2 AN ORDINANCE amending budget provisos that restrict spending of an appropriation for a
3 Public Engagement Portal Initiative in the Department of Information Technology's 2009
4 Adopted Budget.

5 WHEREAS, in adopting the 2009 Budget, the City Council passed Green Sheet 133-1-B-1,
6 which included one budget proviso restricting the expenditure of \$175,000 in 2009 that
7 was appropriated to the Department of Information Technology for the Citizen
8 Engagement Portal Initiative (now referred to as the My.Seattle.Gov Public Engagement
9 Portal Initiative), and a second proviso prohibiting the expenditure of such funds until
10 authorized by future ordinance; and

11 WHEREAS, the City Council stated that it would consider lifting the budget proviso prohibiting
12 the expenditure of funds for the Public Engagement Portal Initiative upon receipt of an
13 initial, high-level proposal for how the Initiative will be implemented and how the
14 funding will be spent; and

15 WHEREAS, the Department of Information Technology has submitted an initial, high-level
16 project proposal (Attachment 1) that will provide the same features of single sign on,
17 customizable web page, and surveying tool with a reduced expenditure of \$50,000 in
18 2009; and

19 WHEREAS, the Department of Information Technology has satisfied the direction set forth in
20 the Council's 2009 budget provisos and requests that they be amended to allow the
21 expenditure of \$50,000 for the Public Engagement Portal Initiative; NOW,
22 THEREFORE,

23 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

24 Section 1. The following 2009 budget provisos as adopted by Ordinance 122863 are



Section 2. Any act consistent with the authority of this ordinance taken after passage of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.





14 Attachment 1: My.Seattle.Gov – Public Engagement Portal Initiative High Level Proposal
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My.Seattle.Gov – Public Engagement Portal Initiative High Level Proposal

(as required by proviso in 2009 City Council Budget Action (Green Sheet) 133-1-B-1)

1. The Department of Information Technology's Citywide Web Team (CWT) will, with the cooperation of City departments, develop a Public Engagement Portal, which is a personalized version of Seattle.gov that allows users to select the City web services that are most important to them and display those services in the way they choose.
2. The Public Engagement Portal will be called **My.Seattle.Gov**.
3. Fundamental features of My.Seattle.Gov include Single Sign-On (SSO), which will provide users the ability to log in once to access a wide range of services available on Seattle.gov, and on-line surveying, which will provide a means of receiving public input online and in a cost-effective manner.
4. The CWT will work closely with the Constituent Relationship Management (CRM) system's development team (in the Department of Executive Administration) to ensure that My.Seattle.Gov and CRM are compatible and tightly integrated.
5. Other services proposed to be offered via the My.Seattle.Gov portal:
 - Utility bill payment and billing/use information
 - Payment of taxes and fees
 - Applications and payments for permits, classes, facilities reservations, etc.
 - Customizable access to Seattle.gov informational services like My Neighborhood Map, City Events Calendar, News Releases, Weather, Seattle Channel Video, podcasts & RSS feeds, and others
6. Integrating the My.Seattle.Gov portal with City web applications will, in many cases, require modifications to the existing systems. The CWT expects to launch the initial version My.Seattle.Gov, with selected offering of services, in the second quarter of 2010. Additional services will be added as they are modified to be compatible with the My.Seattle.Gov portal.
7. The amount of Public Engagement Portal funding under proviso is \$175,000 in 2009. Of this, \$125,000 is designated to fund a new IT Professional-A position. The Citywide Web Team's subsequent research indicates that there are several products on the market which will make the development of My.Seattle.Gov less complex and time consuming, without compromising the scope of services proposed. Thus, the Department of Information Technology believes that the additional IT Professional-A position will not be required and requests that Council lift the proviso solely for the remaining \$50,000 for 2009 to be used for software, licensing, project management and consultant services.

This legislation amends the spending restrictions set forth in Green Sheet 133-1-B-1 enacted with the 2009 Adopted Budget.

