ORDINANCE 118786

AN ORDINANCE relating to exemptions from the Civil Service, amending S.M.C. 4.13.010 to exempt various positions of employment from the Civil Service System by a two-thirds vote of the City Council.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Effective January 1, 1998, S.M.C. 4.13.010 is amended as follows:

In addition to those positions exempted by statute, City Charter, or other ordinance provision (elected officers, officers appointed pursuant to the City Charter, assistant City attorneys, heads of employing units, members of boards and commissions established by the City Charter, members of boards and commissions established by ordinance, positions excluded from the Public Safety Civil Service System pursuant to S.M.C. Section 4.08.060, system-wide exemptions provided for in S.M.C. Section 4.13.020, and library employees), the positions of City employment listed in the subsections of this section requiring a particularly high degree of professional responsiveness and individual accountability, or requiring a confidential or fiduciary relationship with the appointing authority, or being judicial positions requiring insulation as a third branch of government, are hereby declared to be exempt from the Seattle Municipal Code Chapters 4.04, 4.08, and the rules of the City Personnel and the Public Safety Civil Service Commission regarding examination, selection, discipline, termination, and appeals.

ORDINANCE 118785

AN ORDINANCE fixing the rates and/or amounts of taxes to be levied, and levying the same upon all taxable property, both real and personal, in the City of Seattle, to finance the departments and activities of City government and to provide for the General Obligation Bond Interest and Redemption requirements for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1998.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. GENERAL MUNICIPAL AND FIREFIGHTERS' PENSION.

A. (3) There is hereby levied a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal within the City of Seattle and subject to taxation under the laws of the State of Washington, in the amount (subject to the limits stated in subsection 1.B) of One Hundred Sixty Million, Six Hundred Eighty-six Thousand, Three Hundred Twenty-six Dollars (\$160,686,326), which has been calculated at the rate of Three Dollars and Sixty Cents (\$3.60) per thousand dollars of the estimated assessed value of such property. This tax is levied for the purpose of raising revenue to finance the various departments and activities of the municipal government of the City of Seattle for the fiscal (calendar) year 1998. This levy has been calculated at the following dollar rates per thousand dollars of assessed value: Three Dollars and Fifteen Cents (\$3.15) for general municipal purposes as allowed by RCW 84.52.043; Twenty-two and One-half Cents (\$0.225) for the Firemen's Pension Fund as allowed by RCW 41.16.060; and Twenty-two and One-half Cents (\$0.225) for general municipal purposes as allowed by RCW 41.16.060. This levy includes an amount of Eight Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$828,000) for low-income housing that is not restricted to serving very low-income households, in accordance with Ordinance 117711, an amount of Six Million, Two Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$6,245,000) for renovation, repair and development at the Seattle Center and other community facilities, and an amount of One Million, One Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$1,128,000) for the Department of Community Development.

City of Seattle

ORDINANCE 118785

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the levy of regular property taxes by the City of Seattle for collection in 1998, representing an increase over regular property taxes levied for collection in 1997.

WHEREAS Chapter 3, Laws of 1997, as approved November 4, 1997, by the voters of the State of Washington in "Referendum 47," requires a separate ordinance in order for the City of Seattle to make its regular property tax levy in the amount reflected in Council Bill 111864; and

WHEREAS pursuant to RCW 84.55.120 the City Council held hearings on October 6 and November 9, 1997, after proper notice was given to consider the City of Seattle's 1998 budget and the regular property tax levy to support it; and

WHEREAS notice of the City Council's consideration of this ordinance has been provided in the usual manner for all proposed City ordinances; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Regular property taxes for collection in 1998 are authorized in the amount reflected in Council Bill 111864. Not including increases resulting from the addition of new construction and improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property, the regular property tax levy for 1998 (excluding the "refund fund levy" in both instances) of Ten Million Seven Hundred Eighty-Five Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-Eight Dollars (\$10,785,968) which is a seven and Eighty-One One Hundredths percent (7.81%) increase. This regular property tax levy for collection in 1998 includes regular property tax levy lifts previously approved by the voters of the City.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, but if not returned by the Mayor after ten (10) days after its passage and approval by the Mayor, it shall be in force and effect on the day after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
