COUNCIL BILL 117876

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Opportunity Fund category of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy; accepting the recommendations of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee; authorizing the acquisition of real property commonly known as 48th Ave. SW & SW Charlestown, Baker Park Expansion, and South Park Plaza; authorizing acceptance of the deeds for open space, park, and recreation purposes; amending the 2013 Adopted Budget and 2013-2018 Capital Improvement Program; increasing appropriations in connection thereto; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 122749 authorized a proposition to be submitted to Seattle's voters that would levy for up to six years regular property taxes in excess of the limitation on levies in Chapter 84.55 RCW for the purposes of acquiring, developing, or restoring parks, recreation facilities, cultural facilities, green spaces, playfields, trails, community gardens, and shoreline areas; and

WHEREAS, the proposed 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy (2008 Parks Levy) was approved by Seattle voters on November 4, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 Parks Levy program includes an Opportunity Fund, making available up to \$15,000,000 to fund acquisition and development projects not identified for funding in the remainder of the 2008 Parks Levy program; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 122749 established a Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee (Oversight Committee), with responsibilities to include adopting evaluation criteria and recommending Opportunity Fund awards to the Superintendent, Mayor, and City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Oversight Committee recommended two funding cycles for the Opportunity Fund and has conducted an extensive public process regarding acquisition and development projects to be funded in the first funding cycle; and

WHEREAS, the Oversight Committee recommended the allocation of \$8,000,000 for the Opportunity Fund's second funding cycle; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council express their gratitude to the members of the Oversight Committee for their generous donation of time and expertise in adopting evaluation criteria, soliciting candidate projects, evaluating projects, and making recommendations for funding awards; and



WHEREAS, certain new projects are not presently included in the 2013-2018 Capital Improvement Program; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The development project awards recommended by the Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee, as listed in Attachment 1, are accepted.

Section 2. The acquisitions recommended by the Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee are accepted, except that less than the entire property of each property designated below may be acquired. The Superintendent of Parks and Recreation or the Superintendent's designee is authorized to acquire, for fair market value as determined by appraisal, real property, or any portion thereof, commonly known as: (a) 48th Ave. SW & SW Charlestown, (b) Baker Park Expansion, and (c) South Park Plaza.

The legal descriptions are as follows:

48th Ave. SW & SW Charlestown

Real property in the County of King, State of Washington, described as follows:

Lots 5 through 9, inclusive, Meade Park, according to the Plat thereof recorded in Volume 43 of Plats, page 43, in King County, Washington.

Baker Park Expansion

Real property in the County of King, State of Washington, described as follows:

Section 3. The Superintendent of Parks and Recreation or the Superintendent's designee is authorized to undertake such investigations and to execute such documents as deemed necessary or desirable to accomplish the acquisition of the properties described in Section 2 above and to accept the deeds for the Properties by attaching to the deeds the Superintendent's written acceptance and recording them. The Properties shall be accepted for open space, park, and recreation purposes, and placed under the jurisdiction of the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation.

Section 4. In order to pay for necessary capital costs and expenses incurred, or to be incurred, but for which insufficient appropriations were made due to causes that could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time the 2013 budget was adopted, the appropriation for the following item in the 2013 Adopted Budget is increased from the funds shown, as follows:

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Opportunity Fund category of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy; accepting the recommendations of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee; authorizing the acquisition of real property commonly known as 48th Ave. SW & SW Charlestown , Baker Park Expansion, and South Park Plaza; authorizing acceptance of the deeds for open space, park, and recreation purposes; amending the 2013 Adopted Budget and 2013-2018 Capital Improvement Program; increasing appropriations in connection thereto; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation accepts the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee's recommendations for the second funding cycle of the Opportunity Fund. It increases the Department of Parks and Recreation's 2013 budget appropriation by \$8 million for 11 development projects and three property acquisitions. The Department will work with the City Budget Office to determine how future maintenance costs will be funded during the 2014 budget process.

On November 4, 2008, Seattle voters approved a six-year property tax levy, which included a \$15 million Opportunity Fund. The Opportunity Fund is a designated funding source for acquisition and development projects not identified for funding in the remainder of the 2008 Parks Levy program. The levy established the Oversight Committee to help guide the evaluation of projects and to recommend Opportunity Fund awards to the Superintendent, Mayor, and City Council.

The Oversight Committee recommended two funding cycles for the Opportunity Fund, one in 2011 and the second began in 2012. After an extensive public process over the past year, the Oversight Committee recommends 11 development projects detailed in the attachment to the Ordinance, and 3 acquisitions shown in Attachments A, B, and C.

