ORDINANCE NO. 21222

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the laying off, opening, widening, extending and establishing of West Seventy-fifth Street, from Eighth Avenue Northwest to Fifteenth Avenue Northwest, in the City of Seattle; and providing for the condemnation, appropriation, taking and damaging of land and other property necessary therefor; and providing that the payment for such improvement be made by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, Public necessity and convenience demand that West Seventy-fifth Street, from Eighth Avenue Northwest to Fifteenth Avenue Northwest, in the City of Seattle, be laid off, opened, widened, extended and established as a public street and highway; and

WHEREAS, Said improvement will be of special benefit to certain lands, premises and other property; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That West Seventy-fifth Street, from Eighth Avenue Northwest to Fifteenth Avenue Northwest, in the City of Seattle, be and the same is hereby laid off, opened, widened, extended and established as a public street and highway over and across certain lots, blocks and tracts of land in said city, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

~~That portion of the Northwest Quarter (N.W.¼) of Section One (1), Township Twenty-five (25) North, Range Three (3) East, W. M., lying north of the south line of said Northwest Quarter (N.W.¼); south of a line which is parallel to and distant thirty (30) feet north of said south line; west of the west line of Salmon Bay Second Addition to the City of Seattle; and east of the east line of Whitman Addition to the City of Seattle.~~

That portion of Blocks One to Ten (1-10), inclusive, Ballard Park Addition to the City of Seattle, lying north of a line which is parallel to and distant thirty (30) feet south from the north line of said blocks.

SECTION 2. That all lands, rights, privileges and other property lying within the limits of the lots, blocks and tracts of land described in this ordinance be, and the same are hereby condemned, taken, damaged and appropriated to the public use for the purpose of a public street and highway, forever.

SECTION 3. That the improvement provided for in this ordinance be paid for by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law. Any part of the costs of said improvement that is not finally assessed against the property specially benefited, shall be paid from the General Fund of the City of Seattle.

SECTION 4. That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to begin and prosecute the actions and proceedings, in the manner provided by law, to condemn, take, damage and appropriate the lands and other property necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance; and also to take the steps necessary to make such special assessment.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
