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ORDINANCE 120874

AN ORDINANCE relating to water services of Seattle Public Utilities; revising water rates and charges and terms and conditions for service, and amending Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 21.04 in connection therewith; and revising credits to low-income customers and amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 21.76.040 in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, capital requirements and operating costs of the Water Fund have increased in recent years in response to rehabilitation and repair needs, regulatory requirements, and environmental concerns, with a resulting increase in the revenue requirements of the Water Fund; and

WHEREAS, the funding for the capital program is dependent on debt financing at favorable interest rates; and

WHEREAS, a solid bond rating for the Water Fund is important to maintaining ready access to financial capital on favorable terms; and

WHEREAS, a rate increase in 2002 would improve the Water Fund's financial performance which, in turn, would increase the likelihood that the Water Fund would receive a solid bond rating; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 28553, adopted July 6, 1992, established general ratemaking policies for water rates; and

WHEREAS, the water rates authorized by this ordinance are generally consistent with policies set forth in Resolution 28553; and

WHEREAS, credits for qualified low-income customers need to be revised when the water rates change; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 21.04.430, as last amended by Ordinance 120817, is amended as follows:

SMC 21.04.430 Rates inside City.

All water used inside the City for domestic and commercial purposes shall be supplied by meter only at the following rates and charges. Seasonal rates shall be prorated. For usage representing fractional parts of a month, the base service charge and all components of the commodity charge shall be prorated using a thirty (30)-day month. The additional cost of

funding the Revenue Stabilization Fund shall be separately itemized on customer bills along with other major components of water system costs as approved by the City Council. Seattle Public Utilities shall continue to incorporate arts funding into its capital projects constructed within the municipal boundaries of the City at the one (1) percent level, however the department shall not be permitted to fund any such program from the Water Fund on any capital project outside the City limits.

A. Residential. The rates for metered water supplied to single-family and duplex residences within the City in one (1) month, or fractional part thereof, shall be based on a commodity charge and a base service charge, in accordance with the following schedules:





AN ORDINANCE relating to water services of Seattle Public Utilities; revising water rates and charges and terms and conditions for service, and amending Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 21.04 in connection therewith; and revising credits to low-income customers and amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 21.76.040 in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, capital requirements and operating costs of the Water Fund have increased in recent years in response to rehabilitation and repair needs, regulatory requirements, and environmental concerns, with a resulting increase in the revenue requirements of the Water Fund; and

WHEREAS, the funding for the capital program is dependent on debt financing at favorable interest rates; and

WHEREAS, a solid bond rating for the Water Fund is important to maintaining ready access to financial capital on favorable terms; and

WHEREAS, a rate increase in 2002 would improve the Water Fund's financial performance which, in turn, would increase the likelihood that the Water Fund would receive a solid bond rating; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 28553, adopted July 6, 1992, established general ratemaking policies for water rates; and

WHEREAS, the water rates authorized by this ordinance are generally consistent with policies set forth in Resolution 28553; and

WHEREAS, credits for qualified low-income customers need to be revised when the water rates change; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE relating to water services of Seattle Public Utilities; revising water rates and charges and terms and conditions for service, and amending Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 21.04 in connection therewith; and revising credits to low-income customers and amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 21.76.040 in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, capital requirements and operating costs of the Water Fund have increased in recent years in response to rehabilitation and repair needs, regulatory requirements, and environmental concerns, with a resulting increase in the revenue requirements of the Water Fund; and

WHEREAS, the funding for the capital program is dependent on debt financing at favorable interest rates; and

WHEREAS, a solid bond rating for the Water Fund is important to maintaining ready access to financial capital on favorable terms; and

WHEREAS, a rate increase in 2002 would improve the Water Fund's financial performance which, in turn, would increase the likelihood that the Water Fund would receive a solid bond rating; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 28553, adopted July 6, 1992, established general ratemaking policies for water rates; and

WHEREAS, the water rates authorized by this ordinance are generally consistent with policies set forth in Resolution 28553; and

WHEREAS, credits for qualified low-income customers need to be revised when the water rates change; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 21.04.430, as last amended by Ordinance 120817, is amended as follows:

SMC 21.04.430 Rates inside City.

