	Sarah Sodt DON Seattle Tower Landmark Designation ORD D1b
1	Third Avenue (referred to as the "Seattle Tower" for the purposes of this ordinance) is hereby
2	acknowledged.
3	A. <u>Legal Description</u> . The Seattle Tower is located on the property legally described
4	as:
5 6 7 8	Lots 1 and 2, of the Replat of Block 4 in the plat of the addition to the City of Seattle, as laid out by A.A. Denny (commonly known as the replat of Block 4 of the A.A. Denny's 2nd Addition to the City of Seattle), according to the plat recorded in Volume 8 of Plats, Page 86, records of King County, Washington;
9 10 11	Except the westerly 9 feet thereof heretofore condemned in King County Superior Court Cause No. 54133 for widening of Third Avenue, as provided by Ordinance No. 14345 of the City of Seattle.
12	B. <u>Specific Features or Characteristics Designated</u> . Pursuant to SMC 25.12.660.A.2,
13	the Board designated the following specific features or characteristics of the Seattle Tower:
14	1. The exterior of the building.
15	2. The Third Avenue Lobby.
16	C. <u>Basis of Designation</u> . The designation was made because the Seattle Tower is
17	more than 25 years old; has significant character, interest, or value as a part of the development,
18	heritage, or cultural characteristics of the City, state, or nation; has integrity or the ability to
19	convey its significance; and satisfies the following from SMC 25.12.350:
20	1. It embodies the distinctive visible characteristics of an architectural style,
21	or period, or of a method of construction (SMC 25.12.350.D).
22	2. It is an outstanding work of a designer or builder (SMC 25.12.350.E).
23	Section 2. <u>CONTROLS</u> : The following controls are hereby imposed on the features or
24	characteristics of the Seattle Tower that were designated by the Board for preservation:

A. <u>Certificate of Approval Process</u>.

- 1. Except as provided in subsection 2.A.2 or subsection 2.B of this ordinance, the owner must obtain a Certificate of Approval issued by the Board pursuant to SMC Chapter 25.12, or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval must have expired, before the owner may make alterations or significant changes to the features or characteristics of the Seattle Tower that were designated by the Board for preservation.
- 2. No Certificate of Approval is required for the following: any in-kind maintenance or repairs of the features or characteristics of the Seattle Tower that were designated by the Board for preservation.

B. <u>City Historic Preservation Officer Approval Process.</u>

- 1. The City Historic Preservation Officer (CHPO) may review and approve alterations or significant changes to the features or characteristics listed in subsection 2.B.3 of this ordinance according to the following procedure:
- a. The owner shall submit to the CHPO a written request for the alterations or significant changes, including applicable drawings or specifications.
- b. If the CHPO, upon examination of submitted plans and specifications, determines that the alterations or significant changes are consistent with the purposes of SMC Chapter 25.12, the CHPO shall approve the alterations or significant changes without further action by the Board.
- 2. If the CHPO does not approve the alterations or significant changes, the owner may submit revised materials to the CHPO, or apply to the Board for a Certificate of Approval under SMC Chapter 25.12. The CHPO shall transmit a written decision on the owner's

- j. The alteration or replacement of non-original windows and exterior doors, and railings at the sixth-floor patio decks.
- k. The alteration or replacement of non-original windows and exterior doors, and railings of upper level balconies.
- l. The installation, alteration, or removal of the drapery or curtain behind the security desk in the lobby, if not attached to historic building materials.
- Section 3. <u>INCENTIVES</u>: The following incentives are hereby granted on the features or characteristics of the Seattle Tower that were designated by the Board for preservation:
- A. Uses not otherwise permitted in a zone may be authorized in a designated landmark by means of an administrative conditional use permit issued pursuant to Seattle Municipal Code Title 23.
- B. Special tax valuation for historic preservation may be available under chapter 84.26 RCW upon application and compliance with the requirements of that statute.
- C. Exceptions to certain requirements of the Seattle Building Code, SMC Chapter 22.100, and the Seattle Energy Code, SMC Chapter 22.700, may be authorized pursuant to the applicable provisions thereof.
- D. The owner may be eligible to participate in the City's Landmark Transfer of Development Rights (TDR) Bank after obtaining a determination from the City concerning the quantity of unused development rights for the Seattle Tower that are eligible for transfer to receiving properties as Landmark TDR, pursuant to SMC 23.49.014.
- Section 4. Enforcement of this ordinance and penalties for its violation are as provided in SMC 25.12.910.

Section 5. The Seattle Tower is hereby added alphabetically to Section II, Buildings, of the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in SMC Chapter 25.32.

Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to record a certified copy of this ordinance with the King County Recorder's Office, deliver two certified copies to the CHPO, and deliver one copy to the Director of the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections. The CHPO is directed to provide a certified copy of this ordinance to the owner of the landmark.

3	shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to historic preservation; imposing controls upon the Seattle Tower, a landmark designated by the Landmarks Preservation Board under Chapter 25.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code, and adding it to the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in Chapter 25.32 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

The attached legislation acknowledges the designation of the Seattle Tower as a historic landmark by the Landmarks Preservation Board, imposes controls, grants incentives, and adds the Seattle Tower to the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in SMC Chapter 25.32. The legislation does not have a financial impact.

The Seattle Tower was built in 1928 and is located in Downtown. A Controls and Incentives Agreement has been signed by the owner and has been approved by the Landmarks Preservation Board. The controls in the agreement apply to the exterior of the building, and the interior of the Third Avenue Lobby, but do not apply to any in-kind maintenance or repairs of the designated features.