In adopting the 2009 Budget, the City Council passed Green Sheet 133-1-B-1, which includes two budget provisos related to the \$175,000 appropriated to the Department of Information Technology's (DoIT's) Citizen Engagement Portal, now referred to as the My.Seattle.Gov Public Engagement Portal Initiative. DoIT requests that Council amend the second proviso to allow \$50,000 of the 2009 appropriation to be spent for the project in 2009.

Description of proposed budget action:

This green sheet would transfer \$175,000 in 2009 and \$175,000 in 2010 from the Cable Television Franchise Subfund to the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) operating fund, and increase appropriation authority in DoIT in these same amounts for the Citizen Engagement Portal Initiative. It would also create one full-time Information Technology Professional-A (funded out of the amounts listed above). Finally, this green sheet would impose budget provisos.

The Citizen Engagement Portal Initiative would consist of new online services and tools to improve civic engagement and customer service. It would include an electronic polling system and Single Sign-on (SSO) System, which would allow a constituent to sign-on once to access a variety of City online services.

The funding provided in this green sheet would pay for the first two phases of the initiative – developing an SSO tool and deploying it to selected existing services, and assessing priorities for online access – and also pay for an investigation of tools and costs for polling, issue-customized display, and online access to a variety of informational audio and video services, which could be

implemented in a future phase. The work would be done by DoIT with existing resources and the new position.

The second proviso shown below would allow DoIT to use *existing resources* to develop an initial, high-level proposal, but would not allow DoIT to spend any of the *new* \$175,000 added by this green sheet until authorized by future ordinance.

This green sheet would also impose the following budget provisos:

I am transmitting the attached proposed Council Bill that amends Council provisos restricting an appropriation for the Citizen Engagement Portal (now referred to as the My.Seattle.Gov Customer Service Portal), in the Department of Information Technology's (DoIT's) 2009 Adopted Budget. DoIT briefed the Energy and Technology Committee on this project's status on April 15, 2009.

The My.Seattle.Gov Customer Service Portal will provide a personalized version of Seattle.gov, which will allow customers to select the online City services that are most important to them and display those services in a format that best meets their informational needs. Features of My.Seattle.Gov will include Single Sign-On, which will allow customers to log in once to access a wide range of services available on Seattle.gov; a surveying mechanism, which will allow customers to express their opinions on questions from elected officials and others; and close integration with the new Constituent Relationship Management (CRM) system being developed by the Department of Executive Administration (DEA).



AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Department of Transportation's Duwamish Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) project; authorizing the Director of Transportation to acquire and accept, on behalf of the City, permanent and temporary construction easements from the Port of Seattle, located in portions of Lots 14, 15, and 16, Block 426, Seattle Tide Lands, for the purpose of constructing, operating, maintaining, repairing, replacing, modifying, improving, removing, and using the easement areas for use of the conduit for underground electrical transmission and communications lines and Dynamic Message Sign (DMS) pole and base in connection with the Duwamish ITS project; and placing the real property conveyed by such easements under the jurisdiction of the Seattle Department of Transportation.

ORDINANCE NO. 123058

AN ORDINANCE relating to Capitol Hill Housing Improvement Program (CHHIP), a public corporation chartered by The City of Seattle, authorizing the Director of the Office of Housing to enter into an agreement with King County, consenting to a request from CHHIP to develop an affordable housing project located in the White Center neighborhood of unincorporated King County, and extending the City's powers, authorities and rights regarding public corporations and authorities beyond the city limits for that project.

ORDINANCE NO. 123057

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City's 2009-2012 Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development; authorizing acceptance of grant funds from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for programs included in the City's Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development; increasing appropriations in the 2009 Budget for activities under the Community Development Block Grant Program, the HOME program, and the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS program; and decreasing appropriations for the Emergency Shelter Grant program; adding appropriations for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program; re-adopting the City's 2009-2012 Consolidated Plan originally adopted in Resolution 31087; amending the Neighborhood Notification and Community Relations Guidelines Policy and the Annual Allocation Plan components of the Consolidated Plan; authorizing the use of Housing Levy loan repayments for rent assistance; reallocating unexpended funds from prior years; authorizing other conforming amendments to the Consolidated Plan; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.
