ORDINANCE NO. 18467.

AN OR MANCE providing for the condemnation and appropriation of certain streets in the City of Seattle for Parkway and Boulevard purposes.

WHEREAS, the Board of Park Commissioners of the City of Seattle has in writing designated to the City Council of the City of Seattle the streets hereinafter described as streets to be used for parkway and boulevard purposes, and has requested the City Council to pass an ordinance authorizing the condemnation of said streets for parkway and boulevard purposes,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the streets situated in the City of Seattle, King County, Washington, hereinafter described, be condemned, taken and appropriated by the City of Seattle for the purpose of public parkway and boulevard, to-wit:

Interlake Avenue, from North Fiftieth Street to North Fifty-fifth Street; East Green Lake Boulevard, from North Fifty-fifth Street to Ashworth Avenue; that unnamed portion of Green Lake Boulevard, extending southwesterly from North Sho e Addition to Hillman's Lake Front Addition, Division No. 1; West Green Lake Boulevard, in Hillman's Lake Front Addition, Division No. 1, and in Graven's Addition to the City of Seattle; save and except a strip of land sixty (60) feet wide, extending throughout the above described avenues and boulevards, said strip being adjoining and parallel to the upland margin of said avenues and boulevards, as described above; also, any and all streets platted upon the banks and shores of said Green Lake between the center line of said Boulevard and the deep waters of said Lake.

Section 2. That all the lands, rights and privileges and other property within the limits of the above bounded and described tracts, lots or parcels of land are hereby condemned and appropriated to the public use for the purpose of parkway and boulevard, and the same to be taken and appropriated only after just compensation has been made or paid into court for the owners in manner provided by law.

Section 3. That the Corporation Counsel is hereby authorized and instructed to take the necessary steps for such condemnation and to prosecute actions and proceedings to condemn and appropriate the land and property and streets pecessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 4. That the compensation therefor shall be made from the City Park Fund of the City of Seattle.

Section 5 This ordinance shall take effect thirty
(30) days after its passage and approval, if approved by the
Mayor; otherwise it shall become a law and take effect as provided

Be it ordained by the City of Seattle as follows:

Section 1. That the streets situated in the City of Seattle, King County, Washington, hereinafter described, be condemned, taken and appropriated by the City of Seattle for the purpose of public parkway and boulevard, from North Firtieth Street to North Fifty-fifth Street; East Green Lake Boulevard, from North Fifty-fifth Street to Addition, Division No. 1; West Green Lake Boulevard, from North Fifty-fifth Street to Addition, Division No. 1; West Green Lake Boulevard, from North Fifty-fifth Street to Addition, Division No. 1; West Green Lake Boulevard, from North Shore Addition, Division No. 1, and in Craven's Addition, Division No. 1, and in Craven's Addition, Division No. 1, and in Craven's Addition to the City of Seattle; save and except a strip of land sixty (60) feet wide, extending throughout the above described avenues and boulevards, as described above, also any and all streets platted upon the banks and shores of said Boulevard and the deep waters of said sake.

Section 3. That the Corporation Counsel is hereby authorized and instructed to take the necessary steps for such condemnation and to prosecute actions and proceedings to condemn and appropriated the inne and property regularly distributed to its subscribers on sallyday.
