ORDINANCE 120989

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Center Department; amending Section 17.19.010 of the Seattle Municipal Code, pertaining to Seattle Center parking charges.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Effective January 1, 2003, Section 17.19.010 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

17.19.010 Seattle Center parking charges.

A. Authorization to Establish Charges. The Seattle Center Director may establish, by rules adopted pursuant to Chapter 3.02 of the Seattle Municipal Code, regular and special charges for the use of parking facilities operated by the Seattle Center Department whether or not located within the bounds of the Seattle Center as defined by Ordinance 90160. All parking charges are inclusive of any taxes.

B. Regular Charges. The regular Seattle Center parking charges shall be composed of four (4) types of charges: Nonevent charges, Event charges, Stacked Parking charges and Monthly charges. Regular parking charges shall apply to all vehicles (including vehicles displaying disabled permits) unless the vehicle qualifies for a special parking charge pursuant to this section or ruled adopted under this section. The regular charge shall be prorated commensurate with the size and number of parking space(s) requires by vehicles, such as motorcycles, mopeds, buses, and other over- or undersized vehicles.

1. Nonevent: Nonevent charges shall be in effect during times and in parking locations when parking demand is low as determined by the Director and shall not be less than One Dollar (\$1.00) for the first hour of parking nor greater than ((Seven)) Eight Dollars (((\$7.00))) \$8.00 for any ten (10) hour period.

2 2. Event: Regular Event charges shall be in effect during times and in parking
3 locations when parking demand is high as determined by the Director and shall not be less
4 than Three Dollars (\$3.00) for the first hour of parking nor greater than ~~((Nine))~~ Twenty
5 Dollars ~~(((\$9.00)))~~ \$20.00 for any ten (10) hour period.
6

7 3. Stacked Parking: Stacked Parking charges apply whenever vehicles are
8 parked bumper-to-bumper to maximize available space for a specific event on a nonreserved
9 basis. Stacked Parking charges shall be not less than Three Dollars (\$3.00) nor more than
10 Six Dollars (\$6.00) per vehicle for the specified event period. Vehicles may not exit the
11 parking location prior to the end of the event and shall exit immediately after the event. A
12 vehicle not moved immediately after an event may be towed.
13

14 4. Monthly Parking: Monthly Parking charges shall be not less than Thirty
15 Dollars (\$30.00) nor greater than ~~((Eighty))~~ One Hundred Dollars ~~(((\$80.00)))~~ \$100.00 for a
16 monthly parking permit valid on a space available basis. The monthly parking charge may
17 be prorated when a monthly parking permit is purchased for only a portion of a month in
18 accordance with rules adopted under this section.
19

20 C. Special Parking Charges. At the discretion of the Seattle Center Director or
21 such official's designee, special parking charges may be established as follows:
22

23 1. Monthly Parking Discounts: For the simultaneous purchase, not for resale at
24 a profit, of ten (10) or more monthly parking permits for a given month, a discounted charge
25 equal to not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the monthly parking charge;
26



1 2. Parking Scrip: For the simultaneous purchase, not for resale at a profit, of
2 one (1) or more books of Seattle Center parking scrip or the simultaneous purchase, not for
3 resale at a profit, of one hundred (100) or more daily parking tickets, a discounted charge
4 equal to not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the regular parking charge therefor;
5

6 3. Park and Ride Program: For the purchase, not for resale at a profit, of a
7 parking permit for a given month by a participant in a Seattle Center Park & Ride program, a
8 discounted charge equal to not less than fifty percent (50%) of the monthly parking charge;
9

10 4. Reserved Parking Program: For the privilege of participating in the Mercer
11 Street Garage or the Seattle Center Lot Reserved Area Parking Program (under which a
12 parking space in such garage/lot is reserved for the participant on not less than three (3)
13 dates that are specified by the participant), a charge of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00)
14 for the period of time coinciding with the event reservation plus a service charge of not less
15 than One Dollar and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) nor more than Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each
16 parking order.
17

18 5. Reserved Stacked Parking Program: For the privilege of participating in the
19 Reserved Stacked Parking Program (under which a stacked parking space in such garage/lot
20 is reserved for the participant on not less than three (3) dates that are specified by the
21 participant), a charge of not more than Six Dollars (\$6.00) for each parking ticket, during the
22 time periods specified by the participant plus a service charge of not less than One Dollar
23 and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) nor more than Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each parking order.
24 Vehicles may not exit the parking location prior to the end of the event and shall exit
25 immediately after the event. A vehicle not moved immediately after an event may be towed;
26



1 6. Vehicle In-and-Out Privileges: For the privilege of moving a vehicle in and
2 out of a Seattle Center parking facility when a daily parking ticket is purchased, a surcharge
3 of not more than Two Dollars (\$2.00);
4

