ORDINANCE 125742

COUNCIL BILL 119414

AN ORDINANCE relating to historic preservation; imposing controls upon the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House, a landmark designated by the Landmarks Preservation Board under Chapter 25.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code, and adding it to the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in Chapter 25.32 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

WHEREAS, the Landmarks Preservation Ordinance, Chapter 25.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code (SMC), establishes a procedure for the designation and preservation of sites, improvements, and objects having historical, cultural, architectural, engineering, or geographic significance; and

WHEREAS, the Landmarks Preservation Board ("Board"), after a public meeting on March 7, 2018, voted to approve the nomination of the improvement located at 3655 Walla Walla Road NE and a portion of the site on which the improvement is located (which are collectively referred to as the "University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House") for designation as a landmark under SMC Chapter 25.12; and

WHEREAS, after a public meeting on April 18, 2018, the Board voted to approve the designation of the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House under SMC Chapter 25.12; and

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2018, the Board and the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House's owner agreed to controls and incentives to be applied to specific features or characteristics of the designated landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Board recommends that the City Council enact a designating ordinance approving the controls and incentives; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Designation. Under Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) 25.12.660, the designation by the Landmarks Preservation Board (“Board”) of the improvement located at 3655 Walla Walla Road NE and a portion of the site on which the improvement is located (which are collectively referred to as the “University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House”) is acknowledged.

A. Legal Description. The University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House is located on the property legally described as:

Those portions of Government Lots 4 and 5 lying east of Montlake Blvd. NE; that portion of Block 8, Lake Washington Shorelands south of the east-west extension of Canal Road and east of Montlake Blvd NE; and the shorelands thereof; all in Section 16, T25N, R4E, W.M. and subject to right of way for Lake Washington Ship Canal. Portion of Tax Parcel No. 162504-9001.

B. Specific Features or Characteristics Designated. Under SMC 25.12.660.A.2, the Board designated the following specific features or characteristics of the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House:

1. The exterior of the building.
2. The interior building volume and roof trusswork.
3. A portion of the site around the building perimeter measured twenty feet out from the base of the building.

C. Basis of Designation. The designation was made because the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House is more than 25 years old; has significant character, interest, or value as a part of the development, heritage, or cultural characteristics of the City, state, or nation; has integrity or the ability to convey its significance; and satisfies the following SMC 25.12.350 provisions:

1 1. It is the location of, or is associated in a significant way with, an historic
2 event with a significant effect upon the community, City, state, or nation (SMC 25.12.350.A).

3 2. It is associated in a significant way with the life of a person important in
4 the history of the City, state, or nation (SMC 25.12.350.B).

5 3. It is associated in a significant way with a significant aspect of the
6 cultural, political, or economic heritage of the community, City, state, or nation (SMC
7 25.12.350.C).

8 4. It embodies the distinctive visible characteristics of an architectural style,
9 or period, or of a method of construction (SMC 25.12.350.D).

10 5. Because of its prominence of spatial location, contrasts of siting, age, or
11 scale, it is an easily identifiable visual feature of its neighborhood or the City and contributes to
12 the distinctive quality or identity of such neighborhood or the City (SMC 25.12.350.F).

13 Section 2. Controls. The following controls are imposed on the features or characteristics
14 of the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House that were designated by the
15 Board for preservation:

16 A. Certificate of Approval Process.

17 1. Except as provided in subsection 2.A.2 or subsection 2.B of this
18 ordinance, the owner must obtain a Certificate of Approval issued by the Board according to
19 SMC Chapter 25.12, or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval must have expired, before
20 the owner may make alterations or significant changes to the features or characteristics of the
21 University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House that were designated by the Board
22 for preservation.

23 2. No Certificate of Approval is required for the following:

a. Any in-kind maintenance or repairs of the features or characteristics of the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House that were designated by the Board for preservation.

b. Removal of the following landscape elements: trees less than 8 inches in diameter measured 4 ½ feet above ground; shrubs; perennials; and annuals.

c. Removal of non-native plants of any size. This does not apply to trees.

d. Installation, removal or alteration (including repair) of underground irrigation and underground utilities, provided that the site is restored in kind.

e. Installation, removal, or alteration of the following site furnishings: benches, movable planters, trash / recycling receptacles, and bike racks.

f. Installation and removal of temporary artwork and signage; and the following temporary items associated with special events held by an on-site organization: tents, site furnishings, lighting, tables, chairs, vendor booths/carts, and barricades. Such installations shall be considered temporary if they:

1) Can be removed without changing the building or site and without requiring repair; and

2) Remain in place for no more than 60 days.

g. Restriping of asphalt paving in the existing parking area.

h. Installation, removal, or alteration of curbs or wheelstops in the existing parking area.

i. Installation, removal, or alteration of signage for accessibility compliance; and other signage as required by City code.

j. Installation, removal, or alteration of University of Washington
signage including the following:

1) One free-standing double-sided building identification sign
defined by the following criteria:

a) Two painted aluminum panels mounted between
end posts.

b) Maximum overall panel size to be 48 inches wide
by 24 inches high, with the top of the sign panel and posts no more than 44 inches high,
measured above grade.

c) Sign content may include the university logo,
building name(s), and building use.

d) Approved University of Washington wayfinding
paint colors.

e) Black bolts.

f) Sign location will not obscure architectural features.

