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ORDINANCE 123476

AN ORDINANCE related to the transfer of the Seattle Youth Commission from the Department of Neighborhoods to the Mayor's Office, amending Chapter 3.67 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

WHEREAS 18.3 percent of Seattle's population is 19 years old or younger according to the 2006-2008 American Community Survey; and

WHEREAS youth violence, youth unemployment, education challenges and other issues directly affecting youth also adversely affect the quality of life for all citizens of Seattle; and

WHEREAS Ordinance 92729 established the Seattle-King County Youth Commission in 1964 in Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) 3.66 and Ordinance 113260 established the Commission on Children and Youth in 1986 in SMC 3.68; and

WHEREAS neither the Seattle-King County Youth Commission nor the Commission on Children and Youth has been active in the last 15 years; and

WHEREAS the Mayor's Youth Council was established in 2003 to collect input for the Mayor from Seattle youth through meetings, surveys, a retreat and town hall that identified youth concerns and suggestions for addressing those concerns, as well as to train and build youth leadership skills and knowledge of and engagement with city government; and

WHEREAS Ordinance 123251 codified the Mayor's Youth Council as the Seattle Youth Commission, solidifying its place in City government and supporting the joint commitment of the Mayor and City Council to the work of the Commission; and

WHEREAS position authority was added in the City of Seattle 2010 Adopted Budget to the Department of Neighborhoods to provide staff support for this commission; and

WHEREAS public policy experience for Seattle youth will help cultivate the City's future civic, business, and community leaders; and

WHEREAS the voice of youth representing Seattle's various neighborhoods should be heard and reminds the City of its responsibility to future generations; and

WHEREAS due to 2010 mid-year budget reductions, position authority was abrogated in the Department of Neighborhoods; NOW, THEREFORE,



BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 3.67.060 of the Seattle Municipal Code , enacted by Ordinance 123251, is amended, as follows:

3.67.060 Ancillary powers

A. The Commission shall have the power to:

1. Select one member as the presiding officer of the Commission for a term of one (1) year. No person shall serve as presiding officer for more than two years;
2. Organize itself, establish committees or subcommittees and delegate duties for the performance of its work; and
3. Adopt rules of procedure in accordance with the Administrative Code (Chapter 3.02 of the Municipal Code) to accomplish its functions.

B. The ~~((Department of Neighborhoods))~~ Mayor's Office shall provide staff support and meeting facilities for the Commission and maintain its records. The Commission may also receive staff assistance from other City departments.

C. Meetings of the Commission, the minutes of its proceedings and its findings and recommendations shall be open to the public.





Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the transfer of the Seattle Youth Commission from the Department of Neighborhoods to the Mayor's Office, amending Chapter 3.67 of the Seattle Municipal Code

Summary of the Legislation: This legislation transfers the Seattle Youth Commission (referred to here as the "Commission") to the Mayor's Office. The Commission is an advisory body comprised of 25 youth from the 13 neighborhood districts as defined by the District Council system of the Department of Neighborhoods (DON). The Commission informs the Mayor and the City Council on policy matters, that directly affect youth. Commission members serve one-year terms that may be renewed. The Department of Neighborhoods is currently assigned to staff the Commission, and this legislation amends Chapter 3.67 of the Seattle Municipal Code to reflect the transfer of this work to the Mayor's Office.

Background: In 2003, the Mayor's Youth Council (MYC) was established, and the Department of Neighborhoods was designated to provide staff support for the new commission. In 2010, the MYC was subsequently renamed the Seattle Youth Commission, and the Department of Neighborhoods received additional position authority to help support their work with the Commission. However, as part of the 2010 midyear budget reduction process, the Department eliminated this position and transferred the Commission to the Mayor's Office. The Mayor's Office will use existing staff to manage the Commission in 2010 and beyond, and no additional resources are being requested as part of this legislation.

Dear Council President Conlin:

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill for consideration with the 2011 Proposed Budget. This legislation amends Chapter 3.67 of the Seattle Municipal Code to reflect the transfer of staff support for the Seattle Youth Commission from the Department of Neighborhoods to the Mayor's Office.

In 2003, the Seattle Youth Commission was established, and the Department of Neighborhoods was assigned staffing responsibility for the new advisory board. Due to 2010 mid-year budget reductions, the Department abrogated the staff position assigned to the Commission and transferred the associated work to the Mayor's Office. This Bill amends the current Seattle Municipal Code to reflect the transfer of work to the Mayor's Office. This work will be absorbed by existing staff, and no new resources are being requested as part of the legislation.
