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## ORDINANCE \_\_/2/5/5

AN ORDINANCE relating to security from terrorism; authorizing the City to partner with the State of Washington and King County to receive financial assistance from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Office for State and Local Government Coordination and Preparedness under the Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grant FFY '04; authorizing an application for allocation of funds under that agreement; increasing appropriations to the Police Department, the Fire Department, the Department of Information Technology, and the Fleets and Facilities Department in the 2004 Budget; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

WHEREAS, the projects identified in this legislation are consistent with the objectives of the Seattle-King County Urban Area Strategy, as approved by the federal Department of Homeland Security;

WHEREAS, Ordinance 121283, adopted by the City Council on September 22, 2003, authorized the Police Department to apply for funding under UASI Grant Programs 1 and II, authorized the Police Department to execute an agreement to partner with the State of Washington, King County, and other local jurisdictions to participate in UASI Grant Program II, and appropriated an initial allocation of funding under both grant programs for immediate needs of conducting vulnerability assessments and providing urgently needed equipment to City departments;

WHEREAS, Ordinance 121418 adopted by the City Council on March 15, 2004 authorized the Police Department to apply for the remaining funding available through UASI Grant Programs I and II; and

WHEREAS, the projects funded by UASI Grant FFY '04 were identified using a thorough process that involved operations staff from seven City departments; including the Fire Department, Police Department, Department of Information Technology, Fleets and Facilities, Seattle Department of Transportation, Seattle City Light, and Seattle Public Utilities;

NOW, THEREFORE,

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Chief of Police or his designee is authorized to partner with the State of

Washington and King County to receive financial assistance from DHS, and execute all

De Council President Drago:

I am transmitting legislation that appropriates \$7,167,697 from the Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant for Federal Fiscal Year 2004 (UASI 04). Projects funded with UASI 04 resources will further the City's preparedness strategy that was presented to City Council in December 2003 and approved by DHS in March 2004. Specifically, the projects will support the acquisition of two new fire boats and two new police boats; implement technology that allows video to be shared with command sites from incident scenes; complete a communications link with State and regional command centers; train elected or appointed officials and senior managers who are responsible for emergency management during an activation of the Emergency Operations Center; analyze and make recommendations regarding the City's capability to back up its emergency command and control facilities; and provide necessary resources to manage the City's UASI grants.

According to analyses conducted by the federal government, Seattle remains among the urban areas According to analyses conducted by the rederal government, seather tenhans antong the unoan areas in the United States at highest risk of terrorist attack. UASI 04, which awarded grants to 50 jurisdictions, is the third round of funding that DHS has targeted for those high-risk areas. Including the award of \$16,418,562 in the latest round of funding, the UASI program has supplied the Seattle urban area, comprised of Seattle and King, Pierce and Snohomish Counties, with a total of \$45.8 million. Of that total, Seattle has received \$25.8 million, which includes \$11.2 million that was earmarked for the city in the UASI I program

The funding package set forth in this legislation reflects a multi-disciplinary approach that recognizes the need for prevention, protection, and response capability. Months of work by City departments and our urban area partners have resulted in assessments of our risk, a strategy to ueparuments and our uroan area partners have resulted in assessments of our risk, a strategy to respond to those risks, and budget plans that implement that strategy. The training, equipment, and infrastructure protection in this funding package are vital to advering Seattle as the most prepared city in America. **Legislation Title:** An Ordinance relating to security from terrorism; authorizing the City to partner with the State of Washington and King County to receive financial assistance from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Office for State and Local Government Coordination and Preparedness under the Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grant FFY '04; authorizing an application of allocation of funds under that agreement; increasing appropriations to the Police Department, the Fire Department, the Department of Information Technology, and the Fleets and Facilities Department in the 2004 Budget; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

Summary of the Legislation: This legislation appropriates \$7,167,697 under UASI Grant
FFY '04 to the funds outlined below to be reimbursed from funds received from DHS.
Funds will reimburse the City of Seattle for equipment, training, planning and management
needs associated with preventing, responding to, and recovering from threats or acts of
terrorism.

This legislation additionally authorizes the Police Department to execute an agreement to partner with the State of Washington, King County, and other local jurisdictions to participate in UASI Grant FFY '04 and receive funding from the state in the amount of \$7,167,697 to increase the capacity of the Seattle urban area to prevent, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism.

<u>Background</u>: This is the third ordinance SPD has asked City Council to adopt for the
application and receipt of funds from the Department of Homeland Security for furthering
the City's strategy for preparedness.

Ordinance 121283, passed by the City Council on September 22, 2003, authorized the Police Department to apply for funding from UASI Grant Programs I and II. That ordinance further appropriated an initial allocation of funding under both grant programs for immediate needs of conducting vulnerability assessments and providing urgently needed equipment to City departments. This ordinance further authorized the Police Department to execute an agreement to partner with the State of Washington, King County, and other local jurisdictions to participate in UASI Grant Program II. Ordinance 121418 adopted by the City Council on March 15, 2004 authorized the Police Department to apply for the remaining funding available through UASI Grant Programs I and II.

The projects to be implemented with the \$7,167,697 in federal homeland security funds authorized by this ordinance will further the City's strategy for preparedness. This

legislation supports the acquisition of two marine security vessels each for the Police Department and Fire Department. Funding for the large fire boat supplements resources approved in the 2003 Fire Facilities & Emergency Response Levy. In addition, this ordinance package provides equipment and infrastructure protection for the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) and the Fleets and Facilities Department. Furthermore, resources are appropriated to DoIT, which is managing a multi-jurisdictional project begun with UASI Program II funds, to connect electronic communications among Emergency Operations Centers in Seattle, the State of Washington, and King, Pierce, and Snohomish Counties. The Police Department receives resources to develop a curriculum to train elected or appointed officials and senior managers who are responsible for departments' emergency management during an activation of the Emergency Operations Center.

- What is the financial cost of not implementing the legislation? The costs to the City of not implementing the legislation include the loss of funding that has been made available to the City under UASI Grant FFY '04, and therefore, loss of funding to improve the City's overall ability to prevent, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism. In addition, not implementing this legislation would likely result in the City of Seattle being ineligible to receive additional funding that is expected to be made available under additional phases of the UASI Grant Program in future years.
- What are the possible alternatives to the legislation that could achieve the same or similar objectives? The only possible alternative would be to use scarce City resources to provide urban area security equipment, training and infrastructure protection, and to implement other elements of the urban area homeland security strategy that was authorized by Ordinance 121283.
- Is the legislation subject to public hearing requirements: No
- Other Issues: Police and Fire will have ongoing maintenance costs associated with the new
  vessels purchased with the UASI FFY '04 grant funds. It is anticipated that the cost of
  maintaining replacement boats (large fire and both police) will not exceed the amounts
  budgeted to maintain the older boats that are being replaced. The costs will be more certain
  when the new boats are closer to being ready for use.
