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4 AN ORDINANCE accepting funds from the Washington State Department of Commerce  
5 allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; authorizing the  
6 Mayor or his designee to execute related agreements; amending the 2009 Adopted  
7 Budget to increase appropriations for the Department of Parks and Recreation; and  
8 ratifying and confirming certain prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

9 WHEREAS, the United States Congress authorized funding to increase jobs and provide  
10 economic stimulus through Community Services Block Grants as part of the American  
11 Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA); and

12 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle (the City) submitted an application to the Washington State  
13 Department of Commerce on June 12, 2009 to request \$258,583 in Community Services  
14 Block Grant funds; and

15 WHEREAS, based on the City's successful application, the Washington State Department of  
16 Commerce has awarded \$258,583 to the City from these Community Services Block  
17 Grant funds; and

18 WHEREAS, the Seattle Conservation Corps (SCC) is a one-year work experience program for  
19 homeless adults and is part of the City of Seattle's Department of Parks and Recreation;  
20 and

21 WHEREAS, the ARRA grant funding constitutes one-time funding for the SCC to provide new  
22 computers, software and internet access to SCC's learning center; increased rent  
23 assistance to homeless adults; increased program capacity through the funding of unfilled  
24 and unfunded supervisory staff to support an increase in the number of participants after  
25 which capital project funding will be sought to maintain the capacity increase; a  
26 feasibility study on green jobs; and increased training opportunities for SCC staff and  
27 participants in the emerging green jobs arena; and

28 WHEREAS, the SCC chose three areas of investment to meet grant requirements that the  
ARRA funding can be used for: Employment (computer upgrades), Capacity Building  
(new supervisors, feasibility study and green jobs training), and Emergency Services  
(rent assistance); and

WHEREAS, the City is not obligated to continue or maintain ARRA grant funding levels for  
the SCC once ARRA grant funds have lapsed;

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to amend the 2009 Adopted Budget for the Department of  
Parks and Recreation to authorize increased expenditures for the SCC in anticipation of  
reimbursement from ARRA funds; NOW THEREFORE,



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3 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

4           Section 1. The City of Seattle (the City) hereby accepts American Recovery and  
5 Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) funds from the Washington State Department of Commerce  
6 through the Community Services Block Grant in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty-eight  
7 Thousand Five Hundred Eight-three Dollars (\$258,583). These funds will be used by the Seattle  
8 Conservation Corps (SCC). Under the category of "Employment", Twenty Thousand Dollars  
9 (\$20,000) will be used to obtain new computers, software and internet access for the SCC  
10 learning center. Under the category of "Emergency Services", another Thirty Thousand Dollars  
11 (\$30,000) will provide rent assistance to homeless adults participating in the SCC program. The  
12 SCC will use Two Hundred Eight Thousand, Five Hundred and Eighty-three Dollars (\$208,583)  
13 for program "Capacity Building" including a market feasibility study for green areas of growth  
14 appropriate to the SCC program and clients; funds to hire two additional supervisors, that will in  
15 turn allow hiring of 15 participants over the life of the grant; and training in green jobs for staff  
16 and participants in areas indicated as most appropriate by the feasibility study.  
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20           Section 2. On behalf of the City, the Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute,  
21 deliver, and fulfill such agreements and certifications as may be necessary to accept the ARRA  
22 funds. The ARRA funds, when received, shall be deposited into the Department of Parks and  
23 Recreation Operating Fund. The Mayor or his designee is further authorized to execute and  
24 deliver documents relating to the agreements if required by federal guidelines.  
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2 Section 3. Contingent upon the execution of the agreement(s) authorized in Section 2,  
3 and in order to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which insufficient  
4 appropriations have been made due to causes that could not reasonably have been foreseen at the  
5 time of the making of the 2009 Budget, the appropriation for the following item in the 2009  
6 Budget is increased from the fund(s) shown, as follows:

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13 Unspent funds shall carry forward to subsequent years until they are exhausted or abandoned by  
14 ordinance.  
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16 Section 4. Any act authorized by this ordinance and taken after its passage is  
17 ratified and confirmed.  
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

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

**Legislation Title:**

AN ORDINANCE accepting funds from the Washington State Department of Commerce allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; authorizing the Mayor or his designee to execute related agreements; amending the 2009 Adopted Budget to increase appropriations for the Department of Parks and Recreation; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

• **Summary of the Legislation:**

This legislation authorizes the acceptance of grant funds made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (“ARRA”) and increases the 2009 Adopted Budget to authorize new expenditures.

• **Background:**

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 allocated \$258,583 to eligible recipients to provide support for employment-related services and activities that create and sustain economic growth. The City proposes to use the allocation to provide one-time funding for the Seattle Conservation Corps (SCC) to enhance its outreach to homeless adults and increase training opportunities for program participants. The funds will provide new computers, software and internet access to SCC’s learning center; increased rent assistance to homeless adults; program capacity building through the addition of supervisory staff to support an increase in the number of program participants; a feasibility study on green jobs; and increased training opportunities for SCC staff and participants in the emerging green jobs arena. The SCC chose these areas of investment to meet requirements that the ARRA funding be used for activities in three categories: Employment (computer upgrades), Capacity Building (new supervisors, feasibility study and green jobs training), and Emergency Services (rent assistance).

The SCC is a one-year work experience program for homeless adults and is part of the City of Seattle’s Department of Parks and Recreation. SCC, as a Washington State Community Action Agency Partner, received this new ARRA funding as a formula allocation from Community Service Block Grant funding. The SCC application for this funding application was required to cover three categories, Employment, Capacity Building and Emergency Services. In the category of “Employment” SCC will purchase new computers and software to replace the existing outdated equipment and add internet access to its learning center. Under the category of “Emergency Services” SCC will double its ability to provide rent support to program participants. Current funding is inadequate to the need and comes out of program project revenue. This grant will allow SCC to shift project revenue funds to other uses. Under the “Capacity Building” category SCC will hire a consultant to do a feasibility study on green jobs and skills most likely to benefit the SCC business model and make



participants more job ready. SCC will also expand capacity by filling two existing but unfilled and unfunded supervisor positions in order to support an increased number of participants and will expand training opportunities into green areas indicated by the study. Budget cuts have reduced SCC's ability to do on-the-job training as its budget relies almost entirely on project revenue and this opportunity to provide training to staff and program participants will benefit the program in many ways. The ARRA funding will support the City's efforts to provide the services necessary for homeless adults to establish stable homes and consistent employment and will allow SCC to serve more homeless adults and provide increased services and training for SCC participants.

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which accepts \$258,583 in federal stimulus Community Services Block Grant funds allocated through the Washington State Department of Commerce. The Council Bill also increases appropriations to reflect the anticipated receipt and expenditure of these funds.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 allocated \$258,583 to the Seattle Conservation Corps (SCC) through a formula grant allocation process to support employment-related services and activities that create and sustain economic growth. This grant will provide new computers, software, and internet access to SCC's learning center; increased rent assistance to homeless adults; program capacity building by funding supervisory staff to increase client participation; a feasibility study on green jobs; and increased training opportunities for SCC staff and participants in the emerging green jobs arena. The SCC chose these areas of investment to meet requirements that the ARRA grant be used to fund activities in three categories: employment (computer upgrades), program capacity-building (new supervisors, feasibility study and green jobs training), and emergency services (rent assistance).

ARRA funds will support the City's efforts to serve a larger number of homeless adults, provide the services necessary for homeless adults to establish stable homes, and allow SCC to provide increased services and training opportunities for SCC participants.
