ORDINANCE NO. 20587

AN ORDINANCE appropriating the sum of two thousand one hundred (2100) dollars to be paid The Stuff Printing Concern in payment for seven thousand (7000) official invitations to be issued by The City of Seattle to the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the sum of two thousand one hundred (2100) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated from the general fund to be paid The Stuff Printing Concern in payment for the printing and engraving of seven thousand (7000) official invitations to the Alaska-Yu kon-Pacific Exposition to be issued by The City of Seattle to the officials of other municipalities, and that the Mayor and City Comptroller be and they are hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant on the general fund in the sum of two thousand one hundred (2100) dollars in favor of The Stuff Printing Concern in payment therefor.

Section 2. That said invitations so authorized shall be engraved on Japanese vellum paper of quality and design satisfactory to and to be approved by the Mayor and City Council of The City of Seattle, and before delivery to the City of Seattle shall be enclosed in an envelope ready for mailing at the expense of the said Stuff Printing Concern .

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
