ORDINANCE 119256

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Building and Construction Codes, Subtitle VI Fire Code, amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 22.602.040 and Section 22.602.050 to change the fee for permits related to special events/public assembly activities, to add new hazardous materials permits for Battery Systems and Temporary Torchdown Operations, to add a new code for hazardous materials code alternate/variance requests, change the fee for certain hazardous material permit renewals, revise permit code numbers, and make clerical corrections.

WHEREAS in order to increase the hazardous materials/Article 80 inspection capacities of the Fire Marshal's Office, the Seattle Fire Department has recommended that regulatory fees be adjusted to allow staff and resources to be allocated for such inspections and services;

WHEREAS in order to increase the special events/public assembly inspection capacities of the Fire Marshal's Office, the Seattle Fire Department has recommended that regulatory fees be adjusted to allow staff and resources to be allocated for such inspections and services; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 22.602.040 and its Schedules (Ordinance 110893 § 2 (part), as last amended by Ordinance 118774 § 1), are further amended as follows:

 7 in Schedule C (*See Table 22.602.040 C*). In some cases these fees are based on the quantity of
 8 hazardous material stored and/or handled at the site and the relative risk posed by each material.

9 **1. Definitions:**

10 a. "Quantity Range Number" as established in the Quantity Range Table below, is
 11 a number between 1 and 2 which is assigned to a hazard category based upon the
 12 amount of hazardous material located at the site.

c. **"Fixed permit cost"** Ninety-eight Dollars (\$98.00) is the minimum cost for the Seattle Fire Department to issue a hazardous material permit.

d. **"Base permit fee"** is determined by multiplying the sum of the products of the quantity range number and assigned risk factor for each hazard class by the fixed permit cost divided by 1.1 and is represented by the following equation:

$$\text{Base permit fee} = [(Q)(R)] [F / 1.1]$$

Where: Q = The quantity range number.
 R = The assigned risk factor.
 F = The fixed permit cost (\$98.00).

Example:

1 XYZ Company stores five hundred (500) gallons of gasoline and two hundred
2 (200) pounds of nitric acid. Gasoline is classified as a Class I-B flammable
3 liquid which has an assigned risk factor of 1.4. Nitric acid is classified as a
4 corrosive liquid and a Class 1 oxidizer, both of which have an assigned risk
5 factor of 1.1.

$$6 \text{ Base permit fee} = [(1.25)(1.4)_{\text{flammable}} + (1)(1.1)_{\text{Class 1 oxidizer}}][\$98./1.1]$$

$$7 \text{ Base permit fee} = \$253.91$$

8 When a material has multiple hazards, only the hazard presented by the
9 material that has been assigned the highest risk factor shall be considered.

10 ~~((The base permit fee incorporates the cost of the initial site inspection plus one (1) re-inspection of the
11 facility. Any subsequent inspections will result in an additional fee based on the time charge which shall
12 be calculated on actual costs for labor and other services.))~~

13 ~~((The annual permit renewal fee will be one half (1/2) of the original base permit fee, if the facility is
14 found to be in compliance with the original permit conditions.))~~

15 ~~((Effective January 1, 1993, those facilities which have existing hazardous materials related permits

All permits listed under subsection A and C of this section have a base fee which incorporates the cost of an initial site inspection and one (1) site reinspection to determine compliance with the Seattle Fire Code. Any subsequent inspections will result in a fee based on a time charge which shall be calculated on actual costs for labor and other services. Such fees shall include overtime costs only when the work performed outside normal business hours (eight a.m. (8:00 a.m.) to four-thirty p.m. (4:30 p.m.) Monday through Friday) is required by the Seattle Fire Code or is performed at the request of the owner or responsible person or permit holder.

1 E. Temporary permits listed under Schedule A and C will not be renewed on an annual basis.

2 F. Those permit applications which are required to be filed within time limitations specified under
3 the Seattle Fire Code or by order of the Fire Chief, shall be subject to a late fee, if not filed
4 within the prescribed time period. The late fee shall be calculated at 1.75 times the original







LEGISLATIVE REQUEST--SUPPORTING INFORMATION

The following information is submitted in conformance with City of Seattle Operating Procedure 100-014 and 200-001.

Title and Project /Program

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Building and Construction Code, amending Ordinance 118019, Seattle Municipal Code Section 22.600.030 and 22.602.040 to change the fee on certain permits.

Statement of Objectives

1. Continue to follow the work plan established under City Council resolution 29248 to improve internal procedures and customer service for permit applicant.
2. Increase annual renewal fees for all hazardous materials permits issued prior to the implementation of the Article 80 program from seventy five dollars (\$75.00) to ninety eight dollars \$98.00). While the operating expenses of the Hazardous Materials Section have continued to increase steadily, these fees have not been increased since 1992.
3. Add new hazardous materials permit codes for Battery Systems (6401) and Touch-down Operations-Temporary (7901T) to Fee Schedule C to address the increase in the number of these operations encountered by the Fire Prevention Division.
4. Add permit code for Code Alternate-Hazardous Materials (105H) to Fee Schedule C. This is proposed to facilitate revenue tracking for cost recovery purposes.
5. Eliminate old three digit permit codes which relate to old program permits from Fee Schedules. These old codes are only used internally by the Fire Prevention Division as a reference for tracking older permits and are no longer used in the issuance of new permits.
6. Consolidate permit code #230/104-Request for Code Alternate/Variance (minor) and #231/105-Request for Code Alternate/Variance (major) into one #231/105-Request for Code Alternate/Variance.
7. Increase original fees for certain annual and temporary public assembly related permits to more accurately reflect the amount of time necessary to process the permit application and determine permit conditions which provide for the safety and welfare of the patrons of those events.

