



9 Section 2. CONTROLS: The following controls are hereby imposed on the features and
10 characteristics of the Green lake Library and its site that were designated by the Board for
11 preservation:

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13 A. CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL PROCESS

14 1. A Certificate of Approval, issued by the City of Seattle's Landmarks Preservation Board
15 pursuant to Seattle Municipal Code, 25.12, must be obtained, or the time for denying a
16 Certificate of Approval application must have expired, before the owner may make
17 alterations or significant changes to:

18 **The site, the exterior of the building, and the interior of the main floor of the
19 building excluding floor coverings, movable furniture and book stacks.**

20 2. A Certificate of Approval is not required for the following:

21 a. Any in-kind maintenance or repairs of the features listed in subsection 1, and

22 b. The removal of existing partition walls of the staff/support area that existed prior to
23 December 5, 2001.

24 B. ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

25 1. Administrative review and approval may be provided for the items listed in subsection 3
26 according to the following procedures. The Owner shall submit to the City Historic
27 Preservation Officer (CHPO) a written request for these alterations, including applicable
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1 drawings and/or specifications. If the CHPO, upon examination of submitted plans and
2 specifications, determines that such alterations are consistent with the purposes of SMC
3 25.12 the alterations shall be approved without the need for any further action by the
4 Board. If the CHPO disapproves such alterations, the Owner may submit revised
5 materials to the CHPO, or submit in accordance with the Certificate of Approval process
6 set forth in SMC 25.12.

7 2. The CHPO shall submit his or her written decision on the Owner's submittal to the
8 Owner. Failure of the CHPO to approve or disapprove the request shall constitute
9 approval of the request.

10 3. Administrative review is available for the following:

11 *For the designated areas of the buildings, the addition or elimination of duct conduits,
12 HVAC vents, grilles, fire escapes, pipes, wiring and conduits for computers/technology,
13 and other similar wiring or mechanical elements necessary for the normal operation of
14 buildings.*

15 Section 3. INCENTIVES

16 A. Seattle Municipal Code Title 23 provides for authorization of uses in a designated Landmark
17 that are not normally permitted in a particular zoning classification by means of an
18 administrative conditional use.

19 B. Building and Energy Code exceptions on an application basis.

20 C. The availability of the Historic Preservation Special Tax Valuation (Chapter 84.26 RCW) to
21 all Seattle landmarks subject to controls imposed by designation ordinance, on an application
22 basis.

23 Section 4. Enforcement of this Ordinance and penalties for its violation shall be as
24 provided in SMC 25.12.910.

25 Section 5. The Green Lake Library and the site are hereby added to the Table of
26 Historical Landmarks contained in SMC Chapter 25.32.




1 Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to record this ordinance with the King County
2 Director of Records and Elections, deliver two copies to the City Historic Preservation Officer,
3 and deliver one copy to the Director of the Department of Design, Construction and Land Use.

5 Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after
6 its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days
7 after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.



The attached ordinance acknowledges the designation of the Green Lake Library as an historic landmark based upon a determination by the Landmarks Preservation Board; imposes controls on the features of the library and its site; and adds the library and site to the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in SMC Chapter 25.32. The ordinance does not have financial implications.

Green Lake Library is one of nine libraries recently designated as an historic landmark by the Landmarks Preservation Board. The nomination was prepared and submitted by the Seattle Public Library in anticipation of the renovation of the library as part of the "Libraries for All" capital improvement program. The designation of Green Lake Library as a City landmark was supported by the Seattle Public Library. Green Lake Library is also listed in the National Register of Historic Places as one of seven Carnegie libraries in Seattle.

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WHEREAS, the Landmarks Ordinance, Chapter 25.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code (SMC), establishes a procedure for the designation and preservation of structures and areas having historical, cultural, architectural, engineering or geographic importance; and

WHEREAS, the Landmarks Preservation Board, after a public meeting on August 1, 2001, voted to approve the nomination of the Green Lake Library at 7364 Greenlake Drive N., in Seattle as a Landmark under SMC Chapter 25.12; and

WHEREAS, after a public meeting on September 19, 2001, the Board voted to approve the designation of the Green Lake Library and the site as a Landmark under SMC Chapter 25.12; and

WHEREAS, on December 5, 2001, the Board and the owners of the designated property agreed to controls and incentives; and

WHEREAS, the Board recommends to the City Council approval of controls and incentives; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:






