ORDINANCE NO 19534

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the laying off, opening, widening, extending and establishing of Carroll Street, from Alki Avenue to deep water in Puget Sound, in the City of Seattle; and providing for the condemnation, appropriation, taking and damaging of land and other property necessary therefor; and providing that the payment for such improvement be made by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, Public necessity and convenience demand that Carroll Street, from Alki Avenue to deep water in Puget Sound, in the City of Seattle, be laid off, opened, widened, extended and established as a public street and highway; and

WHEREAS, Said improvement will be of special benefit to certain lands, premises and other property; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Carroll Street, from Alki Avenue to deep water in Puget Sound, in the City of Seattle, be and the same is hereby, laid off, opened, widened, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks and tracts of land in said city, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

That portion of Block One (1), Chilberg's Addition to the Town of West Seattle (now City of Seattle), lying between the center line of Carroll Street, as platted in said Addition, and a line which is parallel to and distant seventy-five (75) feet north from said center line.

That portion of Block Two (2), Chilberg's Addition to the Town of West Seattle (now City of Seattle), lying between the center line of Carroll Street, as platted in said Addition, and a line which is parallel to and distant seventy-five (75) feet south from said center line.

That portion of the Tide Lands of Puget Sound, contained between a line which is parallel to and distant seventy-five (75) feet north from the center line, produced west, of Carroll Street, as platted in Chilberg's Addition to the Town of West Seattle (now City of Seattle) and a line which is parallel to and distant seventy-five (75) feet south from said center line so produced.

Section 2. That all lands, rights, privileges and other property lying within the limits of the lots, blocks and tracts of land described in this ordinance be, and the same are hereby condemned; taken, damaged and appropriated to the public use for the purpose of a public street and highway forever.

Section 3. That the improvement provided for in this ordinance be paid for by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law. Any part of the costs of said improvement that is not finally assessed against the property specially benefited, shall be paid from the General Fund of the City of Seattle.

Section 4. That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to begin and prosecute the actions and proceedings, in the manner provided by law, to condemn, take, damage and appropriate the lands and other property necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance, and also to take the steps necessary to make such special assessment.

Section 1. That Carroll Street, from Alki Avenue to deep Water in Puget Sound, in the City of Seattle, be and the same is hereby, laid off, opened, widened, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks and tracts of land in said City, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

The portion of Block One (1) Chilberg's Addition to the Town of West Seattle (now City of Seattle), lying between the center line of Carroll Street, as platted in said Addition, and a line which is parallel to and distant seventy-five (75) feet north from said center line.

That portion of Block Two (2) Chilberg's Addition to the Town of West Seattle (now City of Seattle), lying

between the center line of Carroll Street, as platted in Chilberg's Addition to the Town of West Seattle (now City of Seattle), and a line which is parallel to and distant seventy-five (75) feet south from said center line.

That portion of the Tide Lands of Puget Sound, contained between a line which is parallel to and distant seventy-five (75) feet north from the center line, produced west of Carroll Street, as platted in Chilberg's Addition to the Town of West Seattle (now City of Seattle), and a line which is parallel to and distant seventy-five (75) feet south from said center line.

Section 2. That all lands, rights, privileges and other property lying within the limits of the lots, blocks and tracts of land described in this ordinance be, and the same are hereby condemned, taken, damaged and appropriated to the public use for the purpose of a public street and highway forever.
