BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. Section 4.36.385 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

**4.36.385 Compliance with Internal Revenue Code.**


This Chapter shall be administered in a manner to comply with the applicable requirements of 26 U.S.C. Section 401(a) (~~((8), (9), (16), (17), (25), and (31),))~~) and the Board (~~((shall))~~) is authorized to promulgate rules ((designed to assure said)) as it deems necessary to effectuate such compliance.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.



Dear Councilwoman Choe,

The Board of Administration of the Seattle City Employees' Retirement System (SCERS) respectfully requests the passage of an ordinance to clarify language to maintain compliance with the Internal Revenue Service Code. This ordinance will have no cost impact on the City of Seattle or its employees. The provisions of the ordinance are as follows:

Section 4.36.385 will be modified to specify that the "applicable" requirements of the IRS code will be followed and deletes references that are found to no longer be relevant.

This section will also be modified to read that the Board is authorized to promulgate rules as it deems necessary to effectuate such compliance, instead of reading that the Board shall promulgate rules designed to assure said compliance.



BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

### 4.36.385. COMPLIANCE WITH INTERNAL REVENUE CODE.

This Chapter shall be administered in a manner to comply with the applicable requirements of 26 U.S.C. Section 401(a) ((8), (9), (16), (17), (26), and (31)), and the Board (shall) is authorized to promulgate rules (designed to assure said) as it deems necessary to effectuate such compliance.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
