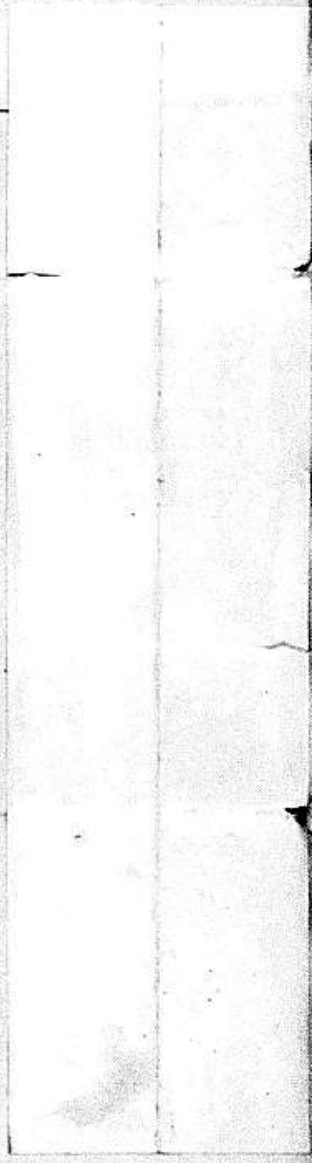

O R D I N A N C E N O . 17276 .

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the laying off, widening, extending, and establishing of Sixth Avenue West, from West McGraw Street to West Ray Street as produced; West McGraw Street from Seventh Avenue West to Third Avenue West; West Smith Street, from Seventh Avenue West to Third Avenue West; and West Ray Street from Seventh Avenue West to Sixth Avenue West as produced, over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Sixth Avenue West, in the City of Seattle be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land lying between West McGraw Street and West Ray Street as produced, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

All of those portions of Lots eight (8), nine (9), ten (10), and eleven (11), in Block two (2); and Lots eight (8), nine (9), ten (10) and eleven (11) in Block three (3) of Queen Anne Third Addition to the City of Seattle; and of those unplatted tracts of land lying between the north margin of West McGraw Street and the south margin of West Ray Street as produced, and between the east and west margins of Sixth Avenue West, as laid off in West Queen Anne Addition to the City of Seattle, produced northerly and southerly, being a street seventy-four (74) feet wide.

And that West Smith Street, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land, lying between Seventh Avenue West and Third Avenue West, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All of those portions of Lot one (1) in Block one (1), Lot one (1) in Block two (2), Lot one (1) in Block three (3), and Lot one (1) in Block four (4), Queen Anne Central Addition to

the City of Seattle; and of ^{the} unplatted tracts of land lying between the center line of Third Avenue West and the center line of Seventh Avenue West, and the north margin of West Smith Street and the north margin produced westerly, as platted in Queen Anne Fourth Addition to the City of Seattle, and a line sixty (60) feet southerly therefrom and parallel therewith.

And that West McGraw Street in the City of Seattle, be and the same is hereby, laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land, lying between Seventh Avenue West and Third Avenue West, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All that portion of the unplatted tracts of land lying between the center line of Sixth Avenue West and the center line of Seventh Avenue West; and between the south margin of West McGraw Street, as platted in Evans & Blewett's Addition to the City of Seattle, and a line sixty-seven and three-tenths (67.3) feet northerly therefrom and parallel therewith.

And that West Ray Street in the City of Seattle be, and the same is hereby, laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts, and parcels of land lying between Seventh Avenue West and Sixth Avenue West as produced, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All those portions of Lots one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), and five (5) in Block one (1), Queen Anne Third Addition to the City of Seattle; and of those unplatted tracts of land lying between the north margin of Ray Street, as laid off in the Star Addition to the City of Seattle, produced easterly, and a line forty (40) feet southerly therefrom and parallel therewith, and lying between the east margin of Seventh Avenue West and the east margin of Sixth Avenue West, as platted in West Queen Anne Addition to the City of Seattle, produced northerly

Section 2. That all lands, rights and privileges and other property lying within the limits of the above bounded and described tracts are hereby condemned and appropriated to the public for the purpose of a public street and highway forever, and the same to be taken and appropriated only after just compensation has been made or paid into court for the owner in the manner provided by law.

