**COUNCIL BILL** 118103

AN ORDINANCE relating to the 2014 Budget; amending Ordinance 124349, which adopted the 2014 Budget; changing appropriations to various departments and budget control levels due to changes in City employment compensation; and ratifying and confirming prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

WHEREAS, C.B. 118101 authorizes the Mayor to sign a memorandum of understanding between the City of Seattle and labor unions participating in the Coalition of City Unions, which includes a 1.8 percent cost-of-living increase effective January 1, 2014; and

WHEREAS, C.B. 118100 authorizes the same cost-of-living increase to be extended to certain non-represented City employees; and

WHEREAS, C.B. 118102 authorizes adjusting the pay zone structures for the City's discretionary pay programs for the year 2014; and

WHEREAS, an increase in 2014 budget appropriations will provide departments with the budget authority to pay for the increased costs associated with the 2014 cost-of-living and pay zone increases; NOW, THEREFORE,

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. In order to pay for necessary costs and expenses incurred or to be incurred, but for which insufficient appropriations were made due to causes that could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the making the 2014 budget, appropriations for the following items in the 2014 budget are increased from the funds shown, as follows:

**Legislation Title:** AN ORDINANCE relating to the 2014 Budget; amending Ordinance 124349, which adopted the 2014 Budget; changing appropriations to various departments and budget control levels due to changes in City employment compensation; and ratifying and confirming prior acts; all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

**Summary of the Legislation:**

This Council Bill, which amends the 2014 Budget, increases appropriations to pay for the 2014 cost increase to City employment compensation. The increase in cost is a result of the MOU between the City of Seattle and the unions participating in the Coalition of City Unions, which provides for a 1.8 percent cost-of-living increase effective January 1, 2014, as well as the same increase for certain non-represented City employees and increases to the discretionary pay program zones.

**Background:**

This legislation accompanies three Council Bills which increase the 2014 compensation for certain City employees. This legislation increases budget appropriation authority for cost increases as a result of the three following Council Bills:

C.B. 118101 authorizes the Mayor to sign a memorandum of understanding (“MOU”) between the City of Seattle and labor unions participating in the Coalition of City Unions (“Coalition”). The MOU is a one year agreement to wages, benefits, hours and other working conditions between the City and the Coalition (collectively, “the parties”).

The MOU provides for a 1.8 percent cost-of-living increase, which is based on 100 percent of the annual average growth rate of the bi-monthly Seattle-Tacoma-Bremerton Area Consumer price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) for the period August 2011 through June of 2012 to the period August 2012 through June of 2013.

C.B. 118100 authorizes the same cost-of-living increase that was tentatively agreed to between the City and Coalition to also be extended to certain non-represented City employees.

Historically, the City has provided the same wage increases, benefits and other conditions of employment to non-represented City employees as to Coalition members. The purpose of this legislation is to establish the same timeline for the 2014 cost of living increase to non-represented employees as to employees represented by the Coalition. The City entered into

negotiations with the Coalition in the fall of 2013 and came to a tentative agreement in March of 2014.

Finally, C.B. 118102, the 2014 Pay Zone Ordinance, authorizes changes to various pay programs, collectively known as discretionary pay programs, and provides for annual or biennial review of the salary structures in order to remain competitive in the labor market.