8. Move fireworks display related permits from Schedule C to Schedule A to consolidate permits issued by Special Events Section into same Schedule to facilitate costs and revenue tracking.
9. Eliminate confusing language regarding time charges for Fire Department permits which are actually fees for subsequent inspections. An additional paragraph is proposed for SMC 22.602.050, Fees.

Historical Overview

The permit fee ordinance has not seen a significant revision since the passage of ordinance #118391 which went into effect in November of 1996, in which the "Fee Worksheet" was introduced. A subsequent Ordinance, #118774 in 1997, introduced the "new marine terminal" program and changes to schedule B for certification exams.

Fiscal Overview

1. It is anticipated that approximately 4,000 "Old Program" hazardous materials certificate holders will renew their certificates in 1999 and 2000. With the proposed twenty three dollar increase, an additional \$92,200 in revenue is anticipated per year.
2. The proposed increase in the annual and temporary public assembly/special events permit fees is projected to produce an increase in revenue of approximately \$86,000 per year in 1999 and 2000.

3. The proposed fees for public assembly permits increase on a sliding scale with the size of the venue/event. The fees for the smaller venues/events remain unchanged. The rationale behind this sliding scale is that the larger venues/events are more complex and require significantly more time than the smaller ones. Examples of this type of venue include: Exhibition Hall at Seattle Center, Mercer Arena, Washington State Convention and Trade Center, the Seattle Center grounds, Key Arena and the Kingdome.

The annual Public Assembly permit contains conditions established to address the "normal" activities and events held at the particular venue. The special events section must work with each venue to define the specific conditions for the different types of events that are held regularly at the site. Primary areas of concern are: requests for variations in seating arrangements, entry and exiting configurations, location of vendor booths and sponsor signs, security staffing, emergency medical staffing and maintenance of occupancy load.

Temporary public assembly/special events permits are issued for events and activities which fall outside of normal scope. Temporary permits for larger public assembly occupancies require much closer scrutiny due to the types of events held in them. These events include, but are not limited to rock concerts, fairs and festivals, trade shows, fireworks displays, exhibitions, and rallies. The temporary public assembly permits/special events permits, particularly those involving pyrotechnics, have proved to be extremely time consuming and labor intensive. They involve a significant amount of time spent in pre-planning meetings and consulting with the facilities.

The temporary/transient nature of these events present a unique set of concerns which include: alterations to exiting configurations due to booths/displays, vendor carts and media needs; line control for entering; coordination of multiple agencies; coordination of simultaneous events in a single venue; control of fire hazards due to accumulations of combustibles, i.e. packing and crating materials; and additional security and medical personnel needs. In addition, there may also be other activities such as use of fireworks, flammable liquids, LPG or open flames that are part of the event which require separate permits.

Personnel Requirements

1. If the changes in the fee schedule we have recommended are adopted, we will add Lieutenant-Prevention Inspector (one FTE) to the special events section to address the increasing workload. The department will review scheduling options that will diminish high overtime costs.
2. The addition of one Administrative Specialist I (one FTE) is proposed for the hazardous materials Section.

d. **"Base permit fee"** is determined by multiplying the sum of the products of the quantity range number and assigned risk factor for each hazard class by the fixed permit cost divided by 1.1 and is represented by the following equation:

All permits listed under subsection A and C of this section have a base fee which incorporates the cost of an initial site inspection and one (1) site reinspection to determine compliance with the Seattle Fire Code. Any subsequent inspections will result in a fee based on a time charge which shall be calculated on actual costs for labor and other services. Such fees shall include overtime costs only when the work performed outside normal business hours (eight a.m. (8:00 a.m.) to four-thirty p.m. (4:30 p.m.) Monday through Friday) is required by the Seattle Fire Code or is performed at the request of the owner or responsible person or permit holder.

2 E. Temporary permits listed under Schedule A and C will not be renewed on an annual basis.

3 F. Those permit applications which are required to be filed within time limitations specified under
4 the Seattle Fire Code or by order of the Fire Chief, shall be subject to a late fee, if not filed

13 circumstances beyond the responsible party's control exist such as conflicting enforcement by other
14 jurisdictions, conditions caused by third parties or where alternate materials, methods or designs are
15 under review to meet the intent of the Seattle Fire Code.

16 F. All permits listed under SMC 22.602.040, Fees have a base fee which incorporates the cost of an
17 initial site inspection and one (1) site re-inspection to determine compliance with the Seattle Fire
18 Code. Any subsequent inspections will result in a fee based on a time charge which shall be
19 calculated on actual costs for labor and other services. Such fees shall include overtime costs only
20 when the work performed outside normal business hours (eight a.m. (8:00 a.m.) to four-thirty p.m.
21 (4:30 p.m.) Monday through Friday) is required by the Seattle Fire Code or is performed at the
22 request of the owner or responsible person or permit holder.

1 **Section 3.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by
2 the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall
3 take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