All water used inside the City for domestic and commercial purposes shall be supplied by meter only at the following rates and charges. Seasonal rates shall be prorated. For usage representing fractional parts of a month, the base service charge and all components of the commodity charge shall be prorated using a thirty (30)-day month. The additional cost of

funding the Cedar River Watershed Habitat Conservation Plan and other Endangered Species Act programs shall be specifically indicated in the billings. Seattle Public Utilities shall continue to incorporate arts funding into its capital projects constructed within the municipal boundaries of the City at the one (1) percent level, however the department shall not be permitted to fund any such program from the Water Fund on any capital project outside the City limits.

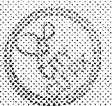

Summary of the Legislation:

This ordinance revises the water rates for residential, commercial and wholesale customers. It also adjusts the low-income assistance credits for water customers.

Background (Include justification for the legislation and funding history, if applicable):

The Water Fund's projected revenue requirement is \$132 million for 2003 and \$145 million for 2004. The projected revenue requirement for 2003 is \$19 million above the revenue that would be provided at the current rates and therefore requires a rate increase.

Capital requirements and operating costs of the Water Fund have increased in recent years in response to rehabilitation and repair needs, regulatory requirements, and environmental concerns. Debt service obligations have also increased. These factors result in higher revenue requirements for the Water Fund.

A rate increase in September 2002 and then again in January 2004 would improve the Water Fund's financial performance. This in turn would increase the likelihood that the Water Fund would receive a solid bond rating. Since funding for the capital program is dependent on debt financing at favorable interest rates, a solid bond rating for the Water Fund is important to maintaining ready access to financial capital on favorable terms.

With a water rate increase, credits for qualified low-income customers need to be revised accordingly.

Dear Council President Steinbrueck:

I am transmitting the attached ordinance for Council consideration.

This ordinance replaces and amends my 2002-2004 water rate proposal, reducing the proposed water rates due to the recent decision on the Second Supply Project Agreement.

As you know, the City of Seattle recently asked for a restructuring of the Second Supply Project Agreement in order to maintain a high standard for our water supply. The City of Tacoma and other project partners disagreed and have decided to move forward without Seattle's participation.

In seeking a restructuring of the project agreement, I acted to protect a water system that is the envy of the nation, a 100-year legacy in which we have invested \$250 million in the past five years. I wanted to make sure that the quality we have worked to protect and improve would not be compromised by water from Lake Tapps, whose quality is affected by recreational boating and nearby septic systems. When we proposed that we have the final say in whether Lake Tapps water entered our system, Tacoma declined.

We joined the second supply project in 1993. At that time, it was presumed that water from the Green River would flow into our system. The Green River is a protected source, much like our Cedar River and Tolt River systems. Seattle worked to move the Second Supply Project forward, engaging in the necessary planning, helping Covington obtain additional water, and assisting Kent with drought management assistance. The equation changed, however, when Lake Tapps surfaced as a source of water that could be introduced into our system. We did not want to cede control over the choice of what water our customers would drink. I wanted an unambiguous right to continue our stewardship of our pristine water system. Tacoma, unfortunately, found this unacceptable.

Tacoma's decision does not present a future supply problem for Seattle or its wholesale customers. Our current supplies (the Cedar and Tolt Rivers and the Highline Wellfields), when coupled with a reasonable level of long-term conservation, provide enough water to meet our needs for the next thirty-five years. In short, the region's success with conservation has altered our projections of demand; and, when combined with what we can produce from existing high quality water resources, provides us with long-term water at a substantially lower cost than that of the Second Supply Project.

Tacoma's decision relieves Seattle Public Utilities of a \$77 million obligation, a savings which I believe should be passed along in its entirety to our customers.

WHEREAS, the funding for the capital program is dependent on debt financing at favorable interest rates; and

WHEREAS, a solid bond rating for the Water Fund is important to maintaining ready access to financial capital on favorable terms; and

WHEREAS, a rate increase in 2002 would improve the Water Fund's financial performance which, in turn, would increase the likelihood that the Water Fund would receive a solid bond rating; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 28553, adopted July 6, 1992, established general ratemaking policies for water rates; and

WHEREAS, the water rates authorized by this ordinance are generally consistent with policies set forth in Resolution 28553; and

WHEREAS, credits for qualified low-income customers need to be revised when the water rates change; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 21.04.430, as last amended by Ordinance 120817, is amended as follows:

SMC 21.04.430 Rates inside City.

All water used inside the City for domestic and commercial purposes shall be supplied by meter only at the following rates and charges. Seasonal rates shall be prorated.