5 7. Event Carpool: To encourage carpooling during Seattle Center festivals and
6 events as designated by the Director, Event Carpool charges may be established based on
7 vehicle occupancy, shall not exceed a rate of (~~Eleven~~) Twenty Dollars (~~(\$11.00)~~) \$20.00
8 and shall be implemented at parking locations as designated by the Director. During
9 designated Seattle Center festivals and events, the Event Carpool charge for vehicles
10 displaying valid disabled permits shall not exceed (~~Ten~~) Fifteen Dollars (~~(\$10.00)~~)
11 \$15.00 regardless of vehicle occupancy. Seattle Center employees on paid status during
12 designated Seattle Center festivals will pay the lowest carpool rate regardless of occupancy;
13

14 8. In Excess of Ten (10) Hours: For parking in excess of ten (10) hours up to a
15 total of twenty-four (24) hours, a fee equal to twice the applicable Event or Non-Event
16 parking charge for the designated location;
17

18 9. Frequent User Pass: For the non-refundable purchase, not for resale at a
19 profit, of a frequent user pass produced by the client and validated by Seattle Center for
20 parking on five (5) or more specific dates with entry prior to a specified time of day for a
21 duration of not more than two (2) hours of parking, a discounted charge equal to not less
22 than fifty percent (50%) of the Event charge.
23

24 10. Parking Coupons: For the privilege of having the Seattle Center Department
25 honor parking coupons, a charge per event as follows:

26 (a) If the Seattle Center Department incurs any costs for the production of the
27 parking coupons or any incremental staffing costs due to their use, then the greater of (i) the



1 regular parking charges that would apply to the parking of all vehicles for which the parking
2 coupons are used plus the incremental staffing costs and actual production costs incurred by
3 the Seattle Center Department, or (ii) One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00);

4 (b) If the Seattle Center Department incurs neither costs for the production of
5 the parking coupons nor incremental staffing costs due to their use, then the greater of (i) the
6 regular parking charges that would apply to the parking of all vehicles for which the parking
7 coupons are used, or (ii) Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

8 For purposes of this subsection, a parking coupon is a coupon authorized in
9 advance by the Seattle Center Director or his or her designee, containing at a minimum the
10 limitations and conditions and instructions specified by the Director or his or her designee,
11 that is distributed by the sponsor of an event or activity expected to require the use of
12 parking facilities operated by the Seattle Center Department, and that is surrendered by the
13 driver of a vehicle at a parking facility operated by the Seattle Center Department in lieu of
14 payment at the time of parking there;

15
16 11. Short-term Premises Licensees: For the purchase of a permit issued to short-
17 term premises licensees for use of Seattle Center parking facilities for a specified duration,
18 with in-and-out privileges, a charge of not less than Six Dollars (\$6.00) and not more than
19 Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per day.

20
21 D. Permits for Parking Without Charge. At the discretion of the Seattle Center
22 Director, parking permits may be issued, without charge, to individuals providing
23 uncompensated service to the Seattle Center Department or to the Seattle Center Advisory
24 Commission, to any officer or employee of The City of Seattle or other governmental entity,
25 or to any person in order to facilitate any contractor engaged in a construction or demolition
26 project at Seattle Center, or to attendees of regularly scheduled veterans meetings held in the
27 Veteran's Hall, or to enhance public safety.



1
2 E. When Parking Charges Due and Payable. All parking charges imposed
3 pursuant to this section shall be due and payable in advance or as of the commencement of
4 the use of the subject parking area except when a short-term premises licensee has
5 contracted to pay for parking fees as part of the Seattle Center Licensing Agreement.
6

7 F. Enforcement of Parking Charges. A parking surcharge equal to no more than
8 ~~Five~~ Two Dollars (\$52.00) shall be due and payable whenever the applicable parking charge
9 has not been paid at or before the time such parking charge became due and payable. An
10 additional parking surcharge equal to no more than (~~(Fifteen))~~ Twenty Dollars (~~(((\$15.00)))~~)
11 \$20.00 shall be due and payable whenever the applicable parking charge of the first
12 surcharge has not been paid within fourteen (14) days after the time the parking charge
13 became due and payable. At the discretion of the Director, the Department may allow all or
14 a portion of the parking surcharges collected by an agent to be retained by the agent in
15 exchange for said agent's collection and remittance of the (~~((applicable))~~) parking charge to
16 the Seattle Center.
17


18 G. Non-Public Parking Use of Parking Facilities. The Seattle Center Director or
19 such official's designee is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the City, licensing
20 agreements for the use of all or a portion of a parking facility for a client's exclusive use for
21 such times as such facility is not required for public parking or in use by contract made
22 pursuant to a specific ordinance, at a discounted charge equal to not less than fifty percent
23 (50%) of the Nonevent charge therefor.
24

25 Section 2. Any act consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this
26 ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.
27




1 Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and
2 after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten
3 (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section
4 1.04.020.





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Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Center Department; amending Section 17.19.010 of the Seattle Municipal Code, pertaining to Seattle Center parking charges

Summary of the Legislation: The legislation authorizes increases to event-related parking rates to better reflect current market rates. It also establishes greater flexibility (within a limit) for setting rates.

Background: The Seattle Center owns and operates six parking facilities:

- Mercer Garage
- 1st Ave N Garage
- 5th Ave Parking
- Lot 4
- Lot 5
- Lot 6

Revenue from these facilities is primarily generated from daily and monthly parking, though it also includes revenue from parking scrip, and reserved parking.

