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4 AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; declaring surplus a certain portion of
5 real property in Pend Oreille County owned by The City of Seattle that is no longer
6 required for providing public utility service; and authorizing the sale and conveyance of
7 the surplus property to the Bonneville Power Administration ("BPA") by quit claim deed.

8 WHEREAS, in 2009, BPA needed to expand its Boundary Substation located in Pend Oreille
9 County, Washington in order to meet its obligations under various agreements with
10 Seattle City Light, Pend Oreille County Public Utility District, and others; and

11 WHEREAS, The City of Seattle owns real property parcels immediately east of and adjacent to
12 BPA's substation, totaling approximately 49.54 acres or 2,157,962 square feet; and

13 WHEREAS, BPA offered to purchase, under threat of eminent domain, 0.61 acres of land, or
14 approximately 26,400 square feet, from The City of Seattle in order to expand its
15 substation; and

16 WHEREAS, the fair market value of the surplus property was determined to be \$1,000, which
17 amount BPA had agreed to pay to The City of Seattle; NOW, THEREFORE,

18 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

19 Section 1. Pursuant to RCW 35.94.040 and after public hearing, the following described
20 property (the "Property") is declared to be surplus to the City's needs and no longer required for
21 providing continued public utility service or other municipal purpose:

22 That portion of the South half of Section 10, Township 40 North, Range 43 East, W.M.,
23 Pend Oreille County, Washington, described as follows:

24 Commencing at the Southeast Corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter
25 of said Section 10; Thence North 02°03'13" West, along the North-South centerline of said
26 Section 10, a distance of 769.41 feet to a point on the easterly line of the subject parcel and the
27 True Point of Beginning of this legal description; Thence North 26°40'53" East 93.01 feet to the
28

1 northeast corner of said parcel; Thence north 63°17'31" West 110.00 feet to the northwest corner
2 of said parcel. Said point is in the northeasterly corner of the "Correcting Deed" parcel described
3 in Auditor's file no. 125005, recorded in Book 47 of Deeds, page 645, records of Pend Oreille
4 County, Washington; Thence South 26°40'53" West along the easterly line of said Correcting
5 Deed parcel a distance of 240.00 feet to the southwest corner of said parcel; Thence North
6 63°17'31" East 110.00 feet to the southeast corner of said parcel; Thence north 26°40'53" East
7 along the easterly line of said subject parcel a distance of 146.99 feet to the Point of Beginning.
8 As surveyed and monumented per record of survey recorded March 30, 2009, in Book 8 of
9 Surveys, Page 59, Auditor's file no. 20090300988, records of Pend Oreille County, Washington.

10 Section 2. The General Manager and Chief Executive Officer of City Light or his
11 designee is authorized to execute and deliver a quit claim deed to the Bonneville Power
12 Administration, substantially in the form of Attachment 1 hereto, conveying the Property and
13 reserving to the City a permanent easement right for overhead electric transmission lines, in
14 consideration of the payment of \$1,000.

15 Section 3. The General Manager and Chief Executive Officer of City Light or his
16 designee is further authorized to execute all such other documents as may be deemed necessary
17 or desirable to effectuate the real property conveyance authorized herein.

18 Section 4. Proceeds from the sale of the property shall be deposited into the City Light
19 Fund.


20 Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by
21 the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it
22 shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the sum of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS AND NO/100 - - - (\$1000.00) in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the CITY OF SEATTLE, the Grantor, whether one or more, does hereby conveys and quit claims unto the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, and its assigns, the following described parcel of land in the County of Pend Oreille in the State of Washington, to wit:

BOUN-SS-4 – That part of Record of Survey #2227, recorded March 30, 2009, Book 8, Page 59, Instrument No. 300988, described on Serial #286354-1-0 in Section 10, Township 40 North, Range 43 East, Willamette Meridian, as generally described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

The rights granted herein are subject to easements of record and mineral rights of third parties.

RESERVING to the Grantor the right to cross said land with transmission line conductors, of any voltage. This reservation does not allow for any structures to be located within the substation fencing or on the substation ground mat.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said parcel of land unto the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and its assigns, forever.

Grantor covenants with the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA that the Grantor is lawfully seized and possessed of the said parcels of land in fee and has good and lawful right and power to sell and convey the same.

The lands described herein are acquired for the Bonneville Power Administration.

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; declaring surplus a certain portion of real property in Pend Oreille County owned by The City of Seattle that is no longer required for providing public utility service and authorizing the sale and conveyance of the surplus property to the Bonneville Power Administration (“BPA”) by quit claim deed.

Summary of the Legislation:

This legislation declares certain real property in Pend Oreille County surplus to Seattle City Light’s needs and authorizes the sale of the real property to Bonneville Power Administration.

Background:

The City of Seattle is the owner of certain parcels of real property, Tax Parcel Numbers 434010503000 and 434010500002, in Pend Oreille County, Washington. The parcels total 49.54 acres or 2,157,962 square feet. Bonneville Power Administration (“BPA”) owns Tax Parcel Number 434010503001 in Pend Oreille County, Washington, commonly known as the BPA Boundary Substation.

BPA offered to purchase a piece of City of Seattle’s parcel 434010503000 that is immediately east of and adjacent to BPA’s substation. The piece totals approximately 26,400 square feet, or approximately 0.61 acres. The reason for the purchase is that BPA needed to expand its substation to meet its obligations under various agreements with other utilities. The offer to purchase was made under threat of eminent domain.

The land was valued by BPA appraisers using federal appraisal methods, and the fair market value of the property was determined to be \$1,000. BPA agreed to pay City Light that amount on conveyance of the property. City Light issued a permit to BPA in 2009 to allow BPA to begin construction of its substation expansion, and collected the \$1,000 payment for the property under that permit.



I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill that authorizes Seattle City Light to sell a portion of City of Seattle property to the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) for the expansion of the BPA's Boundary Substation in Pend Oreille County, Washington.






