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ORDINANCE No. 20451

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the laying off, altering, widening, and establishing of East Fir Street, from Twelfth Avenue to Fifteenth Avenue, in the City of Seattle; and providing for the condemnation, appropriation, taking and damaging of land and other property necessary therefor; and providing that the payment for such improvement be made by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, Public necessity and convenience demand that East Fir Street, from Twelfth Avenue to Fifteenth Avenue, in the City of Seattle, be laid off, altered, widened, and established as a public street and highway; and

WHEREAS, Said improvement will be of special benefit to certain lands, premises and other property; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That East Fir Street, from Twelfth Avenue to Fifteenth Avenue, in the City of Seattle, be and the same is hereby laid off, altered, widened and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks and tracts of land in said city, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Those portions of the lots, blocks and tracts of land lying between Fifteenth Avenue and Fourteenth Avenue, as they now exist, and between two straight lines fifty-six (56) feet apart, said lines being parallel to and equidistant from the following described line: Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Fifteenth Avenue and the center line of East Fir Street, from the east, as they now exist; thence west to the intersection of the center line of Twelfth Avenue with the center line of East Fir Street, from the west, as they now exist.



Those portions of the lots, blocks and tracts of land lying between Fourteenth Avenue and Thirteenth Avenue, as they now exist, and between two straight lines fifty-six (56) feet apart, said lines being parallel to and equidistant from the following described line: Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Fifteenth Avenue and the center line of East Fir Street, from the east, as they now exist; thence west to the intersection of the center line of Twelfth Avenue with the center line of East Fir Street, from the west, as they now exist.

Those portions of the lots, blocks and tracts of land lying between Thirteenth Avenue and Twelfth Avenue, as they now exist, and between two straight lines fifty-six (56) feet apart, said lines being parallel to and equidistant from the following described line: Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Fifteenth Avenue and the center line of East Fir Street, from the east, as they now exist; thence west to the intersection of the center line of Twelfth Avenue with the center line of East Fir Street, from the west, as they now exist.

SECTION 2. That all lands, rights, privileges and other property lying within the limits of the lots, blocks and tracts of land described in this ordinance be, and the same are hereby condemned, taken, damaged and appropriated to the public use for the purpose of a public street and highway forever.

SECTION 3. That the improvement provided for in this ordinance be paid for by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law. Any part of the costs of said improvement that is not finally assessed against the property specially benefited, shall be paid from the General Fund of the City of Seattle.



SECTION 4. That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to begin and prosecute the actions and proceedings, in the manner provided by law, to condemn, take, damage and appropriate the lands and other property necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance; and also to take the steps necessary to make such special assessment.



(To be used for all Ordinances except emergency.)

Section 5 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

Be it ordained by the City of Seattle, as follows:

Section 1. That East Fir Street, from Twelfth Avenue to Fifteenth Avenue, in the City of Seattle, be and the same is hereby laid off, altered, widened and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks and tracts of land in said city, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Those portions of the lots, blocks and tracts of land lying between Twelfth Avenue and Fourteenth Avenue, as they now exist, and between two straight lines fifty-six (56) feet apart, said lines being parallel to and equidistant from the following described line: Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Fifteenth Avenue and the center line of East Fir Street; thence west to the intersection of the center line of Twelfth Avenue with the center line of East Fir Street; from the west, as they now exist.

Those portions of the lots, blocks and tracts of land lying between Fourteenth Avenue and Twelfth Avenue, as they now exist, and between two straight lines fifty-six (56) feet apart, said lines being parallel to and equidistant from the following described line: Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Fifteenth Avenue and the center line of East Fir Street; thence west to the intersection of the center line of Twelfth Avenue with the center line of East Fir Street; from the west, as they now exist.

Section 2. That all lands, rights, privileges and other property lying within the limits of the lots, blocks and tracts of land described in this ordinance, be, and the same are hereby condemned, taken, damaged and appropriated to the public use for the purpose of a public street and highway forever.

Section 3. That the improvement provided for in this ordinance be paid for by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law. Any part of the cost of said improvement that is not finally assessed against the property specially benefited, shall be paid from the General Fund of the City of Seattle.

Section 4. That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to execute and procure the adoption and passage of this ordinance, and to arrange and superintend the taking and other property necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance; and also to take the steps necessary to make such special assessment.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
