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

**Legislation Title:**

AN ORDINANCE accepting funds from the Washington State Department of Commerce allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; authorizing the Mayor or his designee to execute related agreements; amending the 2009 Adopted Budget to increase appropriations for the Office of Housing; and ratifying and confirming prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

• **Summary of the Legislation:**

This legislation authorizes the acceptance of grant funds made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (“ARRA”) and increases the 2009 Adopted Budget to authorize new expenditures.

• **Background:**

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 has allocated \$5 billion to eligible recipients to provide weatherization services for residential buildings. Through the Office of Housing’s HomeWise Program, the City of Seattle provides financial and technical support to low-income households for home weatherization, and to landlords of rental buildings occupied primarily by low-income households. In a regular year, the HomeWise Program receives three federal grants and one state grant, administered by the Washington State Department of Commerce (“Commerce”), as well as City program funding provided by Seattle City Light. The four federal and state grants administered by Commerce are awarded to various state agencies—including the City of Seattle—by an allocation formula. This year, through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the Department of Energy (DOE) has made an additional grant to Commerce, of which \$4,829,369 has been awarded by Commerce to the City based on a formula allocation. These funds will be received over the next two to three years. This DOE award is in addition to the regular weatherization grants awarded by Commerce to the City, which are already included in the Office of Housing’s 2009 Adopted and 2010 Endorsed budgets.

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which accepts up to \$4,829,369 in federal stimulus U.S. Department of Energy Weatherization Assistance Program funds through the Washington State Department of Commerce. The Council Bill also increases appropriations in the Office of Housing Low Income Housing Fund to reflect the anticipated receipt and expenditure of these funds.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 allocated \$5 billion nationally for the Energy Weatherization Assistance Program. Seattle's share of funding, \$4,829,369, was determined by the Washington State Department of Commerce based on a formula allocation. ARRA funding, which will support the City's efforts to deliver weatherization services that primarily benefit low-income persons, is expected to help weatherize over 750 housing units.



#### ORDINANCE NO. 123060

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Department of Transportation's Duwamish Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) project; authorizing the Director of Transportation to acquire and accept, on behalf of the City, permanent and temporary construction easements from the Port of Seattle, located in portions of Lots 14, 15, and 16, Block 426, Seattle Tide Lands, for the purpose of constructing, operating, maintaining, repairing, replacing, modifying, improving, removing, and using the easement areas for use of the conduit for underground electrical transmission and communications lines and Dynamic Message Sign (DMS) pole and base in connection with the Duwamish ITS project; and placing the real property conveyed by such easements under the jurisdiction of the Seattle Department of Transportation.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 123059

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of the City of Seattle's Fleets and Facilities Department to execute a lease agreement between the City and Morningstar Investments, LLC, d/b/a ChewChews, a Washington limited liability company, for the continued operation of a restaurant establishment in the Seattle Municipal Tower.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 123058

AN ORDINANCE relating to Capitol Hill Housing Improvement Program (CHHIP), a public corporation chartered by The City of Seattle, authorizing the Director of the Office of Housing to enter into an agreement with King County, consenting to a request from CHHIP to develop an affordable housing project located in the White Center neighborhood of unincorporated King County, and extending the City's powers, authorities and rights regarding public corporations and authorities beyond the city limits for that project.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 123057
