ORDINANCE NO. 2043

AN ORDINANCE establishing an official standard meridian line for the City of Seattle.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there be and is hereby established an official standard meridian line for the City of Seattle, described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center of the upper end of a copper wire imbedded in a cut stone monument in the center line of Yesler Avenue at a point fourteen and 33/100 (14.33) feet West of the monument marking the intersection of the center lines of Yesler Avenue and Broadway (which cut stone monument is marked "City S. M. 1") and running thence through to a point in the center of the upper end of a copper wire imbedded in another cut stone monument at the intersection of the center lines of Broadway and Madison Streets, (which last named monument is marked "City S. M. 2"); and thence running to a point in the center of the upper end of a copper wire imbedded in a cut stone monument in the center line of Depot Street and distant thirty and 17/100 (30.17) feet East of the center line of Broadway (which last named monument is marked "City S. M. 3"). Compared with said meridian line, the center line of Yesler Avenue as now monumented from ~~Commercial Street~~ ^{Broadway} bears South eighty nine degrees, fifty nine minutes and forty five second West; and the center line of Madison Street as now monumented from Front Street to Broadway bears North fifty eight degrees, seven minutes and thirty seconds East.

Sec. 2. The meridian line hereby established shall be known as the City standard Meridian and shall be deemed and is hereby declared the true North and South line. All official surveys, lines, maps, plans and documents hereafter made shall be referred for a definite and accurate designation of their courses to the City Standard Meridian hereby established.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
