Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2016, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Executive Department, Department of Parks and Recreation, Human Services Department, Seattle Fire Department, Seattle Police Department, Legislative Department, and Seattle Public Utilities to accept specified grants and private funding and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This Council Bill, which is the first quarterly grant acceptance in 2016 proposes the acceptance of 13 grants and/or private funds or donations from various agencies and organizations.

During the course of a year, City departments receive grant awards or opportunities for other funding resources that are not anticipated in the Adopted Budget. The City Budget Office formally accepts these funds by compiling departmental grants acceptances and similar agreements into four separate ordinances in the first, second, third, and fourth quarter of the year. The attached ordinance contains grant-related requests received during the second quarter of 2016.