Parking revenue comprises approximately 15% of Seattle Center's revenue. Parking rates are set with regard to market forces (competition, affordability, demand management) and parking management strategies (carpool incentives, convenient parking for patrons attending events at various Seattle Center facilities, etc.).

While Seattle Center's current rate ordinance caps event parking rates at \$8, on Sonics game nights the Center's private parking lot competitors charge as much as \$20. By changing the rate ordinance to allow a wider range of rates, the Center will have greater flexibility to be competitive and generate additional revenue. (The last rate increases at Seattle Center were in 1999 when the event rates were increase \$1, from \$7 to \$8 for up to 10 hours at all facilities except the 5th Ave Lot. At that time 5th Ave events rates were \$4 (carpool) and \$7 (non-carpool); those rates increased by \$1 to \$5 (carpool) and \$8 (non-carpool) in 2001.)

This proposed ordinance amends the existing ordinance by:

- **Allowing a wider pricing range (up to \$20) in daily parking rates.** This provides greater flexibility to be competitive and generate additional revenue, while continuing to meet our many other goals, including providing affordable parking. At this time we anticipate raising parking rates from \$8 to \$10 on Sonics games nights only. There may be opportunities in selected locations and certain times to charge more and still be competitive, while leaving other locations priced as low as \$5.
- **Allowing a wider pricing range (up to \$100) in monthly parking rates.** Monthly parking is currently capped at \$80 while our competition is over \$100. At this time, Seattle Center anticipates raising the monthly rate \$5 per month in both 2003 and 2004.

The department will continue to push rates within the constraints of the price elasticity of demand to maximize revenues.



Dear Council President Steinbrueck:

The attached legislation proposes to raise event-related parking rates to better reflect the current market. Currently, the existing ordinance caps event parking rates at \$8. On Sonics game nights, our private competitors charge as much as \$20 per vehicle. While our current pricing achieves affordability and consistency for patrons, we are not maximizing revenues.

We are therefore proposing a change to the rate ordinance which allows a wider pricing range (up to \$20). This provides greater flexibility to be competitive and generate additional revenue, while continuing to provide affordable parking. At this time we anticipate raising our parking rates to \$10 on Sonics game nights only. However, there may be opportunities in selected locations and certain times to go raise the rates higher and still be competitive, while leaving other locations priced as low as \$5. In addition, monthly parking is currently capped at \$80 while our competition charges over \$100. Therefore, we propose raising the cap on our monthly parking to \$100 per month although, at this time, we anticipate raising our rates only \$5 per month in both 2003 and 2004. The department will continue to push rates within the constraints of the price elasticity of demand to maximize revenues.

21 duration of not more than two (2) hours of parking, a discounted charge equal to not less
22 than fifty percent (50%) of the Event charge.

16 11. Short-term Premises Licensees: For the purchase of a permit issued to short-
17 term premises licensees for use of Seattle Center parking facilities for a specified duration,
18 with in-and-out privileges, a charge of not less than Six Dollars (\$6.00) and not more than
19 Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per day.

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21 D. Permits for Parking Without Charge. At the discretion of the Seattle Center
22 Director, parking permits may be issued, without charge, to individuals providing
23 uncompensated service to the Seattle Center Department or to the Seattle Center Advisory
24 Commission, to any officer or employee of The City of Seattle or other governmental entity,
25 or to any person in order to facilitate any contractor engaged in a construction or demolition
26 project at Seattle Center, or to attendees of regularly scheduled veterans meetings held in the
27 Veteran's Hall, or to enhance public safety.

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2 E. When Parking Charges Due and Payable. All parking charges imposed
3 pursuant to this section shall be due and payable in advance or as of the commencement of
4 the use of the subject parking area except when a short-term premises licensee has
5 contracted to pay for parking fees as part of the Seattle Center Licensing Agreement.
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7 F. Enforcement of Parking Charges. A parking surcharge equal to no more than
8 Two Dollars (\$2.00) shall be due and payable whenever the applicable parking charge has
9 not been paid at or before the time such parking charge became due and payable. An
10 additional parking surcharge equal to no more than ~~((Fifteen))~~ Twenty Dollars ~~(((\$15.00)))~~
11 \$20.00 shall be due and payable whenever the applicable parking charge of the first
12 surcharge has not been paid within fourteen (14) days after the time the parking charge
13 became due and payable. At the discretion of the Director, the Department may allow all or
14 a portion of the parking surcharges collected by an agent to be retained by the agent in
15 exchange for said agent's collection and remittance of the ~~((applicable))~~ parking charge to
16 the Seattle Center.
17

18 G. Non-Public Parking Use of Parking Facilities. The Seattle Center Director or
19 such official's designee is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the City, licensing
20 agreements for the use of all or a portion of a parking facility for a client's exclusive use for
21 such times as such facility is not required for public parking or in use by contract made
22 pursuant to a specific ordinance, at a discounted charge equal to not less than fifty percent
23 (50%) of the Nonevent charge therefor.
24

25 Section 2. Any act consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this
26 ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.
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Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.


