ORDINANCE NO. 16636

REPEALED

AN ORDINANCE designating a portion of "Pike Place" in the City of Seattle as a place for the sale of garden, farm and other food products from wagons, or other similar vehicles, under certain conditions.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the west side of "Pike Place" in the City of Seattle, from a point ninety-two (92) feet north of the north line of Pike Street produced west to the south line of Pine Street, be and the same is hereby designated as a place where garden, farm and other food products may be sold from wagons and other similar vehicles, from five o'clock A. M. to twelve o'clock noon of each day, except Sunday.

Section 2. That the provisions and requirements of the license ordinances of the City of Seattle as to the payment of license fees, be and the same are hereby waived for the benefit of all persons selling food products under the provisions of this ordinance at the place herein designated.

Section 3. That all persons selling food products at the place herein provided, shall be under the supervision of and subject to the control of the Street Department of the City of Seattle.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
