ORDINANCE 123603

AN ORDINANCE repealing Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 1.12 to delete provisions related to "Standard Time."

WHEREAS, Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.12.010 defines "Standard Time" but reflects outdated beginning and ending dates for daylight saving time; and

WHEREAS, federal laws and regulations specify that Seattle is in the Pacific time zone and specify beginning and ending dates for daylight saving time, thereby rendering unnecessary a definition of standard time in the Seattle Municipal Code; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 1.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code, last amended by Ordinance 95463 and that currently reads as follows, is repealed:

~~**1.12.010 Standard Time adopted.**~~

~~There is adopted as the Standard Time for the City the mean solar time of the one hundred and twentieth degree of longitude west from Greenwich, time is known and designated as Pacific Standard Time; provided that during the period commencing at two a.m. (2:00 a.m.) Pacific Standard Time of the last Sunday in April of each year and ending at two a.m. (2:00 a.m.) Pacific Standard Time of the last Sunday in October of each year, said Pacific Standard Time shall be advanced by one (1) hour and such time as so advanced shall be the Standard Time of the City during such period.~~

~~**1.12.020 Standard Time to govern.**~~

~~The Standard Time provided for in this chapter shall govern the opening and closing of all City public offices therein; and in all provisions of the Charter and ordinances of the City, and in all orders, rules and regulations pursuant thereto, relating to the time of performance of any act by any~~



1 ~~person or by any officer or official department of the City, or relating to the time within which any~~
2 ~~right shall accrue or determine, or within which any act shall or shall not be performed by any person~~

7 Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the
8 Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take
9 effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

AN ORDINANCE repealing Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 1.12 to delete provisions related to "Standard Time."

Summary of the Legislation:

This legislation repeals the Seattle Municipal Code chapter about time, including the definition of "Standard Time," because it is out of date and not needed.

Background: (Include a brief description of the purpose and context of legislation and include record of previous legislation and funding history, if applicable.)

The existing definition of "Standard Time" in the Seattle Municipal Code dates from 1967 and is outdated, reflecting incorrect beginning and ending dates for daylight saving time. In addition, federal laws and regulations (including 49 CFR 71 and the Energy Policy Act of 2005) specify that Seattle is in the Pacific time zone and specify beginning and ending dates for daylight saving time, thereby rendering unnecessary a definition of standard time in the Seattle Municipal Code.