Section 3. That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to file in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for King County, in the name of the City of Seattle, a petition complying with the requirements of the laws of the State of Washington, and praying that just compensation to be made for the private property to be taken or damaged for the purpose of laying off Sixth Avenue West, WestSmith Street, West McGraw Street and West Ray Street, in the City of Seattle, as provided in Section one (1) hereof, "be ascertained by a jury, or by the Court, in case a jury be waived."

Section 4. That an assessment shall be made in the manner provided by the laws of the State of Washington for the purpose of raising the amount necessary to pay the compensation and damages which shall be awarded for the property taken as aforesaid, and for the costs of the proceedings, including the cost of making and collecting such assessment, and such assessment shall be made subject to the provisions of said laws upon all property specially benefited.

Any part of the compensation, damages or costs that is not finally assessed against said property benefited shall be paid from the General Fund of the City of Seattle.

For the purpose of said special assessment, a supplementary petition shall be filed in said court, and all other acts and proceedings necessary for the making, completion and collection of said assessment shall be taken and done as provided by the laws of the State of Washington.

Section 5 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.

AN ORDINANCE providing for the laying off, widening, extending, and establishing of Sixth Avenue West, from West McGraw Street to West Ray Street as produced; West McGraw Street from Seventh Avenue West to Third Avenue West; and West Ray Street from Seventh Avenue West to Sixth Avenue West as produced, over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land.
Be it Ordained by the City of Seattle as follows:
Section 1. That Sixth Avenue West, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land lying between West McGraw Street and West Ray Street as produced, more particularly more fully described as follows, to-wit:
All of those portions of Lots eight (8) in Block two (2), and Lots eight (8), nine (9), ten (10) and eleven (11), in Block three (3) of Queen Anne Street Addition to the City of Seattle; and of those unplatted tracts of land lying between the north margin of West McGraw Street and the south margin of West Ray Street as produced, and between the east and west margins of Sixth Avenue West as laid off in West Queen Anne Addition to the City of Seattle, produced northerly and southerly being a street seventy-four (74) feet wide.
And that West Smith Street, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land, lying between Seventh Avenue West and Third Avenue West, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All of those portions of Lot one (1) in Block one (1), Lot one (1) in Block two (2), Lot one (1) in Block three (3), and Lot one (1) in Block four (4), Queen Anne Central Addition to the City of Seattle; and of those unplatted tracts of land lying between the center line of Third Avenue West and the center line of Seventh Avenue West, and the north margin of West Smith Street and the north margin produced westerly as platted in Queen Anne Fourth Addition to the City of Seattle, and a line sixty (60) feet southerly therefrom and parallel therewith.
And that West McGraw Street, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land, lying between Seventh Avenue West and Third Avenue West, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All that portion of the unplatted tracts of land lying between the center line of Sixth Avenue West and the center line of Seventh Avenue West; and between the south margin of West McGraw Street as platted in Evans & Biewatt's Addition to the City of Seattle, and a line sixty-seven and three-tenths (67.3) feet northerly therefrom and parallel therewith.
And that West Ray Street, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land lying between Seventh Avenue West and Sixth Avenue West as produced, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All those portions of Lots one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), and five (5) in Block one (1), Queen Anne Third Addition to the City of Seattle; and of those unplatted tracts of land lying between the north margin of Ray Street, as laid off in the Star Addition to the City of Seattle, produced easterly, and a line forty (40) feet southerly therefrom and parallel therewith, and lying between the east margin of Seventh Avenue West and the east margin of Sixth Avenue West, as platted in West Queen Anne Addition to the City of Seattle, produced northerly.
Section 2. That all lands, rights and privileges and other property lying within the limits of the above bounded and described tracts are hereby condemned and appropriated to the public for the purpose of a public street and highway forever, and the same to be taken and appropriated only after just compensation has been made or paid into court for the owner in the manner provided by law.
Section 3. That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is, hereby authorized and directed to file in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for King County, in the name of the City of Seattle, a petition complying with the requirements of the laws of the State of Washington, and praying that just compensation be made for the private property to be taken or damaged for the purpose of laying off Sixth Avenue West, West Smith Street, West McGraw Street and West Ray Street, in the City of Seattle, as provided in Section one (1) hereof. ORDINANCE NO. 1778

AN ORDINANCE providing for the laying off, widening, extending, and establishing of Sixth Avenue West from West McGraw Street to West Ray Street as produced, West McGraw Street from Seventh Avenue West to Third Avenue West, and West Ray Street from Seventh Avenue West to Third Avenue West, and West Ray Street from Seventh Avenue West to Sixth Avenue West, as produced, over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land.

