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5 AN ORDINANCE accepting the gift of an automated bicycle counter, a display totem, funding
6 for installation of the counter and totem, and a website to share resulting counts with the
7 public, and ratifying and confirming prior acts.

8 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle, through the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT),
9 currently conducts systematic quarterly counts of cyclists to monitor the number of
10 cyclists using the City's transportation network; and

11 WHEREAS, SDOT is seeking to extend the value of its existing quarterly systematic counts of
12 bicycles by collecting data using automated counters at select locations, including the
13 Fremont Bridge, to enable modeling of weekly, monthly, and annual bicycle volumes
14 from existing systematic quarterly count data; and

15 WHEREAS, the Cascade Bicycle Club and the Mark and Susan Torrance Foundation wish to
16 make a gift of a automated continuous bike counter, a display totem, \$8,500 for
17 installation of the counter and totem, and a website to share the resulting counts with the
18 public; and

19 WHEREAS, while the City is open to accepting third party private donations to pay for
20 additional automated bicycle counting equipment contingent on the ability of the City to
21 operate and maintain such equipment; NOW, THEREFORE,

22 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

23 Section 1. The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) Director is authorized to
24 accept the gift of an automated bicycle counter, a display totem, \$8,500 for installation the
25 counter and totem, and a website to display live count data to the general public

26 Section 2. The SDOT Director of Transportation is authorized to install the gifted
27 bicycle counter and display totem on the north approach of the Fremont Bridge to count bicycles
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1 using the pedestrian and bicycle pathways of the Fremont Bridge, and the City of Seattle shall
2 own the counter, display totem, website, and resulting data, and shall maintain these as funds
3 allow.


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5 Section 3. Any act consistent with the authority of this ordinance taken after its passage
6 and prior to its effective date is hereby ratified and confirmed.

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8 Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by
9 the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it
10 shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.





The gift includes a cash gift of \$8,500 to fund the installation of the bicycle counter and display totem. The installation is estimated to cost \$8,500. The gift also includes an in-kind donation of the bicycle counter, display totem and web site, valued at \$23,500 for a total gift of \$32,000.

Dear Council President Clark:

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill that accepts the gift of a bicycle counter and display totem, to be located on the Fremont Bridge.

Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) currently conducts systematic quarterly spot counts of cyclists to monitor the number of cyclists using the city's transportation network. The next step in bringing bicycle data more in line with the data collected on motor vehicles is to collect continual data using automated counters at select locations, such as the Fremont Bridge. This continual data can be used to extend the value of existing spot counts by enabling modeling of weekly, monthly, and annual cyclist volumes, and by providing adjustment factors for variations due to weather.

The Cascade Bicycle Club Educational Foundation in cooperation with the Mark and Susan Torrance Foundation wish to make a gift to the City of Seattle of an automated bike counter and display totem to be located on the north approach to the Fremont Bridge. The counter will count cyclists traveling in both directions across the Fremont Bridge with the totem displaying a running daily volume and a cumulative annual total of cyclists. The gift also includes the construction of a website that will make the same data available remotely over the internet, and funding for installation of the counter and display totem. SDOT will operate and maintain the counter, display totem, and website after installation. SDOT will own the resulting data collected by the counter, which will allow SDOT to improve the quality and quantity of the bicycle volume data it collects.
