1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to historic preservation; imposing controls upon The Theodora, a landmark designated by the Landmarks Preservation Board under Chapter 25.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code, and adding it to the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in Chapter 25.32 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Summary and background of the Legislation: The attached legislation acknowledges the designation of The Theodora as a historic landmark by the Landmarks Preservation Board, imposes controls, grants incentives, and adds The Theodora to the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in SMC Chapter 25.32. The legislation does not have a financial impact.

The Theodora was built in 1965 and is located in the Ravenna neighborhood. A Controls and Incentives Agreement has been signed by the owner and has been approved by the Landmarks Preservation Board. The controls in the agreement apply to the site, the exterior of the building, and the first floor interior court, library, dining room, lounge and fireplace, but do not apply to any in–kind maintenance or repairs of the designated features.

2. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

This legislation creates, funds, or amends a CIP Project.

3. SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS
