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AN ORDINANCE relating to the rates, terms and conditions for the use and sale of electricity supplied by the City Light Department, amending Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 21.49 to add a First Avenue South Phase 2 undergrounding charge, applied to all City of Burien rate schedules.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the franchise granted by Ordinance 247 of the City of Burien and accepted by The City of Seattle by Ordinance 119348, the City Light Department provides electric service to customers in the City of Burien; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of that franchise, the City Light Department may recover the capital cost of required undergrounding of its electrical facilities through increased rates to Burien customers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Burien required the City Light Department to underground its electrical facilities in connection with Burien's First Avenue South project; and

WHEREAS, the second phase of that undergrounding was completed in 2013; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 123988, passed September 17, 2012, and codified in Chapter 21.49 of the Seattle Municipal Code, set the rates currently in effect for electric service to customers in the City of Burien; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 21.49.030 of the Seattle Municipal Code, last amended by Ordinance 123988, is amended as follows:

21.49.030 Residential rates (Schedules RSC, RST, RSS, RSH, and RSB).

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

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the rates, terms and conditions for the use and sale of electricity supplied by the City Light Department, amending Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 21.49 to add a First Avenue South Phase 2 undergrounding charge, applied to all City of Burien rate schedules.

Summary of the Legislation:

This ordinance implements a charge to reimburse City Light for the second phase of undergrounding its distribution facilities along First Avenue South within the City of Burien (the First Avenue South 2 undergrounding project). For this purpose, the ordinance adds the charge of \$0.0013 per kWh for City of Burien Standard Residential and Non-Residential customers and \$0.0005 per kWh for City of Burien low-income customers. The charge for undergrounding is equivalent to a rate increase of about 1.6% over current Burien base rates.

Background:

The City of Burien passed Ordinance 247 in 1999, specifying the terms of the agreement under which Seattle City Light would serve the City of Burien; this ordinance was accepted by the City of Seattle by Ordinance 119348 of 1999.

The agreement allows Seattle City Light to recover the capital cost of undergrounding its electrical facilities in accordance with its standard financial practices. The First Avenue South 2 undergrounding project in the City of Burien was completed in 2013. According to Seattle City Light's standard financial practices, City of Burien customers will reimburse City Light over 25 years at five percent interest and that reimbursement will occur in the form of a charge per kilowatt-hour to the customers in the City of Burien. The total capital cost of the First Avenue South project--Phase 2, including taxes, amounts to \$5.6 million.

Other Implications:

a) Does the legislation have indirect financial implications, or long-term implications?

Spreading this reimbursement over 25 years increases the amount that City Light must borrow, thereby increasing its outstanding debt balance and debt service requirements. However, receipt of the reimbursements over the 25 year period will increase cash available for debt service each year, mostly offsetting the increase in debt service but not exactly offsetting it because of the 1.8x coverage requirement and also because of any difference that may exist between the interest rates on debt issued and the 5% interest rate used to amortize the reimbursement over 25 years. City Light's debt to capitalization ratio will also increase, but only by an immaterially small amount.

b) What is the financial cost of not implementing the legislation?

The financial cost to City Light of not implementing the First Avenue South 2 undergrounding charge is that all City Light customers will bear the cost of that project in their rates.

Dear Council President Clark:

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill that amends Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 21.49 to add a charge to rates billed to Seattle City Light customers in the City of Burien that will allow City Light to recover costs associated with Phase 2 of Burien's First Avenue South Improvement Project.

In 2013, City Light completed Phase 2 of the First Avenue South Improvement Project, including all electrical construction work associated with the relocation and undergrounding of distribution infrastructure located on First Avenue South between South 146th Street and South 140th Street. The cost of this project including taxes was \$5.6 million, and per the terms of the Burien franchise agreement, City Light may recover these costs through Burien rates.

With the passage of this ordinance, City Light will add a new charge to all Burien customer rates, effective January 1, 2014. This new charge is designed to collect the total project cost, plus interest, over 25 years. This new charge will add 0.13 cents per kWh to the rates of all standard residential and all non-residential Burien customers, and 0.05 cents per kWh to the rates of residential low-income Burien customers, who pay 40% of standard residential rates. The charge will remain in place until the full amount is collected. The average impact of this charge on Burien customers is a 1.6% rate increase.






