ORDINANCE 121283

AN ORDINANCE relating to security from terrorism; authorizing an agreement with the federal Department of Homeland Security, Office for Domestic Preparedness (DHS/ODP), for financial assistance under the Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program I; authorizing applications for allocations of funds under that agreement; recognizing that the Police Department will serve as the Program Administering Agency for UASI Grant Program I; authorizing the City to partner with the State of Washington and King County to receive funding from DHS/ODP under UASI Grant Program II; authorizing applications for allocations of funds under that grant program; increasing appropriations to the Police Department, the Fire Department, Seattle Public Utilities, Seattle Transportation, City Light, the Department of Information Technology, and the Fleets and Facilities Department in the 2003 Budget; adding a position in the Police Department; and adding a position in Seattle Transportation; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

WHEREAS, President Bush approved the *National Strategy for Homeland Security* in 2002, which is a national effort to prevent and respond to acts of terrorism in the United States that recognizes the vital role of state and local governments in combating terrorism; and

WHEREAS, as part of the *National Strategy for Homeland Security*, the City of Seattle has been selected as one of seven major cities to receive funding under the UASI Grant Program I from DHS/ODP and has been awarded Eleven Million Two Hundred One Thousand Dollars (\$11,201,000); and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has been duly appointed by the Mayor of Seattle to serve as the "program administering agency" (PAA) for the City of Seattle under the UASI Grant Program I; and

WHEREAS, the PAA has organized an Urban Area Working Group, hereinafter referred to as the Steering Committee, to assist in administering UASI Grant Program I activities; and

WHEREAS, local jurisdictions are authorized by DHS/ODP to request an initial allocation from UASI Grant Program I, up to twenty-five percent (25%) of the total award, for immediate resource needs pertaining to conducting a Vulnerability Assessment and the development of an Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy; and

WHEREAS, upon successful submission of a timely Vulnerability Assessment and an Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy to DHS/ODP, the City of Seattle will be eligible to apply for the remainder of the awarded UASI Grant Program I funding; and

WHEREAS, the Seattle Urban Area has been selected as one of 30 urban areas to receive funding from DHS/ODP under UASI Grant Program II to be administered by the State of

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1 Washington, Military Department, Emergency Management Division, serving as the
2 "state administering agency" (SAA), and the state has been awarded under this program
3 Eighteen Million One Hundred Eighty Six Thousand Six Hundred Eighty Eight Dollars
(\$18,186,688), of which at least eighty percent (80%) must be passed through directly to
the Seattle urban area; and

4 WHEREAS, for purposes of UASI Grant Program II, the Seattle Urban Area encompasses the
5 City of Seattle and King County, or "core city" and "core county," respectively, and the
6 contiguous jurisdictions of Pierce County and Snohomish County; and

7 WHEREAS, together with the SAA, the City of Seattle, represented by the Seattle Police
8 Department, King County, and the contiguous jurisdictions of Pierce County and
Snohomish County form the Urban Area Workgroup; and

9 WHEREAS, under UASI Grant Program II, selected urban areas are authorized to apply for up to
10 twenty five percent (25%) of the total award for immediate resource needs pertaining to
11 conducting a Vulnerability Assessment and the development of an Urban Area Homeland
Security Strategy;

12 NOW, THEREFORE,

13 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

14 Section 1. The Chief of Police or his designee is authorized to execute for and on behalf
15 of the City of Seattle, an agreement with DHS/ODP, and all ancillary documents he reasonably
16 deems necessary, for the receipt of UASI Grant Program I funds in the amount of up to Eleven
17 Million Two Hundred One Thousand Dollars (\$11,201,000) to address the unique equipment,
18 training, planning and exercise needs of large urban areas to prevent, respond to, and recover
19 from threats or acts of terrorism. The Police Department is recognized as the program
20 administering agency (PAA) for the City of Seattle under the UASI Grant Program I.
21

22 Section 2. Pursuant to the grant agreement authorized in Section 1, the Chief of Police or
23 his designee is authorized to apply for up to One Million Five Hundred Ninety Seven Thousand
24 Three Hundred Dollars (\$1,597,300), which is the portion of the twenty five percent (25%) initial
25 allocation that has been approved by the Steering Committee, for purposes of conducting
26

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1 required assessment work, purchasing personal protective equipment, and development work on
2 the Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy required by DHS/ODP. After the Vulnerability
3 Assessment and the Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy have been submitted to and
4 approved by DHS/ODP, the Chief of Police or his designee is authorized to apply for remaining
5 funding up to the total amount awarded and authorized in Section 1 above. No such future
6 allocations shall be spent, however, unless appropriated by ordinance.
7

8 Section 3. The Chief of Police or his designee is authorized to execute for and on behalf
9 of the City of Seattle all agreements and ancillary documents he reasonably deems necessary to
10 partner with the State of Washington, King County, and other local jurisdictions to participate in
11 UASI Grant Program II and receive funding from the urban area's total award of Eighteen
12 Million One Hundred Eighty Six Thousand Six Hundred Eighty Eight Dollars (\$18,186,688), to
13 increase the capacity of the Seattle urban area to prevent, respond to, and recover from threats or
14 acts of terrorism.
15

16 Section 4. Pursuant to the grant program described in Section 3, the Chief of Police or
17 his designee is authorized to apply for up to One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000),
18 which is the portion of the twenty five percent (25%) initial allocation that has been authorized
19 by the Urban Area Working Group, for purposes of conducting assessment work and for grant
20 management. After the Vulnerability Assessment and the Urban Area Homeland Security
21 Strategy have been submitted to and approved by DHS/ODP, the Chief of Police or his designee
22 is authorized to apply for remaining funding up to the total amount awarded and authorized in
23 Section 3 above. No such future allocations shall be spent, however, unless appropriated by
24 ordinance.

