ORDINANCE **118774**

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Building and Construction Codes, Subtitle VI Fire Code, amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 22.602.040 to change the fee for permits related to marine terminal activities, create a separate code for wrecking yard permits, change application of a residential combustible liquid tank decommissioning permit, revise permit code numbers, and make clerical corrections.

WHEREAS as a result of a cooperative effort between the City and the regulated community, the Seattle Fire Department has initiated changes to the marine terminal regulation program to increase the level of fire and life safety at marine terminals; and

WHEREAS in order to increase the marine terminal inspection capacities of the Fire Marshal's Office, the Seattle Fire Department has recommended that regulatory fees be adjusted to allow staff and resources to be allocated for such inspections and services; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 22.602.040 and its Schedules (Ordinance 110893 § 2 (part), as last amended by Ordinance 118391 § 2), are further amended as follows:

22.602.040 Fees.

A. The fees for the following permits and inspections are established in Schedule A. See Schedule A in Table 22.602.040A.

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C. Hazardous Material Related Permits. Fees for hazardous material related permits are established in Schedule C (See Table 22.602.040C). In some cases these fees are based on the quantity of hazardous material stored and/or handled at the site and the relative risk posed by each material.

1. Definitions:

a. "**Quantity Range Number**" as established in the Quantity Range Table below, is a number between 1 and 2 which is assigned to a hazard category based upon the amount of hazardous material located at the site.

b. "Assigned Risk Factor" as established below, is a number assigned to each hazard class and category of hazardous material indicating the relative hazard posed by materials in that hazard category.

c. **"Fixed permit cost"** Ninety-eight Dollars (\$98.00) is the minimum cost for the Seattle Fire

Department to issue a hazardous material permit.

d. **"Base permit fee"** is determined by multiplying the sum of the products of the quantity range number and assigned risk factor for each hazard class by the fixed permit cost divided by 1.1 and is represented by the following equation:

1 **Base permit fee = $[\Sigma(Q)(R)][F/1.1]$**

2 **Where: Q = The quantity range number.**

3 **R = The assigned risk factor.**

4 **F = The fixed permit cost (\$98.00).**

5 Example:

6 XYZ Company stores five hundred (500) gallons of gasoline and two hundred (200) pounds of nitric
7 acid. Gasoline is classified as a Class I-B flammable liquid which has an assigned risk factor of 1.4.

8 Nitric acid is classified as a corrosive liquid and a Class 1 oxidizer, both of which have an assigned risk
9 factor of 1.1.

10 Base permit fee = $[(1.25)(1.4)_{\text{flammable}} + (1)(1.1)_{\text{Class 1 oxidizer}}][\$98./1.1]$

11 Base permit fee = \$253.91

12 When a material has multiple hazards, only the hazard presented by the material that has been assigned
13 the highest risk factor shall be considered. The base permit fee incorporates the cost of the initial site
14 inspection plus one (1) reinspection of the facility. Any subsequent inspections will result in an
15 additional fee based on the time charge which shall be calculated on actual costs for labor and other
16 services.

17 The annual permit renewal fee will be one-half (1/2) of the original base permit fee, if the facility is found
18 to be in compliance with the original permit conditions.

19 Effective January 1, 1993, those facilities which have existing hazardous materials-related permits
20 authorized under Ordinance 116258 shall have their permits renewed at the rate of Seventy-Five Dollars
21 (\$75.00) until the Fire Department Article 80 program inspection and inventory analysis for the facility
22 has been performed.

1 In special circumstances, hazardous material permit fees may be adjusted, modified or combined.

2 Authority to adjust, modify or combine such permit fees is limited to the Fire Chief, the Fire Marshal

3 and the Assistant Fire Marshal.

D. All permits listed under subsection A of this section have a base fee which incorporates the cost of an initial site inspection and one (1) site reinspection to determine compliance with the Seattle Fire Code. Any subsequent inspections will result in a fee based on a time charge which shall be calculated on actual costs for labor and other services. Such fees shall include overtime costs only when the work performed outside normal business hours (eight a.m. (8:00((+)) a.m.) to four-thirty p.m. (4:30((+)) p.m.) Monday through Friday) is required by the Seattle Fire Code or is performed at the request of the owner or responsible person or permit holder.

E. Temporary permits listed under Schedule A will not be renewed on an annual basis.

1 F. Those permit applications which are required to be filed within time limitations specified under the
2 Seattle Fire Code or by order of the Fire Chief, shall be subject to a late fee, if not filed within the
3 prescribed time period. The late fee shall be calculated at 1.75 times the original permit fee.

4 For permits listed under Schedules A and C as renewable, renewal payments received more than
5 thirty (30) days, but less than ninety-one (91) days, past the permit expiration date shall be subject
6 to a late fee. The late fee shall be calculated at 1.75 times the listed renewal fee. Permit renewal
7 payments received more than ninety (90) days past the expiration date will not be processed as a
8 renewal and will be subject to original permit fees and the new permit application process.

9 G. Unless specifically stated on the permit, no temporary use permit shall be valid for a term exceeding
10 twelve (12) months.







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SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION FOR REVISED MARINE TERMINAL AND CONTAINER FREIGHT STATION PERMIT FEES

For Container Freight Station permits (Code 8004):

These annual permits are intended to be issued to locations where only a container freight station is used to temporarily locate hazardous materials.

Tasks associated with each permit:

1. Daily or regular site inspection to verify (Time est. = 0.5-1.0 hour/day per site visited)
 - quantity limits
 - separation of incompatibles
 - appropriate use of designated areas
 2. Processing daily requests for call for special permit commodities and explosive notifications (Time est. = 3 hours/wk for all sites)
 3. Processing special requests, conducting special inspections and troubleshooting (Time est. = 2 hours/wk for all)

For Marine Terminal permits (Code 8003):

These annual permits are intended to be issued and maintained at marine terminals where hazardous materials are handled. If a container freight station is located on the terminal, it is included as a part of the terminal permit and does not require a separate permit.

Tasks associated with each permit:

1. Daily or regular site inspection to verify (Time est. = 0.5-2.0 hours/day per site visited)
 - quantity limits
 - separation of incompatibles
 - appropriate use of designated areas
2. Processing daily requests for call for special permit commodities and explosive notifications (Time est. = 8-10 hours/wk for all terminals)
3. Processing special requests, conducting special inspections and troubleshooting (Time est. = 4-6 hr./wk for all terminals)

Enclosed is a draft of an ordinance which changes the fee on permits related to marine terminal operations, reauthorizes a unique permit for automobile wrecking yards, and provides minor corrections to several code numbers.

The development of the proposed marine terminal fees resulted from a series of meetings held over a two year time period by a work group comprised of representatives from various segments of the shipping industry and the Fire Department. The focus of the meetings was to revise the Administrative Rules relating to hazardous materials handled at marine terminals by updating the regulated hazard classes and potentially increasing the amount of hazardous materials permitted at each site. The Administrative Rules were ultimately revised to allow for a significant increase in the amount of hazardous materials permitted at any given terminal, and a new Rule was formally approved by the Fire Code Advisory Board on June 3, 1997.

The Fire Department was, and is, strongly in support of the revised Rule provided permit fees for marine terminals are appropriately modified to fund a full-time Fire Lieutenant. That Fire Lieutenant will be dedicated to ensuring compliance with the revised Rule and provide the industry with the level of service necessary to safely implement the requirements. At the conclusion of the meetings, the work group members were unanimously in support of revising the marine terminal permit fees appropriately so that the Fire Department could implement the revised Rule. The marine terminal fees proposed here will fully fund the Lieutenant's position and all related annual costs.

I have met personally with twelve representatives of the affected industry group at an informational meeting to explain the proposed fee methodology. I assured them that we are committed to providing the customer service necessary to make the revised marine terminal permit program work to the benefit of industry while maintaining public safety.

The legislation also creates a unique permit for automobile wrecking yards when such permits are required by the Code. Having a unique permit for this activity allows for improved data tracking of wrecking yards in the City and allows for the attachment of permit conditions unique to that activity.


Corrections to permit code numbers 802T and 079 are proposed to eliminate duplicative permit codes and provide for better tracking of information.

Descriptions of the permitted class of fireworks for permit codes 781 and 781A are proposed to be modified to correlate with fireworks classifications set forth by the Department of Transportation.

Permit code 6103 relating to the decommissioning of residential heating oil tanks, has been revised to include three- and four-unit dwellings to achieve consistency with the State of Washington's interpretation of "residential". Previously, this permit only applied to one- and two-unit dwellings.

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
