AN ORDINANCE relating to City streets, re-naming the 100-400 blocks of South Atlantic Street to Edgar Martinez Drive South.

WHEREAS, on October 3, 2004, Edgar Martinez played his last game as a Seattle Mariner, retiring after 18 remarkable seasons in Major League Baseball, all with the Mariners; and

WHEREAS, re-naming a portion of a street near Safeco Field would provide an appropriate and lasting legacy to recognize one of Seattle's true sports heroes; and

WHEREAS, the only abutting property owner of this street segment, the Public Facilities District, has indicated its support for the renaming of South Atlantic Street from 1st Avenue South to 4th Avenue South in honor of Edgar Martinez; and

WHEREAS, the relevant public safety and public utilities agencies have reviewed the proposal and agree that no significant, negative impacts would result from this action; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The name of the 100 – 400 block of South Atlantic Street is hereby changed to Edgar Martinez Drive South.

Legislation Title: An ordinance relating to City streets, re-naming the 100-400 blocks of South Atlantic Street to Edgar Martinez Drive South.

Summary of the Legislation: This legislation re-names a segment of South Atlantic Street as Edgar Martinez Drive South.

Background: This legislation would re-name the portion of South Atlantic Street between 1st Avenue South and 4th Avenue South, which is adjacent to Safeco Field. The only affected property owner in this case is the Seattle Mariners (and, hence, the Public Facilities District). No addresses will have to be changed as a result of this action. Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) staff contacted numerous relevant public safety and utility agencies, including the Seattle Police Department, the Seattle Fire Department, Seattle City Light, Seattle Public Utilities, and the Washington State Department of Transportation, none of which expressed any concerns with the proposed change.

City representatives also contacted officials from the freight, trucking, and industrial communities about the proposed name change to ensure that any issues related to wayfinding are addressed. Because of Mr. Martinez's high public profile and popularity, numerous private citizens and sports fans have expressed interest in paying the cost of manufacturing and installing any new signs that are needed. SDOT has established a reimbursable account for this effort, and anticipates that any costs to manufacture and install the signs will be fully reimbursed.


I am delighted to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which will change the name of the 100-400 blocks of South Atlantic Street to Edgar Martinez Drive South, in honor of one of Seattle's true sports heroes. Edgar's unyielding respect for the game, his teammates, and the fans is a lesson for all of us, and fundamental to his legacy in Seattle. Edgar's double in the 1995 playoffs might have saved baseball in Seattle. And every moment of his time with the Seattle Mariners and in the Major Leagues was the very definition of professionalism, determination, and teamwork.

In Edgar's honor, this legislation would re-name the portion of South Atlantic Street between 1st Avenue South and 4th Avenue South, which is adjacent to Safeco Field. The only affected property owner in this case is the Seattle Mariners (and, hence, the Public Facilities District). No addresses will have to be changed as a result of this action. Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) staff contacted numerous relevant public safety and utility agencies, including the Seattle Police Department, the Seattle Fire Department, Seattle City Light, Seattle Public Utilities, and the Washington State Department of Transportation, none of which expressed any concerns with the proposed change.

City representatives have also been in contact with officials from the freight, trucking, and industrial communities about the proposed name change to ensure that any issues related to wayfinding are addressed. Because of Edgar's high public profile and popularity, numerous private citizens and sports fans have expressed interest in paying the cost of manufacturing and installing any new signs that are needed. Signage and other costs associated with the street name change will be fully paid for by private fundraising and SDOT has established a reimbursable account for this purpose.


