ORDINANCE 122985

AN ORDINANCE relating to Conservation Futures Levy proceeds; authorizing the Mayor to amend the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Seattle and King County as authorized by City of Seattle Ordinance 114978; and authorizing the deposit of the 2007 allocation from King County Conservation Futures Levy proceeds into the City of Seattle's 2000 Parks Levy Fund.

WHEREAS, in 1989, King County Ordinance 9128 established the Conservation Futures Levy ("CFL") Fund, appropriated CFL proceeds to the City of Seattle ("City"), and established conditions for use of the proceeds, including allowable projects, costs, and expenses; and

WHEREAS, in 1990, City Ordinance 114978 authorized the CFL Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with King County to govern the receipt and use of CFL proceeds, and to define the specific projects ("Projects") approved by King County for acquisitions using CFL proceeds; and

WHEREAS, the City and King County have previously amended the CFL Interlocal Cooperation Agreement to add additional Projects and to provide for additional allocations of CFL proceeds; and

WHEREAS, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15815 on June 7, 2007, which appropriated a total of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Seattle for the West Capitol Hill Park acquisition Project; and

WHEREAS, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15898 on September 10, 2007, which appropriated a total of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Seattle for the West Capitol Hill Park acquisition Project; and

WHEREAS, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15989 on December 20, 2007, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into an interlocal agreement with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 15815 and Ordinance 15898; and

WHEREAS, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15975 on November 19, 2007, which appropriated a total of Two Million Nine Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$2,975,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Seattle for the University District Urban Center Park, East Capitol Hill Park, Kiwanis Ravine



Greenspace, Longfellow Creek Greenspace, Westlake Greenbelt, and Chinatown/International District Urban Center Park acquisition Projects; and

WHEREAS, the King County Council also passed Ordinance 16052 on April 7, 2008, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 15975; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to negotiate and enter into an amendment to the Conservation Futures Levy (hereafter CFL) Interlocal Cooperation Agreement, substantially in the form of Exhibit A (hereafter, "Amendment"), to provide for the City's receipt and use of up to Three Million Five Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$3,575,000) from the 2007 King County allocations of CFL proceeds. The Amendment will also add an Attachment W to the list of Projects in the CFL Interlocal Cooperation Agreement to include West Capitol Hill Park, Chinatown/International District Urban Center Park, University District Urban Center Park, East Capitol Hill Park, Kiwanis Ravine Greenspace, Longfellow Creek Greenspace and Westlake Greenbelt acquisition Projects.

Section 2. Funds received pursuant to the Amendment shall be deposited as follows:





**AMENDMENT TO THE CONSERVATION FUTURES
INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN KING COUNTY AND THE CITY OF SEATTLE
FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS**

Preamble

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Levy Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County, the City of Seattle and certain suburban cities. This Amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for open space acquisition.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF SEATTLE and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties on the 5th day of June, 1990, as previously amended.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals

Three paragraphs are hereby added to the Recitals Section to provide for Conservation Futures Levy Fund allocations to the City of Seattle, and hereafter reads:

- “On June 7, 2007, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15815, which appropriated a total of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Seattle for the West Capitol Hill Park acquisition Project. On December 20, 2007, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15989, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into an interlocal agreement with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 15815.”
- “On September 10, 2007, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15898, which appropriated a total of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Seattle for the West Capitol Hill Park acquisition Project. On December 20, 2007, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15989, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 15898.”
- “On November 19, 2007, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15975, which appropriated a total of Two Million, Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$2,975,000), in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Seattle for the University District Urban Center Park, East Capitol Hill Park, Kiwanis Ravine Greenspace, Longfellow Creek Greenspace, Westlake Greenbelt, and



Chinatown/International District Urban Center Park acquisition Projects. On April 7, 2008, the King County Council passed Ordinance 16052, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 15975.”

Amendment 2: Article V. Conditions of Agreement

Section 5.1 is amended to include Attachment W, which lists 2007 Conservation Futures Levy Allocation to the City of Seattle for the West Capitol Hill Park, University District Urban Center Park, East Capitol Hill Park, Kiwanis Ravine Greenspace, Longfellow Creek Greenspace, Westlake Greenbelt, and Chinatown/International District Urban Center Park acquisition Projects.

Amendment 3: Article VII. Responsibilities of County

The first two sentences of this article are amended to include Attachment W, which lists the 2007 Conservation Futures Levy Allocation to the City of Seattle for the West Capitol Hill Park, University District Urban Center Park, East Capitol Hill Park, Kiwanis Ravine Greenspace, Longfellow Creek Greenspace, Westlake Greenbelt, and Chinatown/International District Urban Center Park acquisition Projects, and Article VII hereafter reads:

“Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amounts shown in Attachments A through W to be used for the Projects listed in Attachments A through W. The City may request additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City for the Projects in excess of the total amounts shown in Attachments A through W. The County assumes no obligation for the future support of the Projects described herein except as expressly set forth in this agreement.”

Amendment 4: Attachment W

The attachments to the interlocal agreement are hereby amended by adding Attachment W, which is hereby attached to the interlocal agreement, incorporated therein and made a part thereof.