Section 5. The funds to be received pursuant to Sections 1 through 4 above are hereby accepted. When received, the funds applied for under the first sentence of Section 2 and the first sentence of Section 4 shall be deposited in the funds named in Section 6 to reimburse for appropriations made in Section 6.

Section 6. To carry out the purpose of the agreements authorized in Sections 1 and 3, and contingent upon the execution of those agreements, the appropriations for the following in the 2003 budget are increased as follows:

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1 Section 7. In accordance with RCW 35.32A.060, by reason of the facts above
2 stated, the foregoing appropriations are made to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City
3 for which no appropriation has been made due to causes which could not reasonably have been
4 foreseen at the time of the making of the 2003 Budget. Unspent funds so appropriated shall carry
5 forward to subsequent fiscal years until they are exhausted or abandoned by ordinance.

7 Section 8. To provide personnel resources to handle the additional workload as a result
8 of the agreements authorized in Sections 1 and 3, the following positions are created in the Police
9 Department and in Seattle Transportation.

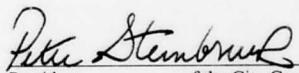

14 The Chief of Police and Director of Transportation are authorized to fill the same subject to
15 personnel laws and rules.

16 Section 9. The City intends that when grant funding is no longer available, the Planning
17 & Development Specialist II position will be abrogated and the cost of the Emergency
18 Preparedness Officer position will be absorbed in the annual operating budget of Seattle
19 Transportation.

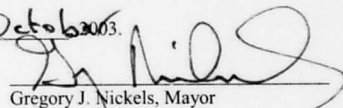
21 Section 10. Any act consistent with the authority but prior to the effective date of this
22 ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.
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Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

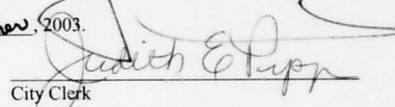

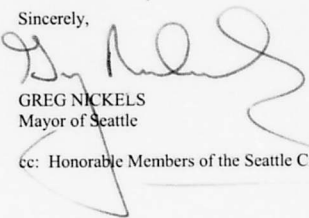
Dear Council President Steinbrueck:

The attached ordinance authorizes the City to receive funding to support our efforts to prevent, combat, and respond to possible acts of terrorism. Specifically, the legislation authorizes an agreement with the federal Department of Homeland Security, Office for Domestic Preparedness (DHS/ODP) to receive financial assistance in the amount of \$11,201,000 under the Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program I. Additionally, the ordinance authorizes the City to partner with the State of Washington and King County, which will result in the Seattle urban area receiving at least 80% (approximately \$14.5 million) of the funding from DHS/ODP under the UASI Grant Program II. Finally, the ordinance adds one full-time position in the Police Department and one in Seattle Transportation.

The City of Seattle has been selected as one of seven major cities to receive funding under the UASI Grant Program I and was selected as one of 30 urban areas to receive funding from DHS/ODP under UASI Grant Program II. The initial allocation of funds accepted by this ordinance will be used to conduct vulnerability assessments and develop homeland security strategies. Upon successful submission of timely assessments and strategies to DHS/OPD, the City of Seattle will be eligible to apply for the remainder of available funding under both grant programs.

The second anniversary of the September 11th attacks carries a solemn reminder of the crucial work we must do in order to protect our citizens and our way of life. - **Summary of the Legislation:** This legislation authorizes the Police Department to execute an agreement with the Department of Homeland Security, Office for Domestic Preparedness (DHS/ODP) for financial assistance in the amount of \$11,201,000 under Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program I. Additionally, the ordinance authorizes the Police Department to apply for an initial allocation of \$1,597,300 to be reimbursed by DHS/ODP for equipment, training, planning and exercise needs associated with preventing, responding to, and recovering from threats or acts of terrorism. This legislation also authorizes the Police Department to execute an agreement to partner with King County and the State of Washington to receive funding from DHS/ODP under UASI Grant Program II, whereby the Seattle urban area will receive at least 80% of the \$18,186,688 award under that program. This legislation further authorizes the Police Department to apply for an initial allocation of \$150,000 (to be reimbursed by DHS/ODP) to administer Seattle's UASI program. Finally, the ordinance authorizes the creation of two FTE's: a Planning and Development Specialist II in the Police Department, and an Emergency Preparedness Officer in Seattle Transportation.
- **Background:** President Bush approved the *National Strategy for Homeland Security* in 2002, which is a national effort to prevent and respond to acts of terrorism in the United States that recognizes the vital role of state and local governments in combating terrorism. Funding authorized for state and local governments under UASI Grant Programs I and II reflects the intent of Congress and the Administration to enhance and quantify the preparedness of the nation to combat terrorism. In addition, not completing this initial assessment and strategy development work will result in the City of Seattle and contiguous jurisdictions being ineligible to receive the remaining funding available under UASI Grant Programs I and II.

The funding authorized in this Ordinance will provide immediate resource needs pertaining to conducting a Vulnerability Assessment and the development of an Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy. Successful submission of a Vulnerability Assessment and an Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy to DHS/ODP will ensure that the City of Seattle is eligible to apply for the remainder of UASI Grant Program I & II funding. The remainder is expected to be available beginning January, 2004.
