ORDINANCE 123111

AN ORDINANCE relating to a loan from the Washington Department of Ecology allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 for the purpose of making water quality improvements in the Ballard combined system basin; accepting the loan funds and authorizing the Seattle Public Utilities' Director or his designee to execute related agreements.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has authorized \$4 billion for the Clean Water State Revolving Funds as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("ARRA"); and

WHEREAS, the City submitted an application to the Washington Department of Ecology; and

WHEREAS, based on the City's successful application, the Ecology has awarded \$1.547 million to the City of Seattle in the form of a low-interest loan (2.9 percent) with 50 percent loan forgiveness; and

WHEREAS, the ARRA grant funding constitutes one-time funding for water quality improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City is not obligated to continue or maintain ARRA grant funding levels once ARRA grant funds have lapsed; NOW, THEREFORE,


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Public Utilities is authorized to accept ARRA funds from Washington Department of Ecology for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund in the amount of \$1.547 million for the purpose of water quality improvements in the Ballard combined system basin. The Director or his designee is authorized to execute and deliver and perform for and on behalf of the City of Seattle such agreements and certifications as may be necessary to accept the ARRA funds. The funds, when received, shall be deposited into the Drainage and Wastewater Fund (44010). The Director or his designee is further authorized to execute and deliver documents relating to the agreements if required by federal guidelines.




1 Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and

3 days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.



Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to a loan from the Washington Department of Ecology allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 for the purpose of making water quality improvements in the Ballard combined system basin; accepting the loan funds and authorizing the Seattle Public Utilities' Director or his designee to execute related agreements.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 allocated \$4 billion nationally to the Clean Water State Revolving Funds for water quality improvement projects. Washington State's Department of Ecology administers the program here for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) applied for several projects out of Washington's allocation and was recently awarded \$1.547 million to build approximately 10 blocks of swales and other natural drainage features for stormwater flow control and water quality improvements. The project is part of SPU's efforts to meet state and federal regulatory requirements governing periodic overflows in the combined sewer system.

In addition to reducing a portion of the combined sewer overflow volumes in the Ballard area, this project will develop the design templates and inform the cost and performance data for bioretention cells in the right-of-way. This information will be used to better evaluate, and provide a higher level of confidence for, the role of this green stormwater infrastructure strategy in achieving Seattle's combined sewer system compliance.

The ARRA award is in the form of a low-interest loan (2.9% interest). Under ARRA's "green infrastructure" provisions, Ecology has elected to forgive 50% of the loan value when the project is completed. The remainder will be repaid with Drainage and Wastewater rate revenue.

SPU expects to have the project under contract by the required date in February 2010.

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which accepts \$1.547 million in federal stimulus funds allocated through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund. Seattle Public Utilities will use the award to control stormwater flows and improve water quality by building approximately 10 blocks of bioretention swales and other natural drainage features in the Ballard combined system basin. 