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties, and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as previously amended.

City of Seattle – 315435 East Capitol Hill Park **\$ 1,400,000**

This Project consists of the acquisition of property at 16th Avenue and East Howell Street in the East Capitol Hill neighborhood, near the 15th Avenue commercial district in Seattle.

City of Seattle – 315436 Kiwanis Ravine Greenspace **\$ 200,000**

This Project consists of acquisition of additional land in Kiwanis Ravine in the Magnolia neighborhood of Seattle, home of a Great Blue Heron colony.

City of Seattle – 315437 Longfellow Creek Greenspace **\$ 300,000**

This Project consists of the acquisition of a wooded inholding property within Seattle's Longfellow Creek Greenspace.

City of Seattle – 315438 Westlake Greenbelt **\$ 275,000**

This Project consists of the acquisition of an inholding in the Westlake Greenbelt, located near 8th Avenue North in the Queen Anne neighborhood of Seattle.

City of Seattle – 315439 Chinatown/Intl. District Urban Center Park **\$ 400,000**

This Project will expand an existing park in the Chinatown/International District area of Seattle's "Downtown Urban Center" on South King Street.

AN ORDINANCE relating to Conservation Futures Levy proceeds; authorizing the Mayor to amend the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Seattle and King County as authorized by City of Seattle Ordinance 114978; and authorizing the deposit of the 2007 allocation from King County Conservation Futures Levy proceeds into the City of Seattle's 2000 Parks Levy Fund.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation authorizes the Mayor to amend the existing Conservation Futures Levy (CFL) Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Seattle (City) and King County, adding seven projects to the list of King County-approved acquisition projects and authorizing reimbursements totaling \$3,575,000 allocated by King County to the City of Seattle (City) in 2007 from proceeds of the Conservation Futures Levy (CFL). The projects include: West Capitol Hill Park, Chinatown/International District Urban Center Park, University District Urban Center Park, East Capitol Hill Park, Kiwanis Ravine Greenspace, Longfellow Creek Greenspace and Westlake Greenbelt. The new amendment is Amendment W.

The CFL is a county-wide property tax collected by King County for the acquisition of open space, agricultural, or timber lands. From 1990 to 1997, King County allocated the CFL proceeds among incorporated and unincorporated areas, based on project applications by local governments, citizen groups, and individual citizens. In 2001, the County re-established the application process for allocating the CFL proceeds. Among the requirements is the provision of at least a fifty percent matching contribution by the applicant.

The 2000 Neighborhood Parks, Green Spaces, Trails, and Zoo Levy (2000 Parks Levy) is the primary source of matching funds for the projects included in the City's 2007 application for CFL proceeds. Ordinance 120024, which authorized the election that approved the 2000 Parks Levy, anticipated that the costs of the 2000 Parks Levy projects might exceed the proceeds. Consequently, the ordinance declared the City's intent "to leverage funds through collaboration with County, State, and federal sources and with private and non-profit organizations, including the Seattle Parks Foundation, through the development of partnerships for purposes of enhancing the projects and programs funded through the levy lid lift."

The CFL reimbursements will be deposited in the 2000 Parks Levy Fund (Fund 33850). Of the \$3,575,000 CFL allocation, \$3,175,000 will reimburse the 2000 Parks Levy Fund for expenditures already made on the basis of previous appropriation authority and \$400,000 will pay for a future expenditure to be made with future appropriation authority (University District).



This legislation does not appropriate any funds because the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) used general appropriation (i.e. appropriation that can be used for the acquisition of any named Pro Parks property within the same Budget Control Level) funds appropriated by Ordinances 121170 (Kiwans Ravine Greenspace - \$200,000), 121660 (Longfellow Creek Greenspace - \$300,000) and 121991 (Westlake Greenbelt - \$275,000). Likewise, the ordinance does not include appropriations for East Capitol Hill Park (\$1,400,000) (appropriated in Ordinance 122426), Chinatown/International District Urban Center Park (\$400,000) (appropriated in Ordinance 122426) or West Capitol Hill Park (\$600,000) (appropriated in Ordinance 122226).

I am transmitting the attached proposed Council Bill, which authorizes an amendment to the existing Conservation Futures Levy (CFL) Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Seattle and King County, and authorizes the City to accept up to \$3,575,000 in CFL proceeds.

King County's annual allocations of CFL proceeds, which are funded by a county-wide property tax dedicated to the acquisition of open space, agricultural property, or timberlands, have been invaluable in helping the City achieve the goals of the 2000 Neighborhood Parks, Green Spaces, Trails, and Zoo Levy (2000 Parks Levy). The 2007 CFL allocation made available by this legislation will be used to help pay for the West Capitol Hill Park, Chinatown/International District Urban Center Park, University District Urban Center Park, East Capitol Hill Urban Center Park, Kiwanis Ravine Greenspace addition, Longfellow Creek Greenspace addition, and Westlake Greenbelt addition. As a CFL recipient, the City is required to provide at least 50 percent in matching funds, for which the primary source is the 2000 Parks Levy.






