COUNCIL BILL 118251

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2014, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Executive Department and the Seattle Fire Department, to accept specified grants and private funding and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Fire Chief are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below, and to execute, deliver, and perform on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving fund identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as C.B. 118252.

	<p>This item accepts funding in the amount of \$50,000 in the Arts Account BCL from the National Endowment for the Arts. This NEA Our Town grant will support the creation of the Cultural Space Toolkit, a series of Creative Placemaking efforts to support cultural districts in Seattle. The toolkit will provide visioning and implementation strategies to guide neighborhood wayfinding, pop-up space activations, neighborhood cultural plans, and other efforts to benefit artists and arts organizations. This is a matching grant, and the match with City funding is already included in the department's adopted budget (Cultural Facilities funding program). The grant period is September 2014 through December 2015.</p>	
1.2	Grant Funding for the Bio Watch Project (Seattle Fire Department, General Subfund (00100))	\$540,700
	<p>This item accepts funding in the amount of \$540,700 in the Grants and Reimbursables BCL (F6000) from the Department of Homeland Security and Federal Emergency Management Administration. This is a continuation grant for the Bio Watch project which has thirteen air collection sites and is tasked with performing daily air monitoring for the early detection of bio-toxins that would otherwise not be detected until the outbreak of symptoms following the natural incubation period of the toxin. The period of performance for this grant is one year starting on July 1, 2014, and requires no local match. Without this grant, the Fire Department would not be able to perform these monitoring services. No positions are supported by this grant.</p>	
1.3	Reimbursement for Oso Response (Seattle Fire Department, General Subfund (00100))	\$786,255
	<p>This item accepts funding in the amount of \$786,255 in the Grants and Reimbursables BCL (F6000) to reflect reimbursement from Pierce County for the deployment of 35 Seattle firefighters for 21 days to the Oso landslide emergency earlier this year. This reimbursement has been received from the Pierce County Department of Emergency Management, which operates the regional Urban Search and Rescue Team (USAR). The Seattle firefighters deployed to Oso are members of the regional USAR team. This reimbursement reflects the majority of SFD's expenses for the Oso landslide response, with two other reimbursements still pending.</p>

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which accepts grants and private funds from various agencies and organizations. Corresponding appropriations for items in this Bill are included in the City Budget Office's 2014 Third Quarter Supplemental Ordinance, which is being transmitted to the Council under separate cover.

This Bill accepts three grants or private funds totaling \$1,376,955 on behalf of two City departments:

Office of Arts and Culture: One grant for \$50,000 from the National Endowment for the Arts, which will go to support the creation of a cultural space toolkit to support cultural districts in Seattle.

Seattle Fire Department: One reimbursement of \$786,255 from Pierce County for the deployment of 35 Seattle firefighters for 21 days to the Oso landslide emergency earlier this year, and a grant of \$540,700 from the Department of Homeland Security to support the Bio Watch project.
