are adopted as shown in attached Exhibits 23.70.004 1A-1J.



Subject: Station Area Interim Overlay District

The attached ordinance represents proposed changes to the Station Area Interim Overlay District in response to public testimony at Council's public hearing establishing the Overlay District. Resolution 29867 established goals and strategies for Station Area Planning. These goals and strategies, which promote transit-oriented development, are the policy context for the Station Area Interim Overlay District.

The boundaries of the interim overlay district were drawn based on Sound Transit's proposed stations. Ten of the proposed light rail station locations are within a quarter mile of commercial zoning where non-transit-supportive uses and standards would be allowed. For these stations, staff determined appropriate boundaries for the Overlay District, using the quarter-mile circle as a starting point. Generally, the boundary was drawn to incorporate whole blocks, parcels, or to follow zoning boundaries, property lines or streets. Local topography, barriers to pedestrian access, large parcels and platting patterns warranted extending the overlay boundaries beyond the quarter mile circle in some cases. Although the boundaries include both commercial and non-commercial parcels, only commercial parcels are affected.

Several citizens testified as to their belief that the overlay boundaries were drawn to include specific parcels, in order to retaliate against opponents of Sound Transit. This, of course, was not the case.

Responding to concerns raised by citizens at the Council's hearing, staff have proposed modifications to the boundaries of the Overlay District. The revised boundaries are drawn more narrowly, based on the ¼ mile radius. It is believed that this boundary is the minimum area necessary to accomplish the goals of the Ordinance.

Council is scheduled to hold a public hearing on the proposed changes to the Station Area Interim Overlay District boundaries on September 21, 1999. A DNS (no Environmental Impact Council President Sue Do....dson Page 2

Statement required) was issued for the proposed changes in accordance with procedures under Seattle's SEPA ordinance. The end of the appeal period is August 19, 1999.

Existing resources are adequate to cover costs associated with implementing the proposed changes to the Overlay District boundary.