2) One building identification sign defined by the following
criteria:

a) Sign mounted on the exterior wall of the building at
the main point of entry or main point of arrival to the facility.

b) A painted aluminum panel 30 inches wide by 14
inches high, maximum.

c) Attached in a manner that is easily repairable.

d) The height of the top of the sign may be no more than 8 feet above grade.

e) Sign location will not obscure architectural features.

3) One sign to display building identification number or street address number, as required by the City of Seattle Fire Department, and defined by the following criteria:

a) A painted aluminum panel 12 inches wide by 6 inches high, maximum.

b) Attached in a manner that is easily repairable.

c) The height of the top of the sign may be no more than 8 feet above grade.

d) Sign location will not obscure architectural features.

k. Installation or removal of interior, temporary window shading devices that are operable and therefore do not obscure the glazing when in the open position.

l. Alterations to or removal of the existing mezzanine on the north side of the building, and the ground-level storage room along the west side of the building.

B. City Historic Preservation Officer (CHPO) Approval Process.

1. The City Historic Preservation Officer may review and approve alterations or significant changes to the features or characteristics listed in subsection 2.B.3 of this ordinance according to the following procedure:

a. The owner shall submit to the CHPO a written request for the alterations or significant changes, including applicable drawings or specifications.

1 b. If the CHPO, upon examination of submitted plans and
2 specifications, determines that the alterations or significant changes are consistent with the
3 purposes of SMC Chapter 25.12, the CHPO shall approve the alterations or significant changes
4 without further action by the Board.

5 2. If the CHPO does not approve the alterations or significant changes, the
6 owner may submit revised materials to the CHPO, or apply to the Board for a Certificate of
7 Approval under SMC Chapter 25.12. The CHPO shall transmit a written decision on the owner's
8 request to the owner within 14 days of receipt of the request. Failure of the CHPO to timely
9 transmit a written decision constitutes approval of the request.

10 3. CHPO approval of alterations or significant changes to the features or
11 characteristics of the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House that were
12 designated by the Board for preservation is available for the following:

13 a. The installation, alteration, or removal of ducts, conduits, HVAC
14 vents, grills, pipes, and other similar wiring or mechanical elements necessary for the normal
15 operation of the building and site.

16 b. Installation, removal, or alterations of exterior light fixtures,
17 exterior security lighting, and security system equipment.

18 c. Removal of trees more than 8 inches in diameter measured 4 ½
19 feet above ground, identified as a hazard by an International Society of Arboriculture (ISA)
20 Certified Arborist.

21 d. Signage other than signage excluded in subsections 2.A.2.f,
22 2.A.2.i, and 2.A.2.j of this ordinance.

e. Installation of improvements for security, safety or accessibility compliance.

f. Installation of fire and life safety equipment.

g. Artwork other than temporary artwork excluded in subsection 2.A.2.f of this ordinance.

h. Changes to paint colors for any of the areas or features listed in subsection 1.B of this ordinance.

i. Installation of a waterfront trail, as adopted in the UW Campus Master Plan.

Section 3. Incentives. The following incentives are granted on the features or characteristics of the University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House that were designated by the Board for preservation:

A. Uses not otherwise permitted in a zone may be authorized in a designated landmark by means of an administrative conditional use permit issued under SMC Title 23.

B. Exceptions to certain of the requirements of the Seattle Building Code, adopted by SMC Chapter 22.100, and the Seattle Energy Code, adopted by SMC Chapter 22.700, may be authorized according to the applicable provisions.

C. Special tax valuation for historic preservation may be available under chapter 84.26 RCW upon application and compliance with the requirements of that statute.

D. Reduction or waiver, under certain conditions, of minimum accessory off-street parking requirements for uses permitted in a designated landmark structure may be permitted under SMC Title 23.

1 Section 4. Enforcement of this ordinance and penalties for its violation are as provided in
2 SMC 25.12.910.

3 Section 5. The University of Washington Canoe House/ASUW Shell House is added
4 alphabetically to Section II, Buildings, of the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in SMC
5 Chapter 25.32.

6 Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to record a certified copy of this ordinance with the
7 King County Recorder's Office, deliver two certified copies to the CHPO, and deliver one copy
8 to the Director of the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections. The CHPO is directed
9 to provide a certified copy of this ordinance to the University of Washington Canoe
10 House/ASUW Shell House's owner.

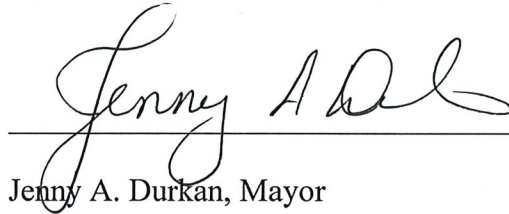
Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