This legislation appropriates \$8,000,000 and adds 11 development projects to the 2008 Parks Levy-Opportunity Fund program (K720041). Funding required for the development projects is \$6,431,000;

The funding required for the three property acquisitions is \$1,569,000. This amount provides \$400,000 to purchase property in West Seattle at 48th Ave. SW & SW Charleston (Attachment A), and \$500,000 to purchase property in the Northwest Seattle at Baker Park (Attachment B), and \$669,000 to purchase property in South Park (Attachment C). The three property acquisitions have willing sellers and are ready to move forward. This legislation authorizes the acquisition of the three properties and acceptance of the property deeds.

Operation and Maintenance Notes: Implementation of these Levy projects will lead to increased operating costs for DPR. The Levy does not include funding for ongoing costs, and the Department will work with the City Budget Office to determine how future maintenance costs will be funded during the 2015 budget process. The costs per year represent the on-line dates of the various projects. The O&M numbers assume a 2% inflation rate in each successive year.

The development projects will be completed at a rate of approximately four per year (2014-2016) and the amounts shown above are cumulative as additional projects come on line.

The amounts shown above were calculated using the standard departmental operations and maintenance costing methodology. More detailed calculations for projects are available on request. Generally, the approach is to determine staffing levels on the basis of activities that need to be performed (e.g. mowing, tree trimming, litter pick-up), expected frequency, and features of the park (e.g. acreage, location, access, soil conditions, extent of tree canopy). The expected demand for the park (typically a function of location and amenities) is a significant factor as well. These features are typically determined through design reviews, meetings with project managers, and site visits. A complete breakdown of the O&M expenses by project and by year appears in Attachment 1 to the Council Bill.

