ORDINANCE NO. 21767

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the laying off, altering and establishing of Twenty-second Avenue Southwest and Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, each from the north line of Star Addition to the City of Seattle to West Spokane Street, all in the City of Seattle; and providing for the condemnation, appropriation, taking and damaging of land and other property necessary therefor; and providing that the payment for such improvement be made by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, Public necessity and convenience demand that the above named streets, be laid off, altered and established as public streets and highways; and

WHEREAS, Said improvement will be of special benefit to certain lands, premises and other property; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Twenty-second Avenue Southwest and Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, each from the north line of Star Addition to the City of Seattle to West Spokane Street, all in the City of Seattle, be and the same are hereby laid off, altered and established as public streets and highways over and across certain lots, blocks and tracts of land in said city, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

That tract of unplatted land lying north of the north line of Star Addition to the City of Seattle; southerly of the southeasterly margin of West Spokane Street, as platted in Seattle Tide Lands; and between the east and west margins, produced north, of Twenty-second Avenue Southwest, as platted in said Star Addition.

That tract of unplatted land lying north of the north line of Star Addition to the City of Seattle; southerly of the southeasterly line of block four hundred twenty-five (425), Seattle Tide Lands; and between the east and west margins, pro-

duced north, of Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, as platted in said Star Addition.

That portion of lot ten (10), block four hundred twenty-five (425), Seattle Tide Lands, lying east of the west margin, produced north, of Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, as platted in Star Addition to the City of Seattle.

That portion of lot eleven (11), block four hundred twenty-five (425), Seattle Tide Lands, lying east of the west margin, produced north, of Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, as platted in Star Addition to the City of Seattle.

SECTION 2. That all lands, rights, privileges and other property lying within the limits of the lots, blocks and tracts of land described in this ordinance be, and the same are hereby condemned, taken, damaged and appropriated to the public use for the purpose of public streets and highways forever.

SECTION 3. That the improvement provided for in this ordinance be paid for by special assessment upon property specially benefited, in the manner provided by law. Any part of the costs of said improvement that is not finally assessed against the property specially benefited, shall be paid from the General Fund of the City of Seattle.

SECTION 4. That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to begin and prosecute the actions and proceedings, in the manner provided by law, to condemn, take, damage and appropriate the lands and other property necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance; and also to take the steps necessary to make such special assessment.

(To be used for all Ordinances except emergency.)

Section 5 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

Whereas, said improvement will be of special benefit to certain lands, premises and other property, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the City of Seattle, as follows:

Section 1. That Twenty-second Avenue Southwest and Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, each from the north line of Star Addition to the City of Seattle to West Spokane Street, all in the City of Seattle, be and he same are hereby laid off, altered and established as public streets and highways over and across certain lots, blocks and tracts of land in said city, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

That tract of unplatted land lying north of the north line of Star Addition to the City of Seattle, southerly of the southeasterly margin of West Spokane Street, as platted in Seattle. This land is and between the east and west margins produced north of Twenty-second Avenue Southwest, as platted in said Star Addition.

That tract of unplatted land lying north of the north line of Star Addition to the City of Seattle, southerly of the southeasterly line of block four hundred twenty-five (425), Seattle. This land is and between the east and west margins produced north of Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, as platted in said Star Addition.

That portion of lot ten (10), block four hundred twenty-five (425), Seattle. This land, lying east of the west margin produced north of Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, as platted in Star Addition to the City of Seattle.

That portion of lot eleven (11), block four hundred twenty-five (425), Seattle. This land, lying east of the west margin produced north of Twenty-third Avenue Southwest, as platted in Star Addition to the City of Seattle.

Section 2. That all lands, rights, interests and other property, lying within the limits of the lots, blocks and tracts of land described in this ordinance be, and the same are hereby, condemned, taken, damaged and appropriated to the public use for the purpose of public streets and highways forever.

Section 3. That the improvement provided for in this ordinance be paid for by special assessment upon property especially benefited, in the manner provided by law. Any part of the costs of said improvement that is not specially assessed against the property especially benefited, shall be paid from the General Fund of the City of Seattle.

Section 4. That the Corporation Commissioners and be so hereby, authorized and directed to begin and prosecute the action and proceedings in the manner provided by law to condemn, take, damage and appropriate the lands and other property necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance, and also to take the steps necessary to make such special assessment.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
