WHEREAS, City of Shoreline through Ordinance No. 45 granted a short-term franchise to City Light to continue to construct, operate and maintain its electrical system on the streets within the corporate limits of said City under the terms of the former franchise agreement with King County (King County Franchise No. 7225) until February 29, 1996; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle enacted Ordinance No. 117894 to accept the short-term franchise agreement to Seattle City Light under the same terms and conditions as set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 until February 29, 1996; and,

WHEREAS, the impending expiration of the short-term franchise agreement requires action by both parties to maintain continuity of service; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline adopted Ordinance No. 69 to renew and extend the franchise agreement between said City and Seattle City Light under the same terms and conditions as set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 until a new franchise agreement is negotiated and adopted, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle and the City of Shoreline have agreed to conduct discussions regarding a longer term

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline passed Ordinance No. 69, on January 22, 1996, renewing and extending the franchise agreement between the City and Seattle City Light under the same terms and conditions set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 until a new franchise agreement is negotiated and adopted, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle passed Ordinance No. 118054 on March 18, 1996, accepting the franchise offered by Shoreline City Ordinance No. 69; and

WHEREAS, the time period for acceptance of the terms of Shoreline City Ordinance No. 69, set out in Section 2 thereof, expired prior to the Seattle City Council's ability to consider the issue; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to make Shoreline City Ordinance No. 69 and Seattle City Ordinance No. 118054 effective; NOW, THEREFORE,

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Ordinance No. 69 is hereby amended to recognize the passage of Seattle City Ordinance No. 118054 and to make the franchise renewal and extension contained therein effective March 1, 1996.

Section 2. Directions to City Clerk. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this ordinance to Seattle City Light.

Section 3. Prior Acts. Any act pursuant to the authority of this ordinance and prior to its effective date is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after the date of publication. The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this ordinance in full.

## ORDINANCE NO. 69

### AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, EXTENDING THE FRANCHISES AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY OF SHORELINE AND SEATTLE CITY LIGHT

WHEREAS, Seattle City Light currently holds Franchise No. 7225 previously issued by King County, Washington to operate, maintain, repair and construct a service line and appurtenances in, over, along, and under County roads and rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, on August 31, 1995 the area covered by the Franchise was incorporated as part of the City of Shoreline ("City"); and

WHEREAS, Seattle City Light currently operates and maintains its electrical transmission system in the City of Shoreline pursuant to the County Franchise; and

WHEREAS, Seattle City Light's Franchise with the County is scheduled to expire before negotiations between the City of Shoreline and Seattle City Light concerning Seattle City Light's franchise relationship with Shoreline reasonably could be concluded; and

WHEREAS, Seattle City Light and the City wish to continue the franchise relationship on the same terms and conditions as provided in the Franchise until a new franchise is negotiated between them allowing Seattle City Light to make use of streets and rights-of-way for the purposes of construction, operation, maintenance and reconstruction of an electrical transmission system in the City; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to extend the current franchise agreement for an additional period of time,

WHEREAS, this ordinance has been passed by a majority of the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The Franchise agreement between King County and Seattle City Light is renewed and extended through and until negotiation and adoption by the City of Shoreline of a new franchise between the City of Shoreline and the District, or for two years from the date of this Extension Agreement, whichever first occurs.



The Franchisee shall have 30 days from receipt of the certified copy of this ordinance to accept in writing the terms of the franchise granted to the franchisee in this ordinance.

Request for Legislation Renewing and Extending a Franchise from the City of Shoreline to Operate and Maintain an Electrical System within the Corporate Limits of Said City

Enclosed for your consideration is an ordinance relating to the City Light Department, accepting renewal and extension of a franchise from the City of Shoreline to construct, operate and maintain an electrical system on the streets within the corporate limits of the City of Shoreline under the same terms and conditions as set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 (P.M. #956) until a new franchise agreement is negotiated and adopted between the City of Shoreline and the City of Seattle, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first. Also enclosed are a short issue paper and supporting documents related to this proposed extension.

The City of Shoreline, Washington was incorporated on August 31, 1995. Under State Law (RCW 35.02.160) the City of Shoreline granted Seattle City Light a short-term franchise to continue to construct, operate and maintain its electrical system on the streets within the corporate limits of Shoreline until February 29, 1996 under the same terms and conditions as King County Franchise No. 7225 (City of Shoreline Ordinance No. 43). The City of Seattle accepted this short-term franchise agreement through adoption of Council Ordinance No. 117894 on November 20, 1995.

Since the acceptance of the short-term franchise agreement by both parties, the City of Seattle and the City of Shoreline have been conducting discussions regarding the terms and conditions of a longer term franchise to be granted to City Light. However, given the wide array of issues, and Seattle's concerns about achieving consistency in franchise


agreements across utilities and jurisdictions, terms for a long-term franchise agreement have not yet been reached.

