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ORDINANCE 120317

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Weed & Seed Program in Central Seattle; authorizing the execution of agreements with the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation for financial assistance in the total amount of Two Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000); accepting the money when received; increasing the 2001 Budgets of the Police Department and the Human Services Department; ratifying and confirming prior acts; and making a reimbursable appropriation therefor; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

WHEREAS, Resolution 30146 adopted by the Seattle City Council on April 10, 2000 authorized application to the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation for financial assistance for the purpose of continuing the Weed and Seed Program in Central Seattle; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation have advised the City that the City's application for continued financial assistance has been approved; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As requested by the Chief of Police, the Chief of Police or his designee is authorized to execute for and on behalf of The City of Seattle, an agreement with the United States Department of Justice for financial assistance in the amount of One Hundred Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000) for the purpose of continuing the Weed and Seed Program in Central Seattle. The funds, when received, are hereby accepted and shall be deposited to the credit of the Supplemental Appropriations Account of the Emergency Subfund.

Section 2. The Chief of Police, or his designee, is authorized to execute for and on behalf of the City of Seattle an agreement with the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation for financial assistance in the amount Fifty

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36 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000). The funds, when received, are hereby accepted and shall  
37 be deposited to the credit of the Supplemental Appropriations Account of the  
38 Emergency Subfund.

39 Section 3. To carry out the purposes of the grant agreements authorized in  
40 Section 1 and Section 2, and contingent upon the execution of those agreements, the  
41 following program categories in the 2001 Budgets of the following departments are  
42 increased as follows:

43	<u>Police</u>	P10 – Office of the Chief	\$99,999
44	<u>Human Services</u>	H12 – Family and Youth Services	\$125,001

45 For such purposes, the sum of Two Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000)  
46 is hereby appropriated from the Supplemental Appropriations Account of the  
47 Emergency Subfund for the purposes outlined above. The Supplemental  
48 Appropriations Account of the Emergency Subfund shall be reimbursed from funds to  
49 be received from the United States Department of Justice and the United States  
50 Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation as authorized in Section 1 and  
51 Section 2. Any unencumbered or unexpended portions of this appropriation shall carry  
52 forward to future years, unless expressly abandoned by ordinance.

53 Section 4. Any act consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of  
54 this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

55 Section 5. The foregoing appropriation is made to meet actual necessary  
56 expenditures of the City for which no appropriation has been made due to causes which  
57 could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the making of the 2001 Budget  
58 in accordance with RCW 35.32A.060.

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60 Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from  
61 and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor  
62 within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal  
63 Code Section 1.04.020.

Dear Councilmember Compton:

We request the City Council's approval of the attached ordinance. This ordinance authorizes the Chief of Police to execute agreements in the total amount of \$225,000 for continued financial assistance for the Weed and Seed Program in Central Seattle. A total of \$175,000 is coming from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs and \$50,000 in Asset Forfeiture Funds is coming from the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The two together combine for a total of \$225,000 in funding for the Weed and Seed Program in Central Seattle.

The City has been receiving grant funds since 1993 from the Weed and Seed Program through the Department of Justice to revitalize the neighborhoods in Central Seattle. An East Precinct Community Advisory Committee with membership from community and business associations from the participating neighborhoods provides oversight and prioritizes coordinated law enforcement efforts for the program.

Year 8 grant funding is for the period from October 1, 2000 to September 30, 2001. Resolution 30146 authorized submission of this grant application. The funding will be split between the Police Department and the Human Services Department as identified on the attached budget detail.

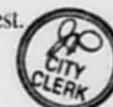
