1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Finance and Administrative Services, declaring the vacant property located at 10610 55th Ave. S. as surplus to the City's needs; authorizing the sale of said property; authorizing the Director of Finance and Administrative Services to execute all documents for the sale and transfer of the property; and directing how proceeds from the sale shall be distributed.

Summary and background of the Legislation: The proposed legislation declares the vacant property located at 10610 55th Ave. S. as surplus to the needs of the City. The Director of Finance and Administrative Services will be authorized to sell the property to Jacqueline A. Murray and Virginia R. Dunning, who are owners of the adjacent property, and to carry out any necessary negotiations and execute all documents to complete the transaction.

The property was acquired by the City of Seattle in 1979 as a result of a public sale of the real property to pay for a local improvement assessment. The parcel is not large enough for separate development. Following the Procedures for the Evaluation of the Reuse and Disposal of the City's Real Property (as amended by Resolution 30862), the Department of Finance and Administrative Services (FAS) circulated a notice of the availability of the property to other City departments and government agencies. No proposed uses were put forward by other City departments and government agencies. This property being 1,000 square feet in size is exempt from a public notice under the procedures.

The property is located adjacent to properties that are under separate ownership. FAS offered the property to the adjoining property owners through a competitive process. The property is subject to a driveway easement that serves the property owned by Jacqueline A. Murray and Virginia R. Dunning, who are one of the adjoining property owners. Murray and Dunning have offered to purchase the property at the estimated fair market value of \$5,000.


