ORDINANCE NO. 12366

An Ordinance vacating that part of the alley between Blewett Street and Ewing Street extending easterly from the easterly line of Phinney Avenue to the easterly line of lot eight (8) produced southerly in block forty-two (42), and the easterly line of lot six (6) produced northerly in block forty-one (41) of Denny, and Hoyt's Addition to the City of Seattle.

WHEREAS, The Seattle Electric Company heretofore filed with the City Comptroller and presented to the City Council a petition praying the City Council to make vacation of a certain part of a certain alley as hereinafter in this ordinance described, said petition giving a description of the property to be vacated as hereinafter described and being signed by the cwners of more than two-thirds (2/3) of the private property abutting upon the part of the alley sought to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, after the presentation and filing of said petition the City Council of said City did by resolution fix the tenth day of April, 1905, at the hour of eight o'clock P. M., at the Council Chamber in the City Hall of said City as the time and place when said petition should be heard and determined, said time being not more than sixty (60) days nor less than twenty (20) days after the date of the passage of said resolution; and

WHEREAS, upon the passage of said resolution the City Comptroller duly gave twenty (20) days' notice of the pendency of said petition, in the manner prescribed by law, said notices containing the matters and things prescribed by law therefor; and

WHEREAS said hearing was duly adjoined, to be had at the same place on April 24, 1905, at eight o'clock P. M., and at the time and place to which said hearing was duly adjourned the City Council duly determined to grant said petition and to vacate said part of said alley as described in said petition and hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS all steps and proceedings required by law for the vacation of said part of said alley have been duly taken and carried out;
