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ORDINANCE 123092

AN ORDINANCE accepting funds from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; authorizing the Mayor or his designee to execute related agreements, amending the 2009 Adopted Budget to increase appropriations for the Police Department, creating new positions in the Police Department including two positions exempt from civil service status, and ratifying and confirming prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has authorized \$50,000,000 for the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force Grant Program as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("ARRA"); and

WHEREAS, the City submitted an application to the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) on April 14, 2009 to request grant funds; and

WHEREAS, based on the City's successful application, the OJJDP has awarded \$848,038 to the City of Seattle from these ICAC Task Force Grant Program funds; and

WHEREAS, the ARRA grant funding constitutes one-time funding for an effective response to cyber enticement and child pornography cases; and

WHEREAS, the City is not obligated to continue or maintain ARRA grant funding levels for the ICAC Task Force Program once ARRA grant funds have lapsed; and

WHEREAS, recipients of ARRA funds from the City should not anticipate the City will assume responsibility for any program costs funded by ARRA once ARRA funds are spent; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to amend the 2009 Adopted Budget for the Police Department to reflect the anticipated receipt and authorize the expenditure of these \$848,038 funds; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Seattle hereby accepts ARRA funds from OJJDP for the ICAC Task Force Grant Program in the amount of Eight Hundred Forty-eight Thousand Thirty-eight Dollars (\$848,038) for the purpose of providing an effective response to cyber enticement and



1 the investigation of child pornography cases. The Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute
2 and deliver and perform for and on behalf of The City of Seattle such agreements and
3 certifications as may be necessary to accept the ARRA funds. ICAC funds, when received, shall
4 be deposited into the Police Department fund named in Section 2. The Mayor or his designee is
5 further authorized to execute and deliver documents relating to the agreements if required by
6 federal guidelines.

8 Section 2. Contingent upon the execution of the agreement(s) authorized in Section 1,
9 and in order to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which insufficient
10 appropriations have been made due to causes that could not reasonably have been foreseen at the
11 time of the making of the 2009 Budget, the appropriations for the following item in the 2009
12 Budget is increased from the funds shown, as follows:

24 following new positions are created in the Seattle Police Department.


The Chief of Police is authorized to fill the Detective position subject to Civil Service personnel rules and laws. The Victim Advocate and Management System Analyst positions shall be exempt from Civil Service and Public Safety Civil Service rules and laws. These positions shall continue until 24 months after the date of hire or transfer into the position.

Section 4. Any act authorized by this ordinance and taken after its passage is ratified and confirmed.




1 Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and

3 days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.



Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE accepting funds from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; authorizing the Mayor or his designee to execute related agreements, amending the 2009 Adopted Budget to increase appropriations for the Police Department, creating new positions in the Police Department including two positions exempt from civil service status, and ratifying and confirming prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

• **Summary of the Legislation:**

This legislation authorizes the acceptance of \$848,038 grant funds made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("ARRA") and increases the 2009 Adopted Budget to authorize new expenditures.

• **Background:**

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 has allocated \$50 million to eligible recipients to provide an effective response to cyber enticement and child pornography through regional Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force programs. Since 2000, Seattle Police has served as the lead agency in the State of Washington and investigated over 2000 ICAC cases.

The award was distributed to the City via a formula allocation. Specific expenditures are as follows:

- SPD will fund 1.0 FTE Victim Advocate, 1.0 FTE Police Officer - Detective and 1.0 FTE Management Systems Analyst.
 - SPD will purchase a mobile forensic van to assist regional law enforcement agencies with collecting forensic evidence and transporting suspects.
 - SPD will provide regional training opportunities to increase the number of trained detectives, which will increase regional investigative capabilities throughout Washington State.
 - SPD will use the funds travel related to ICAC trainings/conferences and task force supplies, which will increase the number of trained ICAC detectives within SPD.

Expenditures will continue in 2010 due to positions being funded beyond one year, the completion of the customization of the van's interior, and additional training sessions.


Dear Council President Conlin:

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which accepts \$848,038 in federal stimulus Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Grant funds through the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. The Council Bill also increases appropriations to reflect the anticipated receipt and expenditure of these funds.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 has allocated \$50 million to law enforcement agencies through a formula allocation process to provide an effective response to cyber enticement and child pornography cases. Funds will be used for salary, benefits, equipment, travel, training and supplies for a 24-month period. Three new positions (one detective, one management system analyst, and one victim advocate) will be created in the Seattle Police Department by this ordinance. There are no matching fund requirements associated with the ICAC grant.

The \$848,038 in ARRA funds accepted by this Bill will support the City's efforts to increase regional investigative capacity, continue public outreach and victim support efforts, increase the number of cases investigated, and enhance the assistance provided to other law enforcement agencies and crime victims.