Be it Ordained by the City of Seattle as follows:

Section 1. That Sixth Avenue West, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land lying between West McGraw Street and West Ray Street, as produced, more particularly as follows, to-wit: All those portions of Lot one (1) in Block nine (9), ten (10) and eleven (11), Block three (3) of Queen Anne Third Addition to the City of Seattle; and of those unplatted tracts of land lying between the north margin of West McGraw Street and the south margin of West Ray Street as produced, and between the east and west margins of Sixth Avenue West, as laid off in West Queen Anne Addition to the City of Seattle, produced northerly and southerly, being a street seventy-four (74) feet wide.

And that West Smith Street, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land lying between Seventh Avenue West and Third Avenue West, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All those portions of Lot one (1) in Block one (1), Lot one (1) in Block two (2), Lot one (1) in Block three (3), and Lot one (1) in Block four (4), Queen Anne Central Addition to the City of Seattle; and of those unplatted tracts of land lying between the center line of Third Avenue West and the center line of Seventh Avenue West, and the north margin of West Smith Street and the north margin produced westerly as platted in Queen Anne Fourth Addition to the City of Seattle, and a line sixty (60) feet southerly therefrom and parallel therewith.

And that West McGraw Street, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land lying between Seventh Avenue West and Third Avenue West, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All that portion of the unplatted tracts of land lying between the center line of Sixth Avenue West and the center line of Seventh Avenue West; and between the south margin of West McGraw Street, as platted in Evans Blawie's Addition to the City of Seattle, and a line sixty-seven and three-tenths (67.3) feet northerly therefrom and parallel therewith.

And that West Ray Street, in the City of Seattle, be, and the same is hereby laid off, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks, tracts and parcels of land lying between Seventh Avenue West and Sixth Avenue West, as produced, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: All those portions of Lots one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4) and five (5) in Block one (1), Queen Anne Third Addition to the City of Seattle; and of those unplatted tracts of land lying between the north margin of Ray Street, as laid off in the Star Addition to the City of Seattle, produced easterly and a line forty (40) feet southerly therefrom and parallel therewith, and lying between the east margin of seventh Avenue West and the east margin of Sixth Avenue West, as platted in West Queen Anne Addition to the City of Seattle, produced northerly.

Section 2. That all lands, rights and privileges and other property lying within the limits of the above bounded and described tracts are hereby conveyed and appropriated to the public for the purpose of a public street and highway forever, and the same to be taken and appropriated only after just compensation has been made or paid into court for the owner in the manner provided by law.

Section 3. That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to file in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for King County, in the name of the City of Seattle, a petition complying with the requirements of the laws of the State of Washington, and praying that just compensation be made for the private property to be taken or damaged for the purpose of laying off Sixth Avenue West, West Smith Street, West McGraw Street and West Ray Street, in the City of Seattle,

as provided in Section one (1) hereof, "to be ascertained by a jury, or, by the Court, in case a jury be waived."

Section 4. That an assessment shall be made in the manner provided by the laws of the State of Washington for the purpose of raising the amount necessary to pay the compensation and damages which shall be awarded for the property taken as aforesaid, and for the costs of making and collecting such assessment, and such assessment shall be made subject to the provisions of said laws upon all property specially benefited.

Any part of the compensation, damages or costs that is not finally assessed against said property benefited shall be paid from the General Fund of the City of Seattle.

For the purpose of said special assessment, a supplementary petition shall be filed in said court, and all other acts and proceedings necessary for the making, completion and collection of said assessment shall be taken and done as provided by the laws of the State of Washington.
