AN ORDINANCE accepting a deed from Ferdinand Schmitz and Emma Schmitz, his wife, to the City of Seattle, dated the 29th day of January, 1908, to

Certain portions of the Northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Fifteen (15) Township Twenty-four (24) North, of Range Three (3) East of the Willamette Meridian)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS TO WIT:

SECTION 1: That the deed dated the 29th day of January, 1908, to the City of Seattle, executed by Ferdinand Schmitz and Emma Schmitz to the following described property to wit:

The whole of the Northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section fifteen (15), Township Twenty-four (24) North, of Range Three (3) East of the Willamette Meridian, except the easterly ten acres thereof, the said property to be at all times retained and used for park and parkway purposes.

IS HEREBY ACCEPTED.

Section 2 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
