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ORDINANCE NO. 16689

AN ORDINANCE vacating certain portions of Burke Avenue, Northlake Avenue and North Twenty-ninth Street on the petition of the Seattle Lighting Company.

Whereas, there has been filed with the City Council the petition of the Seattle Lighting Company (File No. 31997), praying for the vacation of certain portions of Burke Avenue, Northlake Avenue and North Twenty-ninth Street; said petitioners being the owners of more than two-thirds of the private property abutting on the portions of said streets and avenues sought to be vacated; and

Whereas, due notice of the time and place of the hearing on said petition has been given in the manner provided by law; and

Whereas, said petition was duly granted by the City Council on the 3rd day of June, 1907;

Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That that portion of Burke Avenue lying south of the south line of North Thirtieth Street and north of the center line of North Twenty-ninth Street, said portion of said streets lying between blocks three (3) and four (4) of Burke's First Addition to the City of Seattle; also that portion of Northlake Avenue lying south of the

south line of North 30th Street and north of the center line of North 29th Street, said portion of said streets lying between Blocks 4 and 11 of said Burke's First Addition, also that portion of the public street known as North 29th Street, lying east of the east line of Wallingford Avenue and west of the west line of Burke Avenue, said described portion of said street lying between Blocks 3 and 6 of said Burke's First Addition, be and the same hereby are vacated.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.

AN ORDINANCE vacating certain portions of Burke Avenue, Northlake Avenue and North Twenty-ninth Street on the petition of the Seattle Lighting Company.
Whereas, there has been filed with the City Council (the petition of the Seattle Lighting Company (File No. 31987), praying for the vacation of certain portions of Burke Avenue, Northlake Avenue and North Twenty-ninth Street; said petitioners being the owners of more than two-thirds of the private property abutting on the portions of said avenue and streets sought to be vacated; and
Whereas, due notice of the time and place of the hearing on said petition has been given in the manner provided by law; and
Whereas, said petition was duly granted by the City Council on the 31st day of June, 1907.
Now, therefore, be it ordained by the City of Seattle as follows:
Section 1. That that portion of Burke Avenue lying south of the center line of North Thirtieth Street and north of the center line of North Twenty-ninth Street, said portion of said streets lying between blocks three (3) and four (4) of Burke's First Addition to the City of Seattle; also that portion of Northlake Avenue lying south of the south line of North 30th Street and north of the center line of North 29th Street, said portion of said streets lying between blocks 4 and 11 of said Burke's First Addition; also that portion of the public streets known as North 29th Street lying east of the east line of Wallingford Avenue and west of the west line of Burke Avenue, said described portion of said streets lying between blocks 3 and 6 of said Burke's First Addition; be and the same hereby are vacated.
Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
