ORDINANCE NO 23613

AN ORDINANCE vacating a portion of Pine Street on the petition of the  
Seattle Seamen's Friend Society.

Whereas, there has been presented to the City Council the petition  
(File No. 38843) of the Seattle Seamen's Friend Society asking for the  
vacation of a portion of Pine Street in the City of Seattle; and.

Whereas, due notice of the time and place of hearing on said petition  
has been given in the manner provided by law, at which hearing said  
petition was duly granted;

Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the following described portion of Pine Street, in  
the City of Seattle, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the south line of Pine Street and  
the west line of Western Avenue, as now widened; running thence westerly  
along the south line of Pine Street a distance of 117.76 feet to the  
alley between Western Avenue and Elliott Avenue; thence northerly along  
the east line of said alley produced a distance of 36 feet; thence  
easterly and parallel with the south line of Pine Street a distance of  
106.72 feet to the west line of Western Avenue, and thence southerly  
along the westerly line of Western Avenue to the point of beginning,

be and the same is hereby vacated.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

I hereby certify that the foregoing Council Bill No. 11171, after passage by the City Council, was duly presented to the Mayor, and having been by him disapproved and returned by him to the City Council with his objections thereto in writing, the said objections of the Mayor thereto were duly entered at large on the journal of the Council and published in the City Official Newspaper, and thereafter the City Council did on March 2, 1910, the same being not less than five (5) days after such publication, and within thirty (30) days after said bill had been so returned, duly reconsider and vote upon said Council Bill, and that upon such reconsideration said Council Bill was, on said last mentioned date, again duly passed by said Council by the affirmative vote of more than two-thirds of all the members elected to said City Council, and I hereby certify said facts upon said Council Bill.