On January 22, 1996, the City of Shoreline passed Ordinance No. 69 to renew and extend the franchise agreement between Seattle City Light and the City of Shoreline under the prior terms of the franchise with King County until negotiation and adoption by the City of Shoreline of a new franchise agreement between the City of Shoreline and City Light, or for two years from the date of the extension (until January 30, 1998), whichever comes first. The Shoreline ordinance requires that City Light accept the terms of the extension within 30 days of receipt of the ordinance; however, Shoreline has indicated they would amend their ordinance to adapt to our time frame.

Since City Light finds the terms of the current franchise agreement acceptable and is continuing to work with the City of Shoreline on a mutually agreeable long-term franchise agreement, it is our recommendation that legislation be passed renewing and extending the franchise granted to Seattle City Light by City of Shoreline Ordinance No. 69 under the same terms and conditions as King County Franchise No. 7225 until a new agreement is reached or January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first.

**RENEWAL AND EXTENSION OF  
THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
SEATTLE CITY LIGHT AND THE CITY OF SHORELINE**

January 16, 1996

**Issue**

In 1995, the incorporation of the City of Shoreline necessitated development of a new franchise agreement between the City of Shoreline and Seattle City Light. In accordance with State law, a short-term agreement was reached in November 1995 with an expiration date of February 29, 1996. While both parties have worked during this period to discuss the need for a mutually satisfactory long-term franchise agreement, such an agreement has not yet been reached. While negotiations proceed, it is the desire of both parties to renew and extend the terms of the current franchise agreement until a long-term franchise agreement is negotiated and adopted, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first.

**Background**

The current franchise agreement between the City of Shoreline and Seattle City Light expires on February 29, 1996. The City of Shoreline adopted Ordinance No. 69 on January 22, 1996 extending the agreement under the same terms until a long-term agreement is negotiated and adopted, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first. The Shoreline ordinance took effect on January 30, 1996. It allows the franchisee (City Light) 30 days from receipt of the certified copy of the ordinance to accept the terms in writing. Given the City review process and the need for an ordinance to enter into such agreement, the 30 day deadline may not be met. Kristoff Bauer, Assistant to the Shoreline City Manager, has indicated that "we understand that, due to scheduling constraints, that [franchise] issue may not reach your Council within the 30 day time frame set by our Ordinance No. 69. We want to assure you that should your Council decide to accept the renewal in line with the terms of Ordinance No. 69, we are willing to amend our ordinance in order to make that happen."

As a new municipality, the City of Shoreline is working to establish minimum procedures for submission and review of applications for franchises and franchise renewals. For many months City Light has been working with Shoreline to respond to questions and concerns regarding City Light services to their community. Concurrently, the City of Seattle has been working to establish consistency across franchise agreements and utilities. Judith Noble of OMP has been taking the lead in developing a new "boilerplate" agreement that can be used across City departments. Discussions between the parties have been constructive and open.

**Decision**

The Council is asked to accept the renewal and extension of City Light's franchise agreement with the City of Shoreline under the terms and conditions described in the draft ordinance. Both parties will continue to negotiate expeditiously to reach a mutually satisfactory long-term agreement prior to the January 30, 1998 expiration date.







ORDINANCE 118054

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department, accepting renewal and extension of a franchise from the City of Shoreline to construct, operate and maintain an electrical system on the streets within the corporate limits of the City of Shoreline under the same terms and conditions as set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 (P. M. #958) until a new franchise agreement is negotiated and adopted between the City of Shoreline and the City of Seattle, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first.

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline incorporated under the laws of the State of Washington on August 31, 1995; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline through Ordinance No. 45 granted a short-term franchise to City Light to construct, operate and maintain its electrical system on the streets within the corporate limits of said City under the terms of the former franchise agreement with King County (King County Franchise No. 7225) until February 29, 1996; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle enacted Ordinance No. 117894 to accept the short-term franchise agreement to Seattle City Light under the same terms and conditions as set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 until February 29, 1996; and,

WHEREAS, the impending expiration of the short-term franchise agreement requires action by both parties to maintain continuity of service; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline adopted Ordinance No. 69 to renew and extend the franchise agreement between said City and Seattle City Light under the same terms and conditions as set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 until a new franchise agreement is negotiated and adopted, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle and the City of Shoreline have agreed to conduct discussions regarding a longer term franchise during the period of the franchise granted under City of Shoreline Ordinance No. 69; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City of Seattle accept the franchise granted to Seattle City Light by City of Shoreline under Ordinance No. 69 to construct, operate and maintain an electrical system on the streets within the corporate limits of the City of Shoreline under the terms and conditions set forth in King County Franchise No. 7225 until a new franchise agreement is negotiated and adopted by the City of Shoreline and the City of Seattle, or until January 30, 1998, whichever occurs first. This renewal and extension shall be effective as of March 1, 1996.

Section 2. Any act pursuant to the authority of this ordinance and prior to its effective date is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
