ORDINANCE NO. 18189

AN ORDINANCE vacating a portion of LENORA STREET, in the City of Seattle, on the petition of The Seattle Armory Commission on behalf of the State of Washington, and others.

Whereas, The Seattle Armory Commission on behalf of the State of Washington, and M. R. Maddocks, have petitioned the City Council for the vacation of a portion of Lenora Street, said petitioners being the owners of more than two-thirds of the private property abutting on that portion of the street sought to be vacated; and

Whereas, due notice of the hearing on said petition has been given in the manner provided by law; and

Whereas, said petition was duly granted by the City Council of the City of Seattle on the 30th day of March, 1908;

Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That that portion of Lenora Street in A. A. Denny's Addition to the town (now city) of Seattle, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northerly corner of block thirty-five (35) of said addition; thence northwesterly along the westerly margin of Western Avenue a distance of twenty-two (22) feet; thence southwesterly along a line which is distant twenty-two (22) feet from and parallel with the southerly line of Lenora Street, a distance of one hundred and fifty-six (156) feet; thence southeasterly along a line which is distant one hundred and fifty-six (156) feet from and parallel with the westerly line of Western Avenue, a distance of twenty-two (22) feet to the southerly line of Lenora Street; thence northeasterly along said southerly line of Lenora Street, a distance of one hundred and fifty-six (156) feet to the point of beginning,

be and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 7 This ordinance shall take effect thirty  
(30) days after its passage and approval, if approved by the  
Mayor; otherwise it shall become a law and take effect as provided  
by the city charter.

Whereas, The Seattle Armory Commission on behalf of the State of Washington, and M. B. Maddocks, have petitioned the City Council for the vacation of a portion of Lenora Street, said petitioners being the owners of more than two-thirds of the private property abutting on that portion of the street sought to be vacated; and  
Whereas, Due notice of the hearing on said petition has been given in the manner provided by law; and  
Whereas, Said petition was duly granted by the City Council of the City of Seattle on the 30th day of March, 1908; now, therefore, Be it ordained by the City of Seattle, as follows:

Section 1. That that portion of Lenora Street, in A. A. Denny's Addition to the town (now city) of Seattle, more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the northerly corner of block thirty-five (35) of said addition; thence northwesterly along the westerly margin of Western Avenue a distance of twenty-two (22) feet; thence southwesterly along a line which is distant twenty-two (22) feet from and parallel with the southerly line of Lenora Street, a distance of one hundred and fifty-six (156) feet; thence southeasterly along a line which is distant one hundred and fifty-six (156) feet from and parallel with the westerly line of Western Avenue, a distance of twenty-two (22) feet to the southerly line of Lenora Street; thence northeasterly along said southerly line of Lenora Street a distance of one hundred and fifty-six (156) feet to the point of beginning, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall become a law and take effect as provided by the city charter.
