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ORDINANCE NO. 20830

AN ORDINANCE granting permission to Crawford & Conover to lay an eight (8) inch water main in a portion of East Fifty-fifth Street in the City of Seattle at their own cost and expense.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Crawford & Conover be and they are hereby granted permission to lay an eight (8) inch water main in East Fifty-fifth Street from the intersection of Twenty-ninth Avenue Northeast and East Fifty-fifth Street to a connection with the water system of said Crawford & Conover in Exposition Heights, Division No. 2.

Section 2. That no part of the cost and expense of laying said main shall be borne by the City of Seattle but the whole thereof shall be paid by the said Crawford & Conover. Said main shall be laid in accordance with plans to be approved by the Board of Public Works of the City of Seattle and under the general supervision and direction of the engineering department of the city, and all cost of engineering and inspection shall be borne by the said Crawford & Conover. The said Crawford & Conover shall furnish the City with a proper surety bond to save and protect the City of Seattle from any loss or damage that may accrue by the prosecution of said work.

NOW, THEREFORE, by reason of the foregoing facts, an emergency is hereby declared to exist in which it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety that this ordinance shall become effective without delay.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