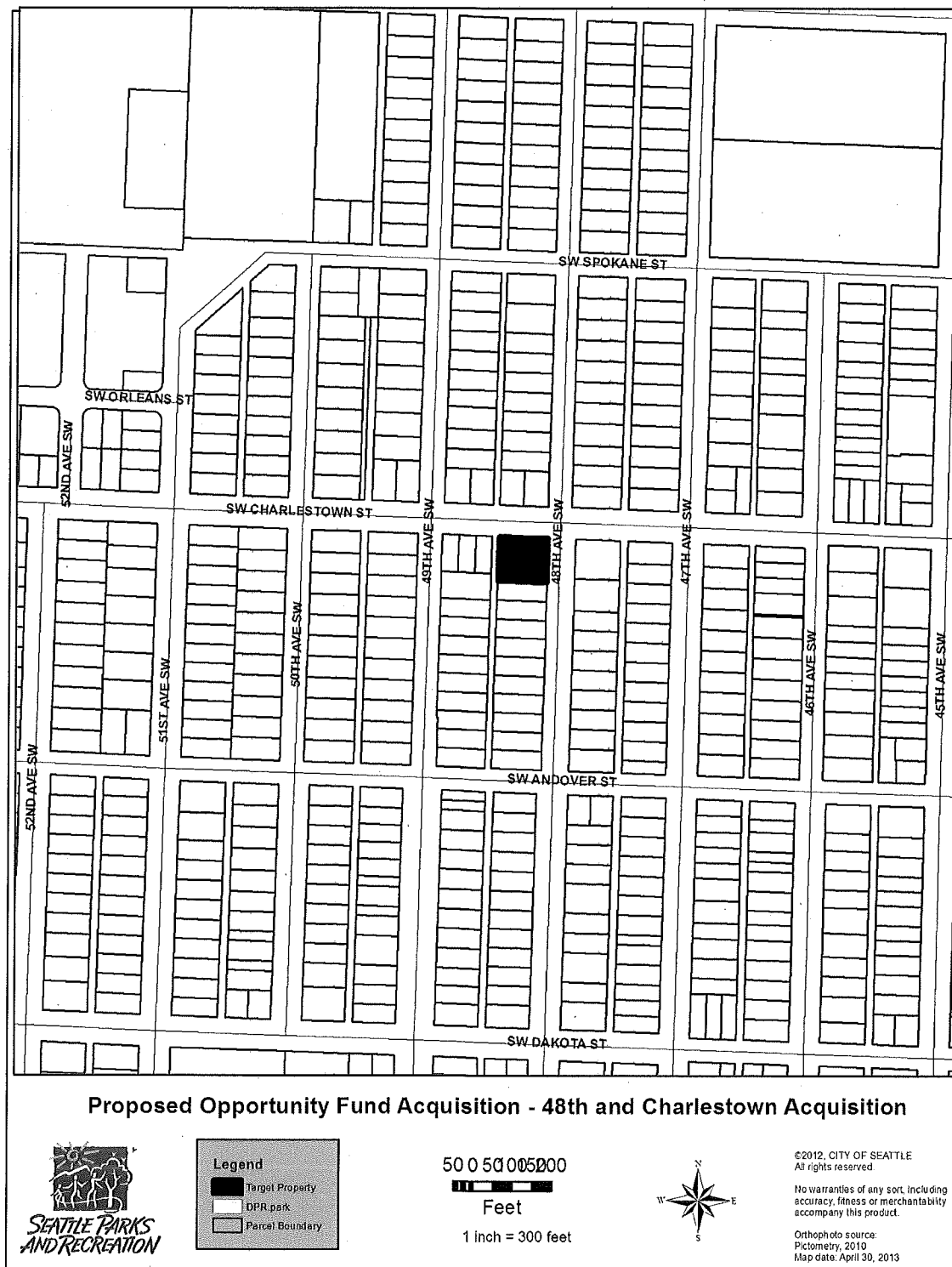

ATTACHMENT A: Map of 48th Ave. SW & SW Charlestown Acquisition

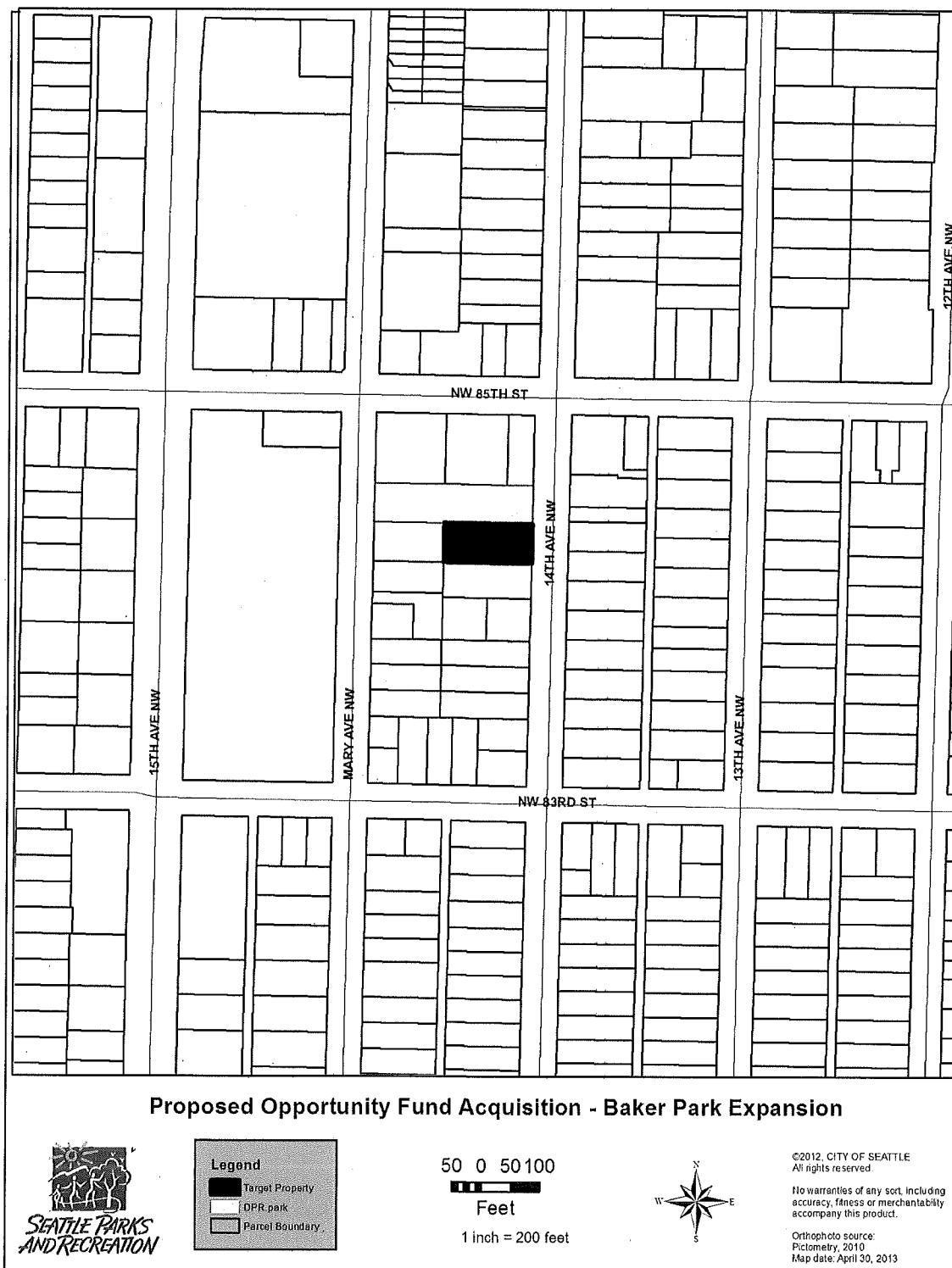

ATTACHMENT B: Map of Baker Park Expansion Acquisition

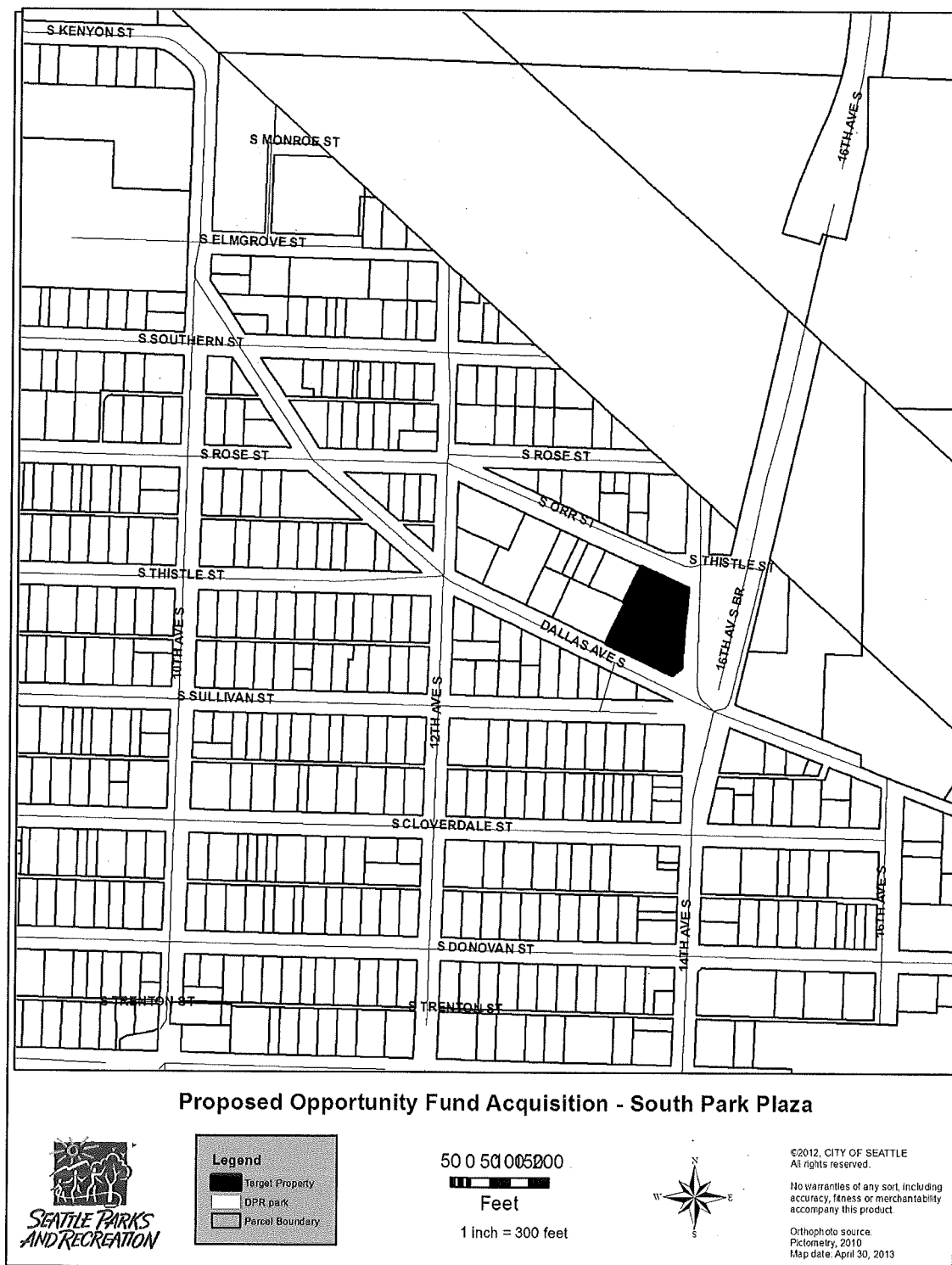

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which appropriates \$8 million for projects selected through the second cycle of the Opportunity Fund category of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy (2008 Parks Levy).

The 2008 Parks Levy includes a \$15 million Opportunity Fund. The first cycle awarded \$6,966,000 for 13 development and two acquisition projects. 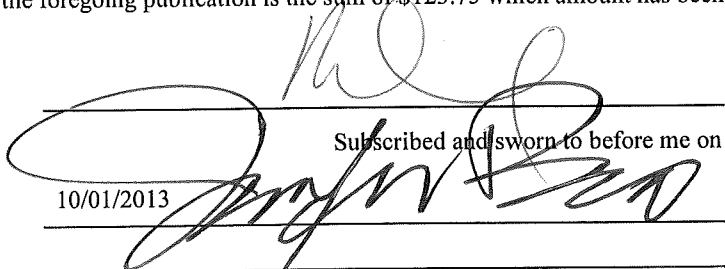
