ORDINANCE 123098

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3 AN ORDINANCE relating to a grant from the Federal Transit Administration allocated through
4 the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; accepting the grant funds,
5 authorizing the Mayor or his designee to execute related agreements, increasing
6 appropriations for the Seattle Department of Transportation and Seattle Center in the
7 2009 Adopted Budget, including the 2009-14 Capital Improvement Program, and
8 ratifying and confirming prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

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10 WHEREAS, the United States Congress has authorized \$8.4 billion for transit capital
11 improvements as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009
12 (“ARRA”); and

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14 WHEREAS, on March 12, 2009, the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) approved
15 allocations of Transit Capital Assistance Urbanized Areas funds to the City of Seattle in
16 the amounts of Three Hundred Fourteen Thousand Eleven Dollars (\$314,011) for
17 preventive maintenance of the South Lake Union Streetcar, and One Million Dollars
18 (\$1,000,000) for renovation of the Seattle Center Monorail; and

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20 WHEREAS, based on the City’s successful application, the Federal Transit Administration has
21 awarded funds from the Transit Capital Assistance Urbanized Areas program; and

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23 WHEREAS, the ARRA grant funding constitutes one-time funding for South Lake Union
24 Streetcar operations; and

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26 WHEREAS, the City is not obligated to continue or maintain ARRA grant funding levels for the
27 South Lake Union Streetcar operations once ARRA grant funds have lapsed; and

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29 WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to increase appropriations in the 2009 Adopted Budget for
30 the Seattle Department of Transportation and Seattle Center to reflect the anticipated
31 receipt and to authorize the expenditure of these Transit Capital Assistance Urbanized
32 Areas funds; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

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34 Section 1. The City of Seattle hereby accepts ARRA funds from the Federal Transit
35 Administration in the amount of Three Hundred Fourteen Thousand Eleven Dollars (\$314,011)
36 for the purpose of operations of the South Lake Union Streetcar. The Mayor or his designee is



1 authorized to execute and deliver and perform for and on behalf of The City of Seattle such
2 agreements and certifications as may be necessary to accept the ARRA funds. These funds,
3 when received, shall be deposited into the Streetcar Fund (10810). The Mayor or his designee is
4 further authorized to execute and deliver documents relating to the agreements if required by
5 federal guidelines.
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7 Section 2. Contingent upon the execution of the agreement(s) authorized in Section 1,
8 and in order to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which insufficient
9 appropriations have been made due to causes that could not reasonably have been foreseen at the
10 time of the making of the 2009 Budget, the appropriation for the following item in the 2009
11 Budget is increased from the fund shown, as follows:

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20 Section 3. The City of Seattle hereby accepts ARRA funds from the Federal Transit
21 Administration in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for the purpose of renovation
22 of the Seattle Center Monorail. The Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute and deliver
23 and perform for and on behalf of The City of Seattle such agreements and certifications as may
24 be necessary to accept the ARRA funds. These funds, when received, shall be deposited into
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1 the Cumulative Reserve Fund – Unrestricted Subaccount (00164). The Mayor or his designee is
2 further authorized to execute and deliver documents relating to the agreements if required by
3 federal guidelines.

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5 Section 4. Contingent upon the execution of the agreement(s) authorized in Section 3,
6 and in order to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which insufficient
7 appropriations have been made due to causes that could not reasonably have been foreseen at the
8 time of the making of the 2009 Budget, the appropriation for the following item in the 2009
9 Budget is increased from the fund shown, as follows:

20 ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.
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



Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to a grant from the Federal Transit Administration allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; accepting the grant funds, authorizing the Mayor or his designee to execute related agreements, increasing appropriations for the Seattle Department of Transportation and Seattle Center in the 2009 Adopted Budget, including the 2009-14 Capital Improvement Program, and ratifying and confirming prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

• **Summary of the Legislation:**

This legislation authorizes the acceptance of grant funds made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) and increases the 2009 Adopted Budget to authorize new expenditures.

• **Background:**

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 has allocated \$8.4 billion to eligible recipients to provide transit capital improvements. A portion of these funds were allocated to metropolitan areas using FTA's existing Urbanized Area funding formula. Seattle receives a portion of the annual formula funds from the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) each year. These funds are typically used for preventative and major maintenance of the City's transit system. Other than the well-publicized requirements for obligation and spending of funds, the ARRA funds are governed by the same set of requirements as annual federal transit formula grants.

The PSRC received approximately \$136 million in Transit Capital Assistance Urbanized Areas funds. PSRC went through an accelerated regional allocation process to distribute these funds. Seattle is a transit agency due to its ownership of the Seattle Center Monorail and South Lake Union Streetcar. Transit agencies were required to identify existing projects in PSRC's Regional Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) that were "ready-to-go" and were eligible for federal transit capital funding. Seattle submitted 4 projects: Seattle Center Monorail major maintenance, South Lake Union Streetcar preventative maintenance, King Street Station renovation, and Rainier Avenue South Transit Capital Improvements. On March 12, 2009 the PSRC Executive Board approved the PSRC's ARRA project list, which included allocations to Seattle of \$1,000,000 for the Seattle Center Monorail and \$314,011 for the South Lake Union Streetcar. On June 24, 2009 the Administrator of the FTA notified transit agencies that up to 10% of the funds allocated for Transit Capital Assistance could be used for operating assistance.



SDOT has elected to use this option for its Transit Capital Assistance funds for the South Lake Union Streetcar.

The grant award for the Seattle Center Monorail will provide for additional work to be accomplished in the Monorail Deferred Major Maintenance Program, including replacement of the power conductor rails along the guideways. The grant award for the South Lake Union Streetcar will fund operations of the system.

Dear Council President Conlin:

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which accepts \$1,314,011 of Transit Capital Assistance Urbanized Areas funds from the Federal Transit Administration. The Council Bill also increases appropriations to reflect the anticipated receipt and expenditure of these funds.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 allocated \$8.4 billion for transit capital assistance. The Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) received approximately \$136 million of these funds by formula through the Transit Capital Assistance Urbanized Areas program. Seattle was awarded \$1,314,011 through PSRC's accelerated project selection process: \$1,000,000 for renovation of the Seattle Center Monorail and \$314,011 for South Lake Union Streetcar operations.

These ARRA funds will support the City's additional work to be accomplished in the Monorail Deferred Major Maintenance Program, including replacement of the power conductor rails. The grant award for the South Lake Union Streetcar will fund the system's operation.
